#### OLD / ROUTINE BUSINESS - REVISITED ISSUES / PROJECTS

#### ✓ PERSONNEL POLICIES & PROCEDURES (Status)

We are reviewing a draft and have a final meeting set with Mr. Nottley for later this month.

#### ✓ DISASTER, EMERGENCY RESPONSE POLICY COMMITTEE (Status)

We are back meeting and have a draft for review. We should be back before the Council for discussion on this in the near future.

#### ✓ VETERANS MEMORIAL (Status)

Nothing New.

✓ NON-RESIDENT SERVICES STUDY, RAUBINGER BRIDGE (Status)

Pending.

#### ✓ OVERHEAD UTILITY REORGANIZATION PROJECT (Status)

We are trying to get a contractor's quote for the second round of the technical review of the poles. REI has expressed an interest in the project and is working on a price. I qualify this with we are in the bid process for engineering services. This needs to be settled first. I will keep the Council posted.

#### ✓ ENGINEERING SERVICES, QUALIFICATION BASED SELECTION (Status)

Bids for Engineering Services have been tabulated, reviewed and logged (due to volume, I did not include any of the bids. If anyone desires to see them, give me a call). Thirteen companies submitted. They are as follows:

Hubble, Roth & Clark, Howell: Lapham & Associates, Clare: Gould Engineering, Flint: Kraft Engineering, Flint: Wilcox Engineering, Saginaw: Rowe Engineering, Flint: Trans Environmental Engineering, Flint: CHMP, Grand Blanc: Flint Surveying & Engineering, Swartz Creek: Wade-Trim, Flint: Spicer Group, Saginaw: Williams & Works, Grand Rapids: Workhorse Civil Design, Howell. Scoring was done by Mr. Zettel, Mr. Svrcek and myself (copies of the scoring template are included with tonight's packet). All three of the evaluators agree on the top three firms, being Wilcox, Wade-Trim and Rowe. We will now ask all three of these companies to submit a pricing list and be back to the Council with a recommendation for appointment.

### ✓ MAJOR STREET FUND, TRAFFIC IMPROVEMENTS (See Individual Category)

☐ BRISTOL ROAD T.I.P. PROJECT, BRISTOL EXTENSION (Status)

The contractor is looking for an additional \$50k on this project. They claim additional engineering, change orders, and additional work, some of which is related to the Verizon poles. MDOT has a grievance procedure in which the contractor has initiated. Two steps have been completed with a recommendation for an additional

\$15k. The ball is in the contractor's court as to whether they desire to move to the next process. We will see where it heads.

■ SEYMOUR RE-SURFACING PROJECT (Status)

Complete, with the exception of the installation of signage, which should be soon.

■ ELMS ROAD RE-SURFACING PROJECT (Status)

This project is underway, construction beginning on Monday June 16<sup>th</sup>. Our match for this project is \$294,477. The County has budgeted \$21,000 for their half of the 1,300' border section and have given us a verbal approval for participation. We will try to catch up the paperwork over the next couple of weeks. I will keep the Council

■ MORRISH ROAD RE-CONSTRUCTION PROJECT / MEIJER'S (Status)

Meijer's has informed us that they have placed this project on their early 2009 construction schedule. Although not yet certain, they advise they may be asking for a revised site plan later this summer that will downsize the store a bit, to around 160,000 sf. They are reviewing the development agreement and will be back shortly with a decision on how they wish to handle the road construction (private or via the TIP).

☐ GM-SPO ISLAND CUTS (Status)

informed on the progress.

This project remains in the 2009 TIP. We are still evaluation the cost vs. benefit ratio.

☐ MILLER ROAD REPAIRS (Status)

The repair work has been completed. We will be looking at a 10-year repair fix this summer for all of Miller Road.

#### ✓ LOCAL STREET FUND, TRAFFIC IMPROVEMENTS

☐ 2008 REPAIR ROSTER (Discussion)

Bids are back for the following streets: Chesterfield from Seymour to Winston, Jennie Lane, Worchester from Winston to Daval (a portion of this is a Major Street, eligible for 202 funding) and Daval from Oakview to Winshall. The low bidder is Lois Kay at \$398,154. After we pay our \$75,000 share of the Raubinger Road Bridge, we will have about \$150,000 to spend. We can choose one of these streets to re-surface and then wait another 4 years or so to do the next. As an alternative plan, we can ask the residents that live on these streets if they desire to pay some of the costs via This may allow us to do all of these. We have sent out a an assessment. questionnaire (copy included with tonight's packet) to find out their feelings on the matter. As we all know, the economic air is lousy, particularly with plummeting Re-surfacing of the streets will help to hold values in the housing values. neighborhood. If residents oppose an assessment, then I recommend we proceed with the pavement of a single street. Adam has done some work on the matter and will be present at tonight's meeting to help with the discussion.

#### ✓ FIRE DEPARTMENT EVALUATION, 2008 CONTRACT RENEWAL (Status)

I have met several times with Mr. Shumaker regarding the contract. We have identified a handful of areas that need addressing. Mr. Figura has provided a draft and we are reviewing it. I will be back for some additional conversation in the future.

#### ✓ SEWER REHABILITATION PROJECT, I&I, PENALTIES (Status)

At a past meeting, we awarded the bid to Liqui-Force based on unit prices. We will be back before the Council shortly with a contract for Phase II of the program.

#### **✓ WWS INTERGOVERNMENTAL JURISDICTION ORDINANCE** (Status)

The County has turned up the pressure to adopt both the ordinance and the agreement that transfer enforcement (and probably anything else they deem fit) over to them. We are working with Mr. Figura evaluating our options.

## ✓ HERITAGE PARK & NON-MOTORIZED TRAIL SYSTEM (Status) Pending.

#### ✓ SR. CENTER, LEVY, BUILDING & FUTURE FUNDING PLAN (Status) Pending.

#### ✓ SPRINGBROOK, HERITAGE STREET-LIGHTING (Status)

We need to talk on a number of issues similar to this. I am working on a recommendation and a policy in handling our condominium associations in an effort to treat them all the same. I will be back at a near future meeting for discussion and the adoption of a policy.

#### ✓ LABOR CONTRACTS (Status)

Mr. Kehoe still needs a basic employment agreement and the Supervisor's contract has a wage re-opener. I will look to meet with them very shortly.

On my contract, it probably needs visiting for update purposes. I would like to take a pass on any rate increases for another year or two and until we are on better financial ground. I am not sure how the Council desires to handle an evaluation. As you recall, a couple of years ago I created a list of accomplishments and shortfalls as I saw them. I could bring the list up to date and then bring it back to the Council for discussion and review. Unless the Council has strong input one way or the other, I will do this and set it for a discussion item, hopefully soon. We can then go from here.

#### ✓ RETIREE HEALTH CARE (Status)

Nearly everyone whom we have on retirement is now Medicaid-Medicare eligible. It may not be necessary to do individual agreements. This topic may be better covered in the City's personnel policy manual. We will be discussing this within the next couple of meetings.

#### ✓ MARATHON STATION BLIGHT & NON-CONFORMING USE (Status)

The pylon sign and the canopy have been removed by the owner. The building remains. We are awaiting the executed order from the judge. When we are in possession of this, we will be back for some additional conversation on the method of exercising the order.

#### ✓ GENERAL LEDGER & ACCOUNTING SOFTWARE (Status)

Software installation is complete. We are still working on the customization of some of the modules.

#### ✓ COUNTY E.M.S. ORDINANCE, AMBULANCE SERVICE (Status)

A letter from the 911 Consortiums' Attorney is included with tonight's packet. We will continue to watch developments.

