OLD / ROUTINE BUSINESS - REVISITED ISSUES / PROJECTS

✓ PERSONNEL POLICIES & PROCEDURES (Status)

Awaiting a draft. When we have this document, we will do an administrative review and be back for some conversation.

✓ DISASTER, EMERGENCY RESPONSE POLICY COMMITTEE (Status)

We are back meeting and have a draft for review. We should be back before the Council for discussion on this in the near future.

✓ VETERANS MEMORIAL (Status)

Nothing New.

✓ NON-RESIDENT SERVICES STUDY, RAUBINGER BRIDGE (Status)

Pending.

✓ OVERHEAD UTILITY REORGANIZATION PROJECT (Status)

We are trying to get a contractor's quote for the second round of the technical review of the poles. REI has expressed an interest in the project and is working on a price. I qualify this with we are in the bid process for engineering services. This probably needs to be settled first. I will keep the Council posted.

✓ MAJOR STREET FUND, TRAFFIC IMPROVEMENTS (See Individual Category)

☐ BRISTOL ROAD T.I.P. PROJECT, BRISTOL EXTENSION (Status)

The contractor is looking for an additional \$50k on this project. They claim additional engineering, change orders, and additional work, some of which is related to the Verizon poles. MDOT has a grievance procedure in which the contractor has initiated. Two steps have been completed with a recommendation for an additional \$15k. The ball is in the contractor's court as to whether they desire to move to the next process. We will see where it heads.

□ SEYMOUR RE-SURFACING PROJECT (Status)

Underway. I will keep the Council posted on issues and developments.

□ ELMS ROAD RE-SURFACING PROJECT (Status)

The Contractor is Ace Asphalt of Flint. Assuming that the County Road Commission will participate in a 50% contribution of the local match for the 1,300' section that borders the City and the Township (County jurisdiction), our total cost for this project, inclusive of Construction, Design Engineering, Construction Engineering and Interest on the Jobs Today Pull Ahead, is **\$294,477.** We are still negotiating with the County for participation on the local match of the border portion. The project is slated for a mid June start date. I will keep the Council informed on the progression of the border section.

MORRISH ROAD RE-CONSTRUCTION PROJECT / MEIJER'S (Status) Mr. Figura has completed a draft and Meijer's is reviewing it. I have included a copy for the Council to look at. Please keep in mind that at this point, it is a draft only and very preliminary. GM-SPO ISLAND CUTS (Status) We will be back to discuss this project as soon as we get some long-term road revenues and expenses calculated for this fund. MILLER ROAD REPAIRS (Resolution) This work is underway and expected to last about 4 weeks. We took the liberty to get a price for shaving the asphalt hums along Miller east of I-69. The cost provided by the Miller Road Contractor (Lois Kay) is \$11,898. This work is not consistent with the

This work is underway and expected to last about 4 weeks. We took the liberty to get a price for shaving the asphalt hums along Miller east of I-69. The cost provided by the Miller Road Contractor (Lois Kay) is \$11,898. This work is not consistent with the saw-cut, peg and concrete flatwork specifications. Mr. Fluery believes the price to be competitive and in the final analysis, cheaper as the traffic control measures and labor power will already be present. Additionally, if it is formally bid, engineering costs for bid preparation will be needed. He advises us to take the offer and treat it as a change order. The City's Purchasing Ordinance, #2-402 (a)(2) allows for deviation from the sealed bid process under certain circumstances. This should qualify. I have a resolution included with tonight's agenda... Council decision. On another related matter, there are a number of other concrete deteriorations in the area where we are currently saw cutting and re-pouring the concrete. We chose the very worst ones, but a hard winter has caused other areas to break up. We are evaluating whether it's feasible to add on to this project. We will be back at the next meeting for further discussion.

✓ LOCAL STREET FUND, TRAFFIC IMPROVEMENTS (Status)

☐ 2008 REPAIR ROSTER (Status)

Chesterfield from Seymour to Winston, Jennie Lane, Worchester from Winston to Daval (a portion of this is a Major Street, eligible for 202 funding) and Daval from Oakview to Winshall. Lou wants to wait and compare the Seymour prices with the Elms prices and do what is most advantageous to us. As soon as MDOT awards the Elms Contract, we will be back with a recommendation.