#### ✓ FEES, RATES & SERVICE CHARGES (Status)

We are still reviewing the best method for the installation of the new rate structure. As an afterthought, it appears that we will be getting another rate increase from Detroit...

about 16%. We have not received official notice, but the Detroit and Local Newspapers are reporting this. Although we do need to visit water and sewer, as we have discussed, I would like to wait a bit, into the late summer or fall before we make a decision on this, as well as other fees.

✓ SALE OF CITY PROPERTY 5129 MORRISH ROAD (Status) Pending environmental work.

#### **NEW BUSINESS / PROJECTED ISSUES & PROJECTS**

✓ FINAL SITE PLAN APPROVAL, SLU PERMIT, ASSISTED LIVING HOME (Resolution)
The Planning Commission (and Staff) recommends approval of a final site plan and special land use permit for the construction of an assisted living home, on a portion of Parcel #58-36-400-003, address 7276 Miller Road (west of Kroger's). Staff also recommends a couple of minor waivers within the PUD. Included with tonight's packet (within the Planning Commission's packet), are review documents. The developer and representatives will be present tonight to answer any questions. Additionally, Mr. Zettel will address the project on behalf of the Staff and Planning Commission.

#### ✓ THREE-YEAR C.D.B.G. DISTRIBUTION AMENDMENT (Resolution)

As you may recall, we set a project priority list for CDBG allotments at the Council Meeting of October 30, 2006. A needs hearing was held on October 23, 2006 (minutes included). The staff has come up with some new ideas for Council consideration. Adam will be addressing the Council on the following thoughts:

- 1) Demolitions on dye road or Marathon
- 2) Elms Road enhancements
- 3) Downtown streetscape
- 4) Elms park improvements
- 5) Improvements to city owned land on east side of Raubinger
- 6) New sidewalk construction
- 7) Improvements to civic area

Areas south of Miller and west of Raubinger do not qualify for funding (except Miller and Raubinger ROWs). We have scheduled a Public Needs Hearing, as required by the act, for tonight's meeting. I received a call from Joann Holmquist who requests the Council consider a water park recreational facility (you may recall she submitted some photographs several years ago for consideration). Adam will be addressing the Council on this matter at tonight's meeting.

#### ✓ PARK FEE WAIVER REQUEST, SHERIFF'S UNION (Resolution)

The Genesee County Deputy Sheriff's Association has requested the waiver of fees associated with the use of Elms Road Park on Saturday, August 16, 2008, for a picnic. Attached are an application and a letter from the organization. So the Council is aware, the application for the organization was submitted by my daughter in law, a deputy with the county. A letterhead request from the union's secretary accompanies the request.

#### ✓ APPROPRIATION & BID AWARD, SIDEWALK REPAIR (Resolution)

We are updating the City's sidewalk repair roster and have gone to bid for contractors interested in the work. We had three responses, Curbco, Badgley Construction and

Donaldson & Sons. The low bidder was Badgley Construction. Included with tonight's agenda is a resolution to accept the low bid and proceed with the work. As the Council may know, we send letters to the homeowners and give them the opportunity to repair the walk themselves. Most opt to have our contractor do the work as they cannot do it as cheap themselves. We then invoice the resident for the work. If they do not pay the invoice, we place it on the assessment roll.

#### **✓ PLANNING ENABLING ACT, ZONING UPDATE CLASS (Information)**

Mr. Figura will be teaching an update class on the recent and radical changes in the Planning Enabling Act and associated Zoning Law Changes. The class will be here in the Council Chambers on Wednesday July 23, 2008 from 6:30 PM to 8:30 PM. We would like to get as much of the Council, Planning Commission, Staff and Z.B.A to attend, as possible. Please let me know if you can make it and we will make the reservations for you. Additionally, we will be inviting the other governments that Mr. Figura represents as well as some of the surrounding ones here that he is not counsel to.

### Council Questions, Inquiries, Requests and Comments

- Park & Ride Improvements, Miller & I-69. MDOT has asked that if they pay for the installation of lighting, would we be willing to pay the energy costs. I have a handful of issues with this Park & Ride, including lawn mowing, lighting, general appearance, snow removal, salt and garbage collection (needed on a daily basis). We met with MDOT and they advise they have no funds to pay for anything. Seems utterly irresponsible that MDOT would construct these items all over the state without a single aforethought to the maintenance. We offered to do a cost sharing to plow, salt, light, mow, collect garbage, etc. They would like us to do all these things and pay for them. They were advised that it is their lot, their problem... sad. If the Council feels different, please let me know.

- Signs, Blackmore & Rowe (in right of way?). It is. Upon checking, a small piece of our curb may be on private property also. We have had some activity on the sale and development of this property. We will take care of all these problems when the property develops.

He stated that there are pieces of concrete that are the size of softballs all over the road that are being thrown by vehicle tires into other vehicles, causing damage. 

Adam Zettel stated that the final site plan is mostly in line with the Conceptual Plan that was approved at the last meeting. He noted areas of the plan that required further additions or revision by the Planning Commission or from a staff perspective before construction could begin. Such areas included the provision of lighting, some landscaping additions, road widths, and changes to the sidewalk plan. He also stated that the traffic and physical engineers all approved of the plan as it is set forth. He also said that the Fire Chief's recommendations have been followed as much as possible. Summarily, Mr. Zettel recommended approval of the project with the above mentioned changes.

Mr. Danny Nemer stated that the project could accommodate those changes.

Mr. Abrams asked about the location and numbering of hydrants. He wanted to know if they were in line with the Fire Department's needs. Mr. Nemer confirmed that they were.

Mr. Abrams also sought clarification on the western pedestrian connection. Mr. Zettel explained that he was seeking a sidewalk continuation to the western property line.

The location of drives that currently exist across the street was brought up. The Planning Commission desired to know if the church drive across the street would have a negative impact as aligned with the current proposal. Mr. Zettel said that this could be investigated further, but the uses would be largely compatible.

Mr. Zettel also recommended use of a red or brown brick with black roof shingles. He said this was not a requirement of the zoning code but was an aesthetic recommendation of his.

Hello everyone,

We <u>WILL</u> be meeting next week on Tuesday, July 1, 2008. The exclusive purpose of this meeting is to review a special land use and site plan for an assisted living facility as part of the Springbrook East Planned Unit Development. I have been working closely with the applicants to move their project forward as quickly as possible due to the long delays expected at the state level for review of the building plans (required of assisted care facilities). Their hope is to get approval this Tuesday from the Planning Commission. I am confident that the project is worthy of approval with conditions at this point.

Overall, the applicants and architects have been easy to work with. The project has been well conceived and the design has been well executed. The architects have been careful to pay close attention to preliminary meetings with staff and have generated a high quality plan accordingly. I have put this site plan and accompanying special land use under the highest level of scrutiny, and I am pleased with the findings. Please see the separate staff letters concerning the special land use (SLU) and site plan review (SPR) dated June 24, 2008.

To summarize the project, Woodside Builders has been conceptually approved to place senior housing at the corner of Russel and Laurel Drives (Springbrook East, next to Kroger and the detention area) per the Springbrook East PUD. Kal has partnered with a company that specializes in higher-end assisted living, and they have come up with a plan for an assisted/full care facility. Though there are a handful of waivers and other conditions present in the staff letters, this is typical of a PUD that has been planned with other uses (such as the duplexes and 'four-plexes'). Overall, I think it's a good plan and is ready to go.

Also, Meijer still wants to start construction of their store in less than nine months! They are coming in to downsize their current footprint by about 25%. This will require some tweaking of the site plan. As such, I am having them come in for a full site plan review. I expect to have new plans before our meeting on Monday. Meijer will likely be on the August agenda.

So, keep August date open! I will see you all this Tuesday. Please see the attached minutes from the June 9, 2008 City Council meeting. If you have any questions or comments (since we have not met in quite a while), I am available at City Hall at (810) 635-4464.