□ NEIGHBORHOOD IMPROVEMENT - T.I.F. DISTRICT (Status)

Adam is looking into this. We will be back for additional discussion in the near future.

✓ FIRE DEPARTMENT EVALUATION, 2008 CONTRACT RENEWAL (Status)

I have met several times with Mr. Shumaker regarding the contract. We have identified a handful of areas that need addressing. Mr. Figura is working on a draft.

✓ SEWER REHABILITATION PROJECT, I&I, PENALTIES (Status)

At a recent past meeting, we awarded the bid to Liqui-Force based on unit prices. We will be back before the Council shortly with a contract for Phase II of the program.

✓ WWS INTERGOVERNMENTAL JURISDICTION ORDINANCE (Status)

The County has turned up the pressure to adopt both the ordinance and the agreement that transfer enforcement (and probably anything else they deem fit) over to them. We are working with Mr. Figura evaluating our options.

✓ HERITAGE PARK & NON-MOTORIZED TRAIL SYSTEM (Status)
Pending.

✓ SR. CENTER, LEVY, BUILDING & FUTURE FUNDING PLAN (Status) Pending.

✓ **SPRINGBROOK**, **HERITAGE STREET-LIGHTING** (Status)

We need to talk on a number of issues similar to this. I am working on a recommendation and a policy in handling our condominium associations in an effort to treat them all the same. I will be back at a near future meeting for discussion and the adoption of a policy.

✓ LABOR CONTRACTS (Status)

I have had little time to work on these items due to financial season coupled with regular business. I will try to clear these matters after we get a draft budget in the market. On Mr. Kehoe, he is currently a payroll employee and needs an employment agreement. I will look to get something together and back before the Council soon. Additionally, the Police have a wage re-opener for the July 1, 2008 through June 30, 2009 segment of their contract. I have begun negotiations with them and will be back as soon as I have something concrete.

On my contract, it probably needs visiting for update purposes. I would like to take a pass on any rate increases for another year or two and until we are on better financial ground. I am not sure how the Council desires to handle an evaluation. As you recall, a couple of years ago I created a list of accomplishments and shortfalls as I saw them. I could bring the list up to date and then bring it back to the Council for discussion and review. Unless the Council has strong input one way or the other, I will do this and set it for a discussion item, hopefully soon. We can then go from here.

✓ RETIREE HEALTH CARE (Status)

Again, I have had little time to work on these items due to financial season coupled with regular business. I will try to clear these matters after we get a draft budget in the market. Mr. Gildner has prepared a base agreement that leaves only the specifics to be filled in by the staff. I am working on tailoring them in line with specific contracts to which the specific employee went out on. I should have them back soon for Council review.

✓ MARATHON STATION BLIGHT & NON-CONFORMING USE (Status)

This matter is set for trial on May 30th. The property owner is in financial trouble and is looking to do a quick sale to cover the commercial loan before the bank forecloses. They have asked for additional time, until August, to allow them to attempt to accomplish this. Short of this, they say they will walk away and leave the problem to the bank. They advise they have hired a contractor to remove the pylon sign and the canopy for salvage costs and are on a short waiting list for the work to be done. Mr. Gildner would prefer to get an unconditional judgment now and elect to not enforce it, using it as advantage, as opposed to trust them. I agree. I will keep the Council informed on developments.

✓ GENERAL LEDGER & ACCOUNTING SOFTWARE (Status)

Software installation and data conversion are in the process. So far, no real problems. I will keep the Council informed and give a sample of potential reports as soon as we have the system fully on line.

✓ COUNTY E.M.S. ORDINANCE, AMBULANCE SERVICE (Status)

We are watching it.

✓ FEES, RATES & SERVICE CHARGES (Status)

We are still reviewing the best method for the installation of the new rate structure. I will have a plan for the Council in the near future. As an afterthought, it appears that we will be getting another rate increase from Detroit... about 8.5%. We have not received official notice, but the Detroit Newspapers are reporting this. I will keep the Council informed.

√ 2007-2008 FY AUDIT (Status)

We are out for solicitation of bids for this year's audit. Due to time constraints, we have invited eight companies to bid with an anticipated opening later this month. We will be back with the returns, probably at the next meeting.

NEW BUSINESS / PROJECTED ISSUES & PROJECTS

✓ HOMETOWN DAYS PERMITS & APPROVALS (Resolution)

The Hometown Days Committee looks to hold the annual event on May 28th through June 2nd (Wednesday through Monday). The event is closely similar to last years. As of yet, all paperwork has not been completed, being insurance certificates, written permissions and final review by Rick for traffic control and other similar compliancy. I recommend approval with the stipulations. I'll get a full packet of the application and paperwork at the next meeting for Council review.

✓ REVISED FINAL SITE PLAN APPROVAL, CEDAR CREEK (Resolution)

Included with tonight's agenda is a revised final site plan approval for Cedar Creek. The Council heard the original site plan in December 2006. Adam has reviewed the matter and feels the changes with this submittal are for the better. The Planning Commission concurred and recommends approval. I have included the Planning Commission packet, Council Minute excerpts from December 2006 and draft minutes from the Planning Commission meeting of May 6th.

✓ PARK FEE WAIVER REQUEST, ELMS (Resolution)

We have a request for the waiver of fees associated with Elms Park for May 17th, Cub Scout pack 122. Two email requests are included with tonight's packet.

✓ APPOINTMENTS, BOARDS & COMMISSIONS (Resolution)

We have some housekeeping matters in terms of re-appointments. One Board of review, Two Planning Commission, Two Zoning Board of Appeals, Two Alternate Zoning Board of Appeals and Two DDA positions need filled. In conversation with the Mayor, he recommends continuing the terms of the incumbents. Resolutions to this effect are included with tonight's agenda.

✓ MILLER – SEYMOUR TRAFFIC SIGNAL (Information)

The County Signal Engineer inquired as to the City's position on the removal of the signal in front of the plaza at Miller & Seymour. We currently pay 25% of all the costs associated with the signal. The plaza pays 25% and the County pays 50% and the County collects all of the Act 51 distributions for the road. The signal is out-dated and needs either removal or upgrading. For the time being, the County has set the signal to flash. I am not interested in continuing to pay our match. I informed the County that we would not oppose its removal. They advise they will crunch the numbers and see how far it is from meeting the warrant criteria before deciding on how they wish to proceed. If Council has any comments, now would be the time to air them.

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WHEREAS, the City of Swartz Creek let for bid and awarded a contract to the low bidder, Lois Kay Contracting of Saginaw Michigan, for the saw-cit, peg and concrete flatwork of sections of Miller Road at I-69, in reference to City Resolution #071126-04; and

WHEREAS, the need for additional work east of this location to a point west of Dye Road has been identified by the City's staff and Engineer and discussed in open meetings of the City Council at the time that the bid was awarded to Lois Kay Contracting, such work consisting of the milling of several dozen lateral heaved asphalt "bumps" that presents hazards and poor ride quality to motorists; and

WHEREAS, the milling of such sections was not specified within the bid process awarded to Lois Kay Contracting, however, the contractor is capable of such work and

is on location with the proper and appropriate labor, equipment and traffic control devices to accomplish such a task and do so in an efficient and cost effective manner that would likely be less than specification and bid award to a company that would need to procure these items at additional expense; and

WHEREAS, the City's Engineer has reviewed the cost estimate of \$11,898 submitted by Lois Kay Contracting and states the pricing is competitive and recommends the City proceed with the work; and

DIVISION 1. GENERALLY

Secs. 2-381--2-400. Reserved.

DIVISION 2. PURCHASING DEFINITIONS

Sec. 2-401. Definitions.

As used in this article:

- (1) Purchasing agent or agent means the city manager.
- (2) Contract includes contracts for services, subject to the exclusions mentioned in this division, and shall include any type of service; lease for grounds, buildings, offices, or maintenance of equipment, machinery, and other city-owned personal property. The term "contract" shall not include professional and other contract services which may be unique and not subject to competition.

DIVISION 3. PURCHASING

Sec. 2-402. General purchasing policy.

- (a) It is the intent of this policy to provide for competitive pricing involved in all purchases and contracts, except as specifically provided for in this division. The purchasing agent shall prepare rules concerning purchasing for the city.
 - (1) Transactions less than \$5,000.00. The purchasing agent, subject to budgetary appropriations, is authorized to make purchases of materials and equipment and contract for labor or materials in an amount not to exceed \$5,000.00, without further approval of the city council.