Dear Chairman and Commissioners:

City staff has reviewed the above special land use request of Woodside Builders to develop a nursing & convalescent home in the Springbrook East Planned Unit Development. The property is zoned RM-1 (Multiple Family Residential District) with a PUD overlay, which permits 'nursing and convalescent homes' as special land uses.

#### APPLICATION SUBMISSION

The application for the special land use was submitted by Woodside Builders on May 27, 2008 and is complete. The required information was received by city staff, and the notification for the public hearing was posted in the Swartz Creek News on June 15, 2008.

#### GENERAL STANDARDS REVIEW COMMENTS

The special land use application has been reviewed utilizing the general standards outlined in *Section 30.02* of the Swartz Creek Zoning Ordinance. The Planning Commission shall grant special land use approval if these standards are met.

1. Be consistent with the goals, objectives, and future land use plan described in the City of Swartz Creek Master Plan.

# Finding: In compliance

The Master Plan identifies the site as medium density residential. This designation translates into the RM-1 zoning district that will be discussed below. The Master Plan calls for uses and designs that are consistent in character, size and scale with the surrounding development.

The Master Plan recognizes the area to the west and south as generally residential (duplex and single family), while all uses located to the west are commercial (Kroger, Financial Plus, and Burger King). The proposed development must therefore be designed so it benefits the general area and minimizes negative impacts on nearby uses. Staff has recommended a number of improvements to the site plan to help

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ensure that the proposed development will be compatible with existing and future residential uses to the west and will also function as a transitional use to the commercial uses to the east. Our comments on the site plan have been provided in separate report.

Because the Springbrook East PUD included provisions for high-density, senior housing at this location to function as a transitional use and design feature between the duplexes and commercial, this special land use coincides well with the goals of the Master Plan.

2. Be consistent with the stated intent of the zoning district.

### Finding: In compliance.

The site is zoned RM-1, which "is designed to provide sites for low-rise multiple-family dwelling structures, and related uses, which will generally serve as zones of transition between the non-residential districts and the Single-Family Residential Districts, and whose height limitations are generally conducive to single-family residential areas."

The plan for the assisted living accomplishes this goal. The design of the facility is to be a large-footprint, single story structure. Materials and architectural style shall correspond closely to that of duplexes; however, a faux second story architectural feature shall provide height continuity between the Kroger and the duplexes in such a way that reflects the institutional transition of the use.

3. Be designed, constructed, operated, and maintained to be compatible with, and not significantly alter, the existing or intended character of the general vicinity in consideration of environmental impacts, views, aesthetics, noise, vibration, glare, air quality, drainage, traffic, property values or similar impacts.

## Finding: In compliance.

As noted above, the site plan fits well with all uses in the vicinity. Staff has reviewed the applicant's site plan and have identified a number of improvements to the proposed development that are needed to bring it into agreement with the higher quality required in a PUD. The applicant has included additional screening, enhanced materials, pedestrian facilities, street lighting continuity, and architecturally unique features to accomplish this.

4. Will not significantly impact the natural environment.

# Finding: In compliance

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The site is an urban site with no known wetlands or significant natural features. The plans are in conformance with requirements for storm water drainage and include significant open space and landscaping features.

5. Be served adequately by public facilities and services, such as police and fire protection, drainage structures, water and sewage facilities, refuse disposal and schools.

## Finding: In compliance.

The site is served with required public utilities. The proposed use should not have an adverse impact upon public services. We defer any additional comments on the adequacy of public utilities to the City Engineer. Input from the City Fire Chief and Police Chief has also been considered.

6. Be of a nature that will make vehicular and pedestrian traffic no more hazardous than is normal for the district involved, taking into consideration vehicular turning movements, proximity and relationship to intersections, adequacy to sight distances, location and access of off-street parking and provisions for pedestrian traffic.

# Finding: In compliance.

This project is not in a high traffic area because it is at the intersection of a local residential street and a commercial service drive. Pedestrian connections have been planned in conjunction with the Springbrook East PUD and the Elms-Miller PUD (Kroger) and are of the highest quality. Parking, sight distances, and access are considered adequate by staff.

7. The proposed use shall be such that the location and height of buildings or structures, and the location, nature and height of walls, fences, and landscaping will not interfere with or discourage the appropriate development and use of adjacent land and buildings or unreasonably affect their value.

# Finding: In compliance.

This property is one of the last to be planned in the Springbrook East PUD and the Miller-Elms PUD (north side of Miller) is nearly complete as well. Future commercial development may take place to the north of Kroger, but this use should function well as a transitional use for such development just as it would for Kroger. Values should remain unchanged or become enhanced.

8. Shall be designed, located, planned, and operated to protect the public health, safety, and welfare.

# Finding: In compliance.

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As noted above, the facility is well landscaped, lighted, screened for use, and secured. It is also architecturally interesting and has good accessibility to pedestrians and vehicles.

#### SPECIFIC STANDARDS REVIEW COMMENTS

The following sections identify specific requirements (Section 30.09.B.42) which shall be complied with by individual special land uses, as determined by the planning commission and city council, in addition to the general standards of section 30.02. Some or all of the specific requirements may be waived by city council upon a determination that the requirement(s) is not necessary or relevant.

a. There shall be provided on the site, not less than 1,500 square feet of open space for each bed in the home. The 1,500 square feet of land area shall provide for landscape setting, off-street parking, service drives, loading space, yard requirement and accessory uses, but shall not include the area covered by main or accessory buildings.

### Finding: In compliance

The applicant proposes 51 patient beds, requiring 76500 sq. ft of open space. The total site is 3.67 acres (159,865 sq. ft.) with 42,239 sq. ft. for the main building. This leaves 117,626 sq. ft. for open space.

b. All sites shall be located within adequate walking distance of food stores, shopping centers, restaurants and drug stores, as determined by the city council.

# Finding: In compliance

The proposed facility is located immediately west of a large grocery store, complete with pharmacy and other retailers. This commercial district shall be well connected for walking.

c. All dwelling units shall consist of at least 350 square feet per unit (not including kitchen and sanitary facilities).

## Finding: In compliance

Dwelling units are 380 gross s.f. for single occupancy and 500 gross s.f. for double occupancy.

d. Total area coverage of all buildings (including dwelling units and related service buildings) shall not exceed 25 percent of total site, exclusive of any dedicated public right-of-way.

Finding: Not in compliance-waiver recommended.

The building coverage ratio is 26.4% This exceeds the 25% maximum requirement. However, the City Council can waive this requirement as a condition of the site plan. It is the opinion of staff that the size and scale of the structure as it relates to the site and neighborhood are consistent with the intent of this special land use. This opinion is based on the fact that the project is located in a PUD that emphasizes narrow set-backs, high densities, and the mixing of uses. Note that 4,000 s.f. of the project is covered public space on the exterior of the structure.

e. The minimum lot size shall be not less than three acres.

Finding: In compliance.

The project parcel is 3.67 acres.

f. The gross density of the dwelling units shall not exceed 20 units per acre, exclusive of any dedicated public right-of-way of either interior or bounding roads.

Finding: In compliance.

The project proposes 13.90 units per acre.

g. Except as provided herein, all buildings and sites shall be in compliance with RM-1 requirements in this ordinance.

Finding: Deferred to site plan review.

Because of the scope and scale of this requirement, staff recommends that the special land use be conditioned upon approval of the site plan. The staff letter "Assisted Living Site Plan Review," dated June 24, 2008 is an exhaustive analysis of the project's compliance to the RM-1 zoning classification as it specifically relates to the Springbrook East PUD.

h. No housing for the elderly shall be converted to any other use without complying with the provisions of the zoning ordinance in effect.

Finding: In compliance.

This shall be a condition of the special land use approval that shall be tied to the property and remain in effect indefinitely. Failure to comply shall be a violation of the ordinance.

i. The city council may add any conditions it deems appropriate to ensure the compatibility of the development with the surrounding area.