Except for those situations requiring the need for sealed bids, the purchasing agent, shall consider all circumstances surrounding the purchase to be made or the service to be provided. If it is in the best interest of the city, the purchasing agent shall deal with sources within the city.

- a. *Quotations*. The purchasing agent shall secure or cause to be secured quotations from no less than two sources in all transactions involving expenditures of \$2,500.00 or more and less than \$5,000.00. The purchasing agent shall maintain a written record of the quotations received.
- b. *Other.* Transactions involving expenditures less than \$2,500.00 may be authorized by the purchasing agent in such manner and from such source as the purchasing agent may determine.

- (2) Transactions of \$5,000.00 or more. The purchasing agent shall secure sealed bids in all transactions involving an expenditure of \$5,000.00 or more.
 - a. Sealed bids shall not be required in the following instances:
 - 1. Where the subject of the purchase or contract is other than a public work or improvement and the product or material to be transacted for is not competitive in nature, provided that in no instance shall such product or material be transacted for without prior council approval.
 - 2. The city council may, at the request of the city manager, authorize the city manager to negotiate a contract for the purchase of any product, material or service with a provider of such product, material or service without regard to the requirements of this section relative to purchases where the city council finds:
 - i. Due to circumstances beyond the control of the city, the market for such product, material or service is not competitive even though such product, material or service is normally competitive in nature; and
 - ii. The economic interests of the city are best served by negotiating a contract with a provider of the product, material or service without requesting sealed bids.
 - 3. In the employment of professional services, provided that in no instance shall such professional service be contracted for without prior council approval.
 - 4. If the city elects to use city personnel.
- (b) Sealed bid requirements.
 - (1) Sealed bids shall be required by the purchasing agent by mailing a copy of the specifications or requirements to such qualified vendors as may be known to the purchasing agent or the agent's designee, and by filing a copy of the request with the office of the city clerk.
 - (2) Unless fixed by the council, the purchasing agent shall prescribe the amount of any security to be deposited with any bid and, in the case of construction contracts, the amounts of labor and materials or performance bond to be required of the successful bidder. Such security shall be in the form of a certified or cashier's check or bond written by a surety company authorized to do business in the state.
 - (3) Bids shall be opened in public at the time and place designated in the bid notice. Bids shall be opened by either the purchasing agent, the city clerk or their designee and at least one other city employee. Immediately following the opening, the bids shall be examined, tabulated, and made available for public inspection.
 - (4) The tabulation of the bids shall be submitted to the council at the next regular council meeting. The council in its discretion may accept the lowest bid, reject any or all bids, or determine the lowest bid to be unsatisfactory and award to the next lowest competent bidder. In determining the lowest bid, the council shall consider the bona fide business location of the bidder. If the lowest bidder is not located within the city limits, (and the lowest bid of the bidders located within the city limits does not exceed that of the otherwise lowest bidder by more than five percent), then the council may award the contract to such local bidder.
 - (5) If in the council's discretion, the award is not made to the lowest bidder, the resolution awarding the contract shall state the reasons for not accepting the low bid.

(6) After the opening of bids, such bids may not be withdrawn without forfeiture of the bid deposit. Deposits of security accompanying bids shall be retained until the contract is awarded and signed, excepting that deposits from bidders not awarded the contract within 72 hours following council action. If any successful bidder fails or refuses to enter into the contract awarded within ten days after being notified of such award, or should they file any bond required within the same time, the deposit accompanying their bid shall be forfeited to the city and the council may, in its discretion, award the contract to the next lowest competent bidder.

Sec. 2-403. Prohibitions.

- (a) No contract or purchase shall be subdivided to avoid the requirements of this division.
- (b) Employees of the city are expressly prohibited from accepting, directly or indirectly, from any person, business or organization any gift (including money, tangible or intangible personal property, food, beverage, loan, promise, service, or entertainment) for the benefit of personnel or the city, if it may reasonably be inferred that the person, business or organization:
 - (1) Seeks to influence action of an official nature or seeks to affect the performance or nonperformance of an official duty, or
 - (2) Has an interest that may be substantially affected directly or indirectly by the performance or nonperformance of an official duty.