Finding: Deferred to Planning Commission & City Council.

The Planning Commission and City Council may add conditions to the site plan approval that must be met by the applicant to validate the final approval and/or subsequent permits.

j. All buildings permitted hereunder shall not exceed 40 feet in height.

Finding: In compliance.

The top of the ridge at the highest point of the structure is 30' 6".

k. Principal buildings shall not be closer than 40 feet to any property line.

Finding: Not in compliance-waiver recommended.

The main structure is not in compliance with this standard as it relates to the future public right-of-way on Russel Drive and Laurel Drive, as well as the existing and future 'four-plexes' that are approved in the Springbrook East PUD. This deviation is welcomed and encouraged by city staff in order to develop set-back continuity with the streets in the subdivision and avoid the 'large-lot' or institutional scale the often accompanies such projects. In the interest of integrating the special-purpose 'four-plexes' with the assisted living and in creating the pedestrian scale of the PUD, staff recommends a waiver of this requirement.

### RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends approval of the nursing & convalescent home special land use request conditioned upon:

- 1.) Final site plan approval by the City Council
- 2.) Identified waivers are approved by City Council
- 3.) Housing for the elderly shall be converted to any other use without complying with the provisions of the zoning ordinance in effect
- 4.) Any other 'appropriate' conditions imposed by the City Council

City staff has reviewed the above site plan review request of Woodside Builders to develop a nursing & convalescent home in the Springbrook East Planned Unit Development. The property is zoned RM-1 (Multiple Family Residential District) with a PUD overlay, which permits 'nursing and convalescent homes' as special land uses.

### APPLICATION SUBMISSION

The application for site plan review was submitted by Woodside Builders on May 27, 2008 and is complete. The required information was received on plans dated 06/02/2008 (utilities) and 06/18/2008 (storm water) from Flint Surveying and Engineering and 06/04/2008 (site plan) and 06/24/2008 (enhanced site plan) Gunnlevine.

The proposed project is a 3.67 acre, 51 unit, 42,239 s.f, one-story nursing & convalescent home located within the Springbrook East Planned Unit Development on land that is zoning RM-1. The PUD concept plan, approved May 12, 2003, includes a provision for senior housing at this location.

### 1. RM-1 Standards.

# Finding: In compliance subject to three (3) recommended waivers

The use of nursing and convalescent home (used interchangeable with 'assisted living') is a special land use in the RM-1 district and is discussed thoroughly in the staff letter "Nursing & Convalescent Home Special Land Use Review" dated June 24, 2008.

- (a) Setbacks in a PUD may be reduced by 20% by the City Council, resulting in a required setback of 64 feet.
- (b) Note that the setbacks as measured are between properties that are included in the Springbrook East PUD and are related to and integrated with the assisted living project. As such, required minimum building spacing within RM-1 projects is twenty-five (25) feet. The required rear-to-rear spacing is sixty (60) feet. This project proposes minimum building separation of twenty-eight (28) feet. Note further that the right-of-way setbacks of the project are similar to the duplexes.
- (c) Buildings located in a PUD are not subject to height regulations unless they exceed a height of 2 ½ stories or 35 feet. Also, nursing and convalescent home special land uses may build to a height of forty (40) feet.

# 2. Site Plan and Structures-Generally.

Finding: In compliance subject to installation of the water loop and one additional hydrant; one recommendation

The building design must compliment the architectural features, layout, and materials of the Springbrook East duplexes while also functioning as a transition between the duplexes and the commercial area to the east. To this end the architect has included a layout and elevation that is similar, at a larger scale, to the surrounding duplexes.

Though large, the building has much glass and stone work. It also incorporates a reasonable amount of projections, peaked roofs, and columns. Overall, the building materials, layout, and architectural features satisfy staff requirements. However, the east entrance elevation should be constructed entirely of durable materials and glass features to off set the larger scale and increase the aesthetic appeal.

The utilities, construction notes, surface water management, and drainage have been reviewed by Rowe Inc. The review comments are in the Rowe letter dated June 24, 2008. Approval of the site plan should be conditioned upon satisfaction of all items addressed in this letter.

According to the Fire Chief, the site plan should be adequate for fire and rescue purposes as long as the watermains are looped and in operation prior to the issuance of a certificate of occupancy. However, a hydrant needs to be placed in the right-of-way near the site entrance on Kroger Drive. This hydrant shall be fed by the 12" watermain, and positioned in such a manner as approved by city staff.

# 3. Landscaping and screening.

Finding: In compliance subject to two (2) recommended waivers, one additional planting, and the relocation of right-of-way trees

Staff reviewed the landscape plan in accordance with the requirements in Section 28.02. Since the development is part of a PUD, additional landscaping beyond that required by the zoning ordinance is suggested where appropriate.

Note that landscaping requirements for RM-1 are intended to serve densities of approximately 8-13 units per acre maximum. The 20 unit per acre standard for assisted living creates a hardship for landscaping (More landscaping is required on less available open space). For this reason, and because the applicant has creatively included

thirteen (13) garden areas, staff recommends a waiver on the shrub count. Because the parking lot is well landscaped with gardens, shrubs, an entranceway wall, and the trees along the frontage, a waiver is recommended for the parking lot landscaping as well.

Concerning the location of the trees along all public right-of-ways, the applicant must move all canopy trees back in such a manner that they are no less than five (5) feet from the nearest sidewalk and out of the public right-of-way per ordinance. (Note that sidewalks must be separated from the curb by four feet). For that area along Kroger Drive, beyond the surveyed property boundaries, the applicant must demonstrate ownership or other easement entitlements for that area as illustrated for landscaping.

An additional tree should be added to the site plan for the general landscaping requirement. All landscaping materials are approved by ordinance. The screening of the dumpster enclosure, roof utilities, and nearby residences is adequate. In fact, based upon the effectiveness of the screening between the 'four-plexes' and the project, the Planning Commission and City Council may want to investigate the possibility of reducing the screening fence to a decorative fence at this location.

# 4. Parking and Loading.

# Finding: In compliance

In general, the location and layout of the off-street parking is adequate. There are no buffers needed, and screening appears appropriate since the landscaping is present and the lot is relatively small and elongated. The plan meets requirements as set forth below.

# 5. Lighting.

Finding: In compliance subject to staff approval of a standard photometric grid and lighting materials; street lighting along Kroger Drive is also required

The applicant proposes parking lot lighting, accent lighting, and street lighting for the project. The accent lighting and street lighting do not have specific regulations for this site plan but the street lighting is a required feature of the Springbrook East PUD. All lighting proposed is acceptable pending approval of materials, heights, and a photometric grid.

The applicant has yet to submit a formal lighting plan with a photometric grid. Lighting types and heights are also not available for review. However, lighting features can easily be conditionally approved since the photometric grid is a pass/fail test and the lighting materials are specifically regulated by ordinance.

The street lighting is acceptable, but lights need to be added along Kroger Drive.

# 6. Signs.

# Finding: In compliance subject to a setback waiver for the mounting structure

The project site plan has only one proposed sign. The sign is an identification sign that is proposed to be placed on a decorative screening wall near the intersection of Russel and Kroger Drives. The wall and sign do not meet required setbacks.

Due to the size of the project and the location of an existing public sewer easement, staff recognizes that the location of the sign and mounting wall are subject to unique circumstances and an undue hardship. As planned, the wall is only offset from the right-of-way by five (5) feet with the outline of the identification sign to be fifteen (15) feet from the right-of-way. As such, staff recommends a waiver of the setback requirement based upon its qualification for a variance. The exact text and size of the writing has yet to be determined.

Staff has also identified the eastern entranceway wall as an ideal place for a wall sign should the applicant choose to place such a sign.

### 7. Vehicular and Pedestrian Circulation.

Finding: In compliance subject to relocation of planned sidewalks and addition of sidewalk

Access management appears adequate from all aspects. There are not additional standards for this location since this project is not on an identified arterial or collector street. The only recommendation staff has is to line up the Kroger rear service drive with the site access on Kroger Drive, if appropriate.

Pedestrian access is good. The applicant needs to move all sidewalks to a location four or five feet off of the curbs, and must also relocate planned trees to a distance of at least five (5) feet away from the sidewalks. A sidewalk should be added to connect the main entrance to the Russel Drive sidewalk. Lastly, staff recommends colored, stamped asphalt or concrete for the main entrance crosswalk for safety and aesthetic purposes. Also note that sidewalks must be constructed independent of all drive approaches.

### 8. Natural Features

# Finding: In compliance

The site does not have any existing, significant natural features, and the project should not unreasonably detract from or harm the environment due to construction or operation.

# **Summary and Recommendation**

Staff recommends approval of the site plan, conditioned upon the following:

- 1. The issues identified in this report being addressed in construction documents for administrative review and approval.
- 2. Approval of the special land use application dated May 27, 2008 (nursing and convalescent home)
- 3. Approval of the waivers identified in this review.
- 4. Addition of face stone to the east entrance elevation as noted in this letter.
- 5. The addition of a canopy or deciduous tree to the site plan.
- 6. The relocation and addition of sidewalks per this letter
- 7. Administrative approval of exterior building lighting and parking lighting
- 8. Addition of decorative street lighting along Kroger Drive.
- 9. The acceptance and incorporation or waiver of review comments of all other consultants, departments, and review agencies.
- 10. Housing for the elderly shall be converted to any other use without complying

with the provisions of the zoning ordinance in effect (Spec. Land Use Req.)

11. Any other 'appropriate' conditions imposed by the City Council (Spec. Land Use Req.)

# **CDBG Three Year Funding Cycle - Projects**

Councilmember Adams said he would like to do something for the young people, while at the same time adequately fund the Senior Center. He stated his desire to hold a special Council meeting to consider where CDBG funds would be allocated, rather than make a decision before thoughtfully considering comments made at tonight's public hearing.

Mayor Pro-Tem Christie spoke in favor of allocating CDBG funds to the School District's S.C.C.A.T. after-school program as a priority. In addition, he felt the bike rodeo and park projects, perhaps suggested by the Park Board, would be worthy of consideration. The Mayor Pro-Tem felt a special Council meeting should be held.

Councilmember Hurt was in favor of a special Council meeting inasmuch as some good ideas had been brought forward at tonight's public hearing that he believed were worthy of more careful analysis.

Councilmember Porath noted there are restrictions on how CDBG funds can be allocated. Assistant Manager Zettel advised he can contact the County Planning Commission regarding possible projects, and receive an answer regarding their eligibility within a day.

Councilmember Shumaker stated we should take care of the young people in our community, and considered park improvements a good way to do this.

Councilmember Hurt suggested Assistant Manager Zettel contact the County before any special Council meeting regarding eligibility of the ideas put forth this evening.

### **Elms Park Gates**

Mayor Pro-Tem Christie stated in light of the unfortunate events at Elms Road Park last week, as well as the long-standing issue of people in the park after dark, he had inquired whether gates at the main entrance would be feasible. He felt a police officer to close the gates at dusk and open them at dawn would be of assistance in keeping vehicular traffic out of the park after dark.

City Manager Bueche directed Council to a letter from DPS Director Svrcek with a quote of approximately \$3,000 for gates. Mr. Bueche advised he had a conversation with Police Chief Clolinger regarding this matter. Chief Clolinger was somewhat concerned the officers might not watch the park as closely with gates installed, and it would still be accessible by foot or vehicles at the back side.

Councilmember Adams suggested if people want to get into the park they will whether there are gates or not. He was concerned about easy access for officers if gates were installed, and noted the police officer apprehended the recent perpetrator while doing a daily run through.

Councilmember Shumaker is aware of problems at the parks, and saw both advantages and disadvantages to gates. Apart from the question regarding gates, he stated the City should make some effort to close off the southern areas of Elms Road Park. Councilmember Shumaker noted gates would be prohibitive to responsible adults bringing their children to ice skate and sled after dark in the winter. If it is decided gates should be installed, Councilmember Shumaker noted careful consideration should be given to the type.

City Manager Bueche further advised Chief Clolinger was concerned officers would not open the gate and go in at night. He was concerned this might encourage people to park at the perimeters and walk into the park to have parties, knowing they could escape while an officer was unlocking the gates.

After further discussion, it was decided this matter should be referred to the Park Board for their investigation and recommendation back to Council.

# **City Population, Census**

Assistant Manager Zettel explained the purpose of a mid-decade census. He advised there had been some question in 2000 that the figure arrived at was too low. Since revenue sharing is based on population, it could be beneficial for the City to train or hire a firm to recount if there is a possibility the figure is now higher. Mr. Zettel advised if the number is 10% higher than the 2000 census figure, the City would be eligible to receive more dollars from the state. Assistant Manager Zettel described how he arrived at the figure of approximately 5,900.

Discussion ensued regarding cost/benefit factors. It was agreed to expand the study in order to arrive at a more accurate assessment.

#### Three Year Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Distribution

Assistant Manager Zettel reviewed the projects that had been identified at the CDBG Public Hearing on Monday, October 23, 2006 for those present.

Mr. Zettel noted the S.C.C.A.T. (Swartz Creek Cares about Teens) Program did not qualify, because they need to service 50% of the low to moderate income children. He advised tracking was done through the school lunch program, and it only identified 35%.

Assistant Manager Zettel advised there is currently no way to track low to moderate income use by Camp 911 participants, therefore they are not eligible for CDBG funding.

Mr. Zettel also noted the Blacksmith Shop Demo is not in the targeted area, and Elms Park play equipment doesn't qualify. In addition, he advised the Veterans Memorial Park Committee would have to relinquish its non-profit status, which would not be to its advantage.

The Assistant Manager advised the City's Trail-way System would cost approximately \$45 per foot. He noted due to the high cost, matching funds or another grant would be necessary.

It was the consensus of those present that it would be preferable to continue the sidewalk enhancement program on Miller Road in downtown, rather than make improvements on Morrish Road.

Based on measurable criteria and other CDBG standards, Mr. Zettel advised the continuation of the Downtown Sidewalk Enhancement Program and Senior Center operating expenses are the most likely candidates for funding.

Considerable discussion ensued. Administrative staff and Engineer Fleury responded to inquiries and concerns of Council.

City Manager Bueche advised the City will be monitoring the possibilities for recaptured CDBG funds. Also, it was determined the City will begin planning for next year's funding possibilities now in order that there might be more projects eligible for CDBG funding in three years, such as those identified at the public needs hearing.

#### CITY OF SWARTZ CREEK SPECIFICATIONS AND INFORMATION FOR REPLACEMENT SIDEWALKS (4" AND 6") SUMMER 2008

#### **GENERAL INFORMATION**

The City of Swartz Creek is beginning the annual city-wide sidewalk repair program. Property owners will be notified of sidewalk on their property that is declared to be in a state of disrepair and be given thirty (30) days to repair same. Total required repairs for last year were about 1,400 square feet plus additional change orders requested by property owners.

The City will be taking bids on 4" and 6" sidewalk on a "square foot" cost to assist in repairing their sidewalk. Should the property owner want to use the successful bidder, they would make payment to the City in the amount invoiced by the successful bidder, who in return will pay the contractor after successful completion of the work.

The work will be done on an "as needed" procedure to be determined by the City of Swartz Creek.