Sec. 2-404. Inspection of material.

The responsibility for the inspection and acceptance of all materials, supplies, and equipment shall rest with the purchasing agent, unless such responsibility has been delegated to a department head.

Sec. 2-405. Emergency purchases.

If an emergency or an apparent emergency endangering the public peace, health and/or safety of the city should arise, and the delay of established purchasing procedures would vitally affect the welfare of the city, the purchasing agent, finance officer, or any department head may purchase directly any supplies, materials, or equipment that the department head deems to be immediately necessary. Within three working days from the time of purchase, the purchaser shall file in writing with the purchasing agent a detailed explanation of the necessity for any purchases, in addition to a request for such purchases. If the emergency transaction is \$5,000.00 or more, the purchasing agent shall submit the statement to the council no later than its next regular meeting before payment thereof may be authorized.

Sec. 2-406. Cooperative purchases.

The use of bulk purchasing programs such as the state's extended purchasing program and

joining together with area municipalities to secure bids or quotations for goods or services is encouraged. The use of any such source, which conducted a bona fide price competition, will be exempt from the requirements of this ordinance with respect to soliciting bids or quotes. Bids as above mentioned in section 2-402(a)(2) will be presented for council approval.

Sec. 2-407. Sale of property.



Greetings All,

We will be holding a regularly scheduled meeting this Tuesday, May 06, 2008 in the City Council Chambers, at 7:00pm. There is only one agenda item to discuss at this meeting and that is a second review of the Cedar Creek Condominium Planned Unit Development final site plan. Mr. Danny Nemer is seeking approval to construct the townhouses as illustrated in the attached site plan.

This final site plan is a substantial revision of the Cedar Creek project approved in the fall of 2006. As such, there is an existing conditional zoning approval still in place (RM-1 with a PUD overlay). Therefore, the project is not seeking a rezone at this time. Note that rezoning condition shall expire upon two years of its approval if a building permit is not approved for construction as approved on a valid site plan.

I am recommending approval of the final site plan considering the following notes and with the following conditions.

- ➤ The site plan meets all standard height, bulk, and use requirements of the zoning code for sections RM-1 and Planned Unit Development district that are not otherwise mentioned below.
- The townhomes are configured in blocks of five instead of six and were reduced from 24 to 15 units. Basically, the site is less dense, less congested, and more simplified. To that end, the need to include an onsite watermain is eliminated, setbacks are larger, and the location of leads and drainage is less problematic in relation to other conflicts. The detention pond location has also improved and now includes some underground storage.
- The configuration of the roadway concept has changed much. Instead of cul-desacs, the current internal circulation is proposed to be one-way, with onstreet parking at the front. Though I am uncomfortable with the one-way configuration (due solely to its novelty), I have been reassured by the City's traffic

engineer that the flow and widths shall be adequate for quality function. I am recommending a width of 22' for the portion of the drive that does not allow on-street parking; assuming adequate turning radii are maintained.

Concerning landscaping, the site plan proposes to substitute more durable, larger, and longer living vegetation for smaller, decorative vegetation. This will have the effect of placing more vegetation on the site that is lower maintenance and better for screening purposes. In most basic terms, the applicant wants to trade shrubs for trees. I think the proposal is suitable, and Planning Commission has the ability to allow for this tradeoff if they see fit. Ultimately, substantial screening must be provided to the rear and sides, and this is not provided with proposed plantings alone. Details on the amount of vegetation to be retained on the back and sides are unclear at this time and will not be available till the construction phase.

Summarily, the plan requires 84 tress with adequate spacing and 284 shrubs. The plan illustrates 103 trees without adequate spacing and ~76 shrubs. Approval of the site plan must be contingent upon the existing landscaping providing additional screening in the rear of the site and around the buildings and future condenser units.