#### **GENERAL SPECIFICATIONS**

- 1. Existing broken sidewalk shall be removed and hauled away.
- 2. Existing broken sidewalk removed at nearest joint. The edge of existing sidewalk and driveway shall be smooth and straight before new concrete is poured next to them. Saw cutting may be required to produce a smooth and straight edge.
- 3. Existing tree roots, clay, etc., to be removed by contractor.
- 4. Contractor to clean up, backfill, and seed area as needed.
- 5. All concrete shall have minimum test strength of 3,000 psi in compression after twenty-eight (28) days.
- 6. Pitch all sidewalks downward toward the street at a minimum slope of 1/4" per foot.
- 7. Expansion Joints: Place 1/2" traverse expansion joints through the sidewalk at 100 foot intervals and at all points where the line of the sidewalk changes direction. Expansion joints shall also be placed next to existing concrete driveways.
- 8. Crack Control: Joint Dummy; joints for crack control shall be placed at four foot (4') intervals for four foot (4') wide walk and five foot (5') intervals for five foot (5') wide walk.
- 9. Thickness: All walks shall be four inches (4") thick except at driveways where they shall be six inches (6") thick.
- 10. Width: Unless otherwise required, all walks shall be of the same width as the existing walk.
- 11. Finishing Concrete: The concrete shall be spaded next to the forms to insure the removal of all voids in the concrete. The finish surface of the concrete slab shall be trowelled smooth and brushed lightly with a stiff broom or brush. Care shall be exercised to avoid overworking the finish and thereby bringing the fine material to the surface.
- 12. Finished Joints: All joints shall have a radius of 1/2" formed with the proper tools.

#### **CONSTRUCTION NOTES**

#### Protection

#### Vehicle and Equipment

The above cases involve Genesee County, its board of commissioners, the county and state health departments, and the county medical control authority, as well as the 9-1-1 Consortium. They attack the December 4, 2007 ordinance passed by the county board of commissioners which prohibits all ambulance companies from operating in the county. It creates two emergency medical service zones with a single ambulance operation for each zone, or a single ambulance operation for the entire county.

The 9-1-1 Consortium is a defendant because the plaintiffs claim that the Consortium denied the plaintiff's request to install Automatic Vehicle Locators (AVLs) in their ambulances. The Consortium is being defended by its insurance company. They have assigned Mr. Christopher Johnson to act as counsel. The Consortium's Executive Board has instructed Mr. Johnson to take no part in adding our members to any of these lawsuits. There was some indication the county would request any community which expressed opposition to the ordinance to be added as a party plaintiff to the lawsuits. The Consortium's position in this litigation is that:

• The 9-1-1 Consortium knows that it must dispatch to the closest most appropriate ambulance once it is given the means to do this. The means will consist of at least six additional dispatchers and the equipment they will need. In addition, each ambulance will have to be equipped with 800 MHz receivers and AVLs which are compatible with the equipment of the dispatch center. The 9-1-1 Consortium does not currently have the funds in its budget to

provide the means to dispatch in this manner. When it is equipped to do so, it intends to dispatch without favoritism to each ambulance that is appropriate and is closest to the call location. It will not dispatch to any ambulance which is not equipped with a compatible receiver and AVL.

- The 9-1-1 Consortium currently dispatches police and fire services.
   It has done its best to accommodate ambulance services, but realizes that its own legal exposure, and the exposure of the ambulance companies requires a more standardized and uniform dispatching system.
- The 9-1-1 Consortium does not oppose or favor the new ordinance.
   It does favor the dispatching system outlined above. When, and if, that system can be put in place, it will dispatch to all ambulance companies which are properly equipped, unless it is prohibited from doing so by a court or the board of commissioners.

These lawsuits raise many technical issues. Each complaint is 130-140 paragraphs long. There are claims of constitutional deprivation, interference with contractual relationships, conspiracies, discriminations, etc. They may go on for years. In the meantime, total implementation of this ordinance is delayed.

I am available to any of you to discuss specific aspects of the complaints. This letter is intended to be an explanation of the Consortiums position to date. Your comments and suggestions are welcome.

### Membership Responsibilities

Membership in the Michigan Municipal League Liability and Property Pool provides numerous benefits. Likewise, individual members have certain responsibilities to the other members, which are detailed in the Intergovernmental Contract. The following is a summary of the membership responsibilities. Please refer to the Intergovernmental Contract, Articles 5 and 6, for more information.

- ✓ If a Member intends to leave the Pool, the Member must send a written notice to the Pool at least 60 days prior to its next renewal date.
- A Member must pay its premium when due. The Pool must give each member 20 days written notice of intent to terminate membership for nonpayment of premium. Payment of premium before the 20 days notice is effective will entitle the Member to reinstatement.
- Members must maintain membership or associate membership status in the Michigan Municipal League.
- A Member will allow attorneys employed by the Pool to represent the Member in defense of any claim made against the Member within the scope of coverage provided by the Pool. A Member will cooperate with the assigned attorneys, claims adjusters, service company or other agents of the Pool relating to the defense of claims for which the Pool is providing coverage.
- ✓ A Member will follow loss reduction and prevention measures established by the Pool.
- A Member will report to the Pool as promptly as possible all incidents that the Member reasonably believes may result in a claim against the Member.



Dear Mrs. Sanborn,

Our company is the claims administrators for the City of Swartz Creek and, as such, are on notice of your claim for damages as the result of a sewer back up. In determining the liability on behalf of any municipality we look to the proper statutes and/or case law to determine if that municipality is liable or "legally obligated" to the claim presented.

Legislation has introduced <u>Public Act 222</u> (2001) which finds governmental agencies are now responsible for direct and indirect storm or sewer back ups that are the result of a construction, design, maintenance, operation or repair defect that Is more than 50% the cause of the plaintiff's damages. In order to qualify for such a claim; a property owner must meet all of the following critieria:

"a claimant may seek compensation for property damage or physical injury from a governmental agency if all of the following elements existed at the time of the event:

- a) The governmental agency was an appropriate governmental agency.
- b) The sewage disposal system had a defect.
- c) The governmental agency knew, or in the exercise of reasonable diligence should have known, about the defect.
- d) The governmental agency, having the legal authority to do so, failed to take reasonable steps in a reasonable amount of time to repair, correct, or remedy the defect.
- e) The defect was a substantial proximate cause of the event and the property damage or physical injury."

In addition to the Act stating that all five elements must exist at the time of the event, the Michigan Court of Appeals recently held, in the case entitled <u>Willett v</u> <u>Waterford Township</u>, that all five elements must exist at the time of the event in order for a claim to be successfully presented against a municipality.

Our investigation has determined that there was no actual defect within the cities main sewer line. Based on the above, but not limited thereto, we must respectfully deny your claim. We suggest you contact your homeowner's carrier for coverage.

Miller Road Reconstruction – Phase 1 completed!

Flint, Michigan. ---

The Genesee County Road Commission announced today that it has completed Phase 1 of the reconstruction of Miller Road from Linden Road to Ballenger Highway in Flint Township.

According to construction manager John Plamondon, the completion of this phase, which is from I-75 to Manwaring Drive (just east of the Best Buy store), has resulted in significant improvement to traffic flow throughout the entire project, as it was designed to do. In fact, he says, "The section is so smooth and new, and traffic so relatively light, that drivers need to be reminded that they are still in a 25 MPH construction zone."

In addition to completely reconstructing the roadway in this section, Phase 1 also included the installation of a second left turn lane from Miller onto southbound I-75 (this is currently the source of lengthy traffic backups, often extending beyond Lennon Road) and widening of the entrance to I-75. Also, the traffic signals all along Miller Road were interconnected and upgraded to a traffic-responsive, radio-controlled system during this phase, improving efficiency further still.

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Manager-Director John Daly praised the cooperation the Road Commission has received from Miller Road businesses and the motoring public. "Even though merchants and motorists are seeing the inevitable slowdowns during construction, we have received almost no complaints. However we have received numerous suggestions from the public for improvements to the operation of the project; most of which we have been able to implement. The addition of the second left turn lane onto southbound I-75 and the improvements to the Miller/Lennon intersection are two examples. Our message to the public continues to be, 'There is no reason to avoid Miller Road this summer. Traffic is moving well on 3 lanes, all businesses are open and driveways are well marked."

Phase 2 of the project is the reconstruction of the segment from Manwaring Drive to Linden Road. Phase 3, which will be done concurrently with Phase 2, is the segment east of I-75 to Ballenger Highway. The entire project is scheduled to be completed by September 15<sup>th</sup>, well ahead of the Holiday traffic rush. ### BUDGET UPDATE: '09 Budget Brings 2-Percent Statutory Revenue **Sharing Increase for Communities**

Yesterday, Governor Granholm and legislative leaders announced a budget deal which would provide local governments the first statutory revenue sharing increase in eight years – 2 percent (\$8 million), despite a \$400 million state budget deficit.

Lawmakers are expected to vote on the deal today and tomorrow before they break for most of the summer. This is, in part, so local units can plan for their budget year, which for many begins July 1.

While this is not the 4-percent increase the governor proposed and House passed, it is a positive outcome considering the Senate stripped the budget of a statutory revenue sharing increase just four weeks ago. The League is thankful to House Democrats including Speaker Andy Dillon, Appropriations Chair George Cushingberry and Appropriations Subcommittee Chair Martha Cheeks, and the Granholm Administration for making revenue sharing a priority in the negotiations.

This increase signals the League's message – Michigan must invest in communities to attract business and residents – is starting to catch on.

Streaming Audio: Governor Jennifer Granholm says that to attract young professionals "we have to invest in the places they want to live..."

Although it is a far cry from the funding we have lost, we are hopeful the increase is the Legislature's first step toward recognizing revenue sharing is essential for making communities the types of places that attract businesses and residents.

"We hope that this modest increase for our local units of government will ensure that police and fire services can be maintained in order to protect the families of Michigan," Speaker Andy Dillon (D-Redford Twp.) said in conversation with the League today. "I am glad that we were able to craft a bipartisan compromise that will improve the quality of life for the communities in which we all live, work and raise a family."

### Additional Budget Highlights

### **Fire Protection Grants**

The Department of Labor and Economic Growth budget will hold flat the \$10.9 million appropriated for Fire Protection Grant funding for communities with state property.

#### **Transportation Funding**

The Transportation Budget Conference Committee has yet to schedule a meeting; indications are the governor's recommendation will hold: decrease municipal transportation funding by \$14 million to correspond with the decrease in gas tax revenues which are collected and distributed according to the Act 51 funding formula. Look for more information on boilerplate language in Tuesday's Legislative Link.

### **Universities, Community Colleges & State Departments**

Universities and community colleges will receive a 1-percent increase and all state departments will see a .5-percent decrease across the board.



### **State Affairs Report**

House to Consider Billboards Bill – The House this week is expected to consider SB 1370 (Gilbert, R-Algonac), which would amend the billboard law. The bill, as passed by the Senate, would reduce the spacing requirements allowed for billboards; allow for new billboards in communities in Saginaw County; change vegetation limitations; create a definition of nonconforming uses and; change the fees that need to be paid to the state. The League has indicated several concerns and the Granholm Administration is opposed to the bill. ### Dear Customers:

This year's Consumer Confidence Report (for 2007) comes to you, the citizens of the county, at a unique time in our community's history. The contract for water supply from Detroit is at an end and we are faced with a decision that will affect our water for at least the next 35 years. We must answer this question: Do we stay with the low risk, high cost water supplied by Detroit or do we seize the opportunity to take control of our own needs? As you have heard, the City of Detroit's average rate increase for water in 2008 was 6.3% for its own residents and 15.2% for the residents of Genesee County. You may have heard that Detroit is going to build a second pipeline from Pontiac to Flint to give us our redundant supply with a price tag of \$400 million.

For 2008, Detroit included 30 million dollars for design of the pipeline, which resulted in our rates increasing over 15%. What is going to happen when they add 400 million, ten times the amount, for construction of the second pipeline?

This year, the City of Flint voted to join Genesee County to identify the capital and operating costs associated with building our own regional water supply system. We have also recently met with members of the Lapeer Water Authority and Lapeer County to discuss water supply alternatives. This project would include a joint pipeline and up to three treatment plants: the City of Flint's plant, County plant, and the Lapeer plant. Each plant would serve as a backup water supply to the others. The final study will determine the capital costs to construct the facilities and determine the day-to-day cost to operate the system. We are also in discussions with our neighbors to the south about developing a regional system. We will compare these costs against the projected costs from the City of Detroit.

As I have said in the past, "There will be a pipeline built and the citizens of Flint and Genesee County will pay for it. The question is, who will own it, Detroit or us?" It is my goal to place both options before the public: a long-term agreement with DWSD or an agreement to create our own waterline to provide water to the residents. My staff and I are striving to provide the truest picture of both options so that you, the customer, can make the decision based on rational and responsible cost estimates and not just on an emotional level or a reaction to ever rising water bills. This fall, we will be meeting in local community halls and with neighborhood block clubs to explain both options and answer any questions you may have.

I conclude today with a "thank you" for taking the time to read the CCR and hope that you review the document in its entirety. Technical questions about the chemical results reported in this year's CCR should be addressed to Tim Davidek at 810-732-7870.

Water Source GCDC-WWS is supplied water through the City of Flint by the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department, which draws its water from Lake Huron. We provide water to nineteen communities within the County.

Additional Information

To ensure that tap water is safe to drink, the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) prescribes limits on the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. Food & Drug Administration (FDA) regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water.

Drinking water, including bottled water, may reasonably be expected to contain at least small amounts of some contaminants. The presence of contaminants does not necessarily indicate that water poses a health risk. More information about contaminants and potential health effects can be obtained by calling the Environmental Protection Agency's Safe Drinking Water Hotline (800-426-4791).

The sources of drinking water (both tap water and bottled water) include rivers, lakes, streams, ponds, reservoirs, springs, and wells. As water travels over the surface of the land or through the ground, it dissolves naturally occurring minerals and radioactive material, and can pick up substances resulting from the presence of animals or from human activity.


Contaminants that may be present in source water include:

- (A) Microbial contaminants, such as viruses and bacteria, which may come from sewage treatment plants, septic systems, agricultural livestock operations, and wildlife.
- Inorganic contaminants, such as salts and metals, which can be naturally occurring or result from urban stormwater runoff, industrial or domestic wastewater (B) discharges, oil and gas production, mining, or farming.
- Pesticides and herbicides, which may come from a variety of sources, such as (C) agriculture, urban stormwater runoff and residential uses.
- (D) Organic chemical contaminants, including synthetic and volatile organics, which are by-products of industrial processes and petroleum production, and can also come from gas stations, urban stormwater runoff and septic systems.
- (E) Radioactive contaminants, which can be naturally occurring or the result of oil and gas production and mining activities. (In order to ensure that tap water is safe to drink, EPA prescribes regulations, which limit the amount of certain contaminants in water provided by public water systems. The FDA regulations establish limits for contaminants in bottled water, which must provide the same protection for public health.)

**How Do I Read This Chart?** 

It's easy! Our water is tested to assure that it is safe and healthy. These tables are based on tests conducted by GCDC-WWS and the City of Detroit within the last five (5) calendar years. We conduct many tests throughout the year, however, only tests that show the presence of a contaminant are shown here. The table on this page is a key to the terms used in the following tables. The column marked Highest Detected Level shows the highest test results during the year. Sources of Contaminant show where this substance usually originates.

#### Lake Huron Plant Source Water Assessment

Your source water comes from the lower Lake Huron watershed. The watershed includes numerous short, seasonal streams that drain to Lake Huron. The Michigan Department of Environment Quality in partnership with the U.S. Geological Survey, the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department, and the Michigan Public Health Institute performed a source water assessment to determine the susceptibility of potential contamination. The susceptibility rating is a seven-tiered scale ranging from moderately low to very high based primarily on geologic sensitivity, water chemistry, and contaminant sources. The Lake Huron source water intake is categorized as having a moderately low susceptibility to potential contaminant sources. The Lake Huron water treatment plant has historically provided satisfactory treatment of this source water to meet drinking water standards.

Cryptosporidium

Cryptosporidium is a disease-causing parasite that lives in the intestinal tract of many animals, including dogs and cats. Symptoms of infection include diarrhea, abdominal cramps, headaches, nausea, and vomiting. The disease is typically spread through contact with feces of an infected animal or person and by consuming contaminated food or water. Cryptosporidium can be introduced into bodies of water by way of surface water runoff containing animal waste and sewage discharge. The water supplied to the Genesee County Division of Water and Waste Services has been tested for Cryptosporidium since 1994 and has never been detected in any water supply samples.

### Monitoring Requirements Not Met for Genesee County Water System

We are required to monitor your drinking water for specific contaminants on a regular basis. Results of regular monitoring are an indicator of whether or not our drinking water meets health standards. During July 2007, we did not complete all monitoring for bacteriological contaminants. The violation does not pose a threat to the quality of the supply's water.

What should I do? There is nothing you need to do at this time. This is not an emergency. You do not need to boil water or use an alternative source of water at this time.

The table below lists the contaminants we did not properly test for. How often are we supposed to sample for these contaminants, how many samples we are supposed to take, how many samples we took, when samples should have been taken, and the date on which follow-up samples were (or will be) taken.

What happened? What is being done? A routine sample collected July 3, 2007 tested positive for total coliform. Results were available on July 4th holiday and repeat samples should have been collected within 24 hours of notification. Unfortunately there was a breakdown in communication due to the holiday and repeat samples were not collected as required. We are taking steps to prevent this type of error from happening in the future. Samples taken since then show that all results met acceptable limits.

Important Health Information - Lead

Since 1992, with the cooperation of many residents, Genesee County WWS has been testing homes with plumbing systems that may contribute lead to the household water supply. If your home has a lead service line or piping that has lead soldered joints, you can take the following precautions to minimize your exposure to lead that may have leached into your drinking water from your pipes.

Run your water for 30 to 60 seconds, or until it feels cold. This practice should be followed anytime your water has not been used for more than 6 hours.


Always use cold water for drinking, cooking or making baby formula.

Use faucets and plumbing materials that are either lead-free or will not leach unsafe levels of lead into your water.

The 1996 amendments to the U.S. Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA) requires that pipe, fittings, and fixtures introduced into commerce after August 6, 1998, be lead free. For pipe, fittings, and devices, this requires that the products not contain more than 8.0% lead.


People with Special Health Concerns

Some people may be more vulnerable to contaminants in drinking water than is the general population. Immuno-compromised persons, such as persons with cancer who are undergoing chemotherapy, persons who have undergone organ transplants, people with HIV/AIDS or other immune system disorders, some elderly, and infants can be particularly at risk from infections. These people should seek advice about drinking water from their health care providers. This legislation is known as Public Act 480 of 2006, MCL 484.3301 et seq, the "Uniform Video Services Local Franchise Act." The Act took effect on January 1, 2007. The Michigan Public Service Commission (MPSC) is the agency designated to implement the Act.

## Look out: Price for water soon could be going up for Genesee County residents

**GENESEE COUNTY, Michigan** -- Look for your wallet to take another hit soon.

With gas and food prices already on the rise, now it appears water rates in much of the county also will be climbing soon. Detroit -- the source of water for most of Genesee County -- raised its rates 15.9 percent and local communities now are figuring out how much of that cost will trickle down to homeowners.

"I'm trying to make ends meet," said Jeff Smith of Mt. Morris, who said he pays about \$90 a month for water.

"I think we should get our water from the Great Lakes," Smith said. "We right here in Michigan and we got that water."

Genesee County Drain Commissioner Jeff Wright said he's not sure how much of increase water users will see. That depends on what their respective townships, cities or villages charge.

Currently the Detroit rate is \$11.35 per thousand cubic feet. Effective Aug. 1, the rate will go to \$13.07 per thousand cubic feet -- an increase of \$1.72.

The average homeowner uses approximately 8,000 gallons of water per month, which equates to 1,072 cubic feet.

Burton City Councilwoman Ellen Ellenburg said the city will probably have to raise its water rates because of the increase. Officials there will probably decide soon how much cost they will pass along to the city's water customers.

"A lot of people were worried their water rates would go up," Ellenburg said. "The water -- we don't raise them up unless we get a raise from another direction."

### About the price of water:

- The city of Detroit is raising its water rates -- charged to local communities including Flint and Genesee County --15.9 percent.
- The rate will increase from \$11.35 per thousand cubic feet to \$13.07 per thousand cubic feet, up \$1.72.
- The average homeowner uses approximately 8,000 gallons of water per month -- 1,072 cubic feet.
- The county will pay \$1.2 million more this year under the rate increase. The county will see a cost increase of about \$1.2 million per year.

Apparently the fee increase won't drain Flint residents' wallets, though -- even though the new rate will cost the city about \$1.4 million and comes on top of a \$600,000 hike last year, Flint Mayor Don

Williamson said.

"The City of Flint didn't pass it on to its residents," Williamson said. "They haven't seen the first one and they haven't seen the other one either."

Homeowners will probably start seeing the higher rates on their bills sometime in the fall, depending on how quickly local communities pass along rates, Wright said.

Davison, Grand Blanc, Fenton and Linden won't be affected by the increase, because they don't get their water from the county, but rather from wells.

These latest price increases from Detroit have Wright thinking more about a way for Genesee County to find a different source of water.

The county has been working for years on feasibility studies and cost estimates for new pipeline that could deliver water from Lake Huron and allow the county to break its ties with the Detroit water system.

The county purchased 230 acres of Lake Huron property, including shoreline, just in case the idea pans out.

"We're getting to the point where we can build a pipeline for the same price just to buy water," Wright said. "It's pretty much a break-even proposition."

Wright said the county is in the final phase of a three-part study on the feasibility of pipeline. He hopes the study will be finished by October.

Macomb and Oakland counties have also shown interest in the pipeline, Wright said.

First off, let me extend my thanks on behalf of the City, for your kind comments regarding Swartz Creek's appearance, management and quality of life. We at City Hall always strive to achieve these things you address, sometimes against insurmountable hurdles. It's always good to know that our work is noticed.

Regarding the Miller Elms Traffic Signal and dedicated turn lanes for north-south Elms, I do agree with you. It appears that dedicated turn signals would benefit all phases of the intersection. In reality though, the installation of all regulatory traffic control devices, inclusive of stop signs, signals, speed zones and other similar controls, is an exact science. By this, I mean that standards exists that are used by federal, state and local governments that drive the types of devices that are needed to enhance safety. If these standards are compromised, the result could be that the road becomes more dangerous. As this relates to the Miller & Elms Signal, a variety of data on the intersection was collected and then given to the City's Traffic Engineer who in turn, designed the signal to comply with standards based on traffic volume, intersection movements and turn data. To the casual observer, it would appear that the intersection would function better if the north-south had dedicated left turn lanes. Not true. The north-south lanes do not yet meet the criteria for dedicated turn lanes. To add them now would decrease safety and/or create new problems. The signal was designed anticipating that at some future point, dedicated north-south lanes would be warranted. When this occurs, they will be added.

I hope this addresses your question. If not, please give me a call and I can add some further explanation and detail.