- The building facades for this type of housing are to be constructed with durable materials (e.g. brick) as the 'predominant' material used. The elevations dated 3-26-2008 appear to meet this requirement. As always, the more surface area covered with a durable material, the better. Also, staff recommends use of a brown or red brick color and black shingles on the roof.
- > Street lighting is not illustrated in the current plan, however a lighting scheme was proposed in the previous final site plan. A decorative, effective lighting scheme should be provided in front of the townhomes that meets or exceeds the quality of the original site plan (2-4 lamps should suffice).
- ➤ The concept does not show details on the entrance signage for the development. Approval of this site plan must be contingent upon submission of a sign permit and subsequent approval of the signs in accordance with the zoning ordinance.
- Though on-site pedestrian facilities are provided, there are two issues that should be addressed. First, the applicant and/or its successors should be required to continue access to the western property line when/if development occurs to the west. This should be a requirement in the development agreement. Second, the sidewalk along the internal drive should be moved off of the curb by 4-5ft to allow for placement of snow and to provide a buffer for pedestrians.
- Utilities, drainage, grading, and other technical requirements have been approved by Rowe Engineering as evidenced in their final letter dated April

16, 2008. Note that final construction drawings shall have to be reviewed and approved by the City Engineer and Building Official before a building permit can be granted.

- ➤ The site plan has been reviewed and commented upon by the Swartz Creek Area Fire Chief. All comments have been addressed adequately by the applicant in my opinion.
- Note that the project, in accordance with applicable state law and local ordinance, is a condominium project and will also be required to submit a master deed, condominium association by-laws, a development/maintenance agreement to the city for review and approval prior to construction.

4) Turning templates indicate that school busses and garbage trucks may not be able maneuver through the Miller Road entrance. The developer's engineer should review the proposed site geometrics to assure that all possible vehicles that will be accessing the site can maneuver through the proposed approach. In addition, the revised layout should be reviewed by the fire chief for emergency vehicle access and maneuverability

Sheet 1 of 9: Site Plan

1) The existing contours and proposed contours are difficult to read. The proposed contours should be labeled and the existing contours should be darker to improve legibility on all applicable sheets.

Sheet 4 of 9: Grading Plan

- 1) It should be noted that many of the proposed points of vertical intersection (PVI) in the roadway have algebraic differences greater than one percent. According to AASHTO, vertical curves should be used for these PVI's. This issue can be addressed with the construction plan profile development.
- 2) It appears there may be proposed grading which extends beyond the southeast property corner of the site. The developer's engineer should verify if a proposed grading easement will be necessary for work in this area.

Sheet 5 of 9: Utility Plan

- 1) Many of the proposed structure rim elevations indicate an elevation of "XXXX". The site plan should be revised to include all the proposed rim elevations.
- 2) The proposed connection to the existing sanitary sewer should reference GCDC-WWS standard details SD-10 and state the proposed method of connecting to the existing sewer. GCDC-WWS standard detail SD-8 should also be referenced for the proposed drop connection.
- 3) The proposed detention area has a proposed highwater elevation of 807.6 and a proposed one foot freeboard elevation of 808.6. The freeboard elevation should be based on the storm water volume that can be maintained within the detention pond. Several of the proposed catch basins have proposed rim elevations lower than 808.6 which means that storm water would surcharge out of the catch basins before the proposed freeboard elevation is reached in the detention pond.
- 4) Ten state standards maximum spacing between manholes for sewer less than 15-inch is four hundred (400) feet. The proposed maximum manhole spacing exceeds ten state standards.
- 5) It doesn't appear that a four foot diameter manhole will be large enough for storm structure number nine; the developer's engineer should review the manhole sizing.
- 6) It doesn't appear that there is sufficient room to construct the proposed sanitary sewer along the easterly property line without affecting the adjacent property owner. The proposed sanitary sewer should be a minimum distance of 10 feet off the property line to allow sufficient room for maintenance and construction.

Sheet 7 of 9: Storm Sewer Details

- 1) The proposed sanitary lead clean-out detail is not needed since the standard GCDC-WWS detail SD-3: Riser and Service Lead is provided and needs to be used.
- 2) The developer's engineer should consider revising the "trench details" title to "storm sewer trench details" for clarification. GCDC-WWS standard sanitary sewer and pressure pipe trench details need to be used for the proposed sanitary sewer and water main construction.

Storm Water Detention Calculations

OFFICES: FLINT LAPEER MT. PLEASANT 1) The required storage volume was determined using an allowable discharge rate of 0.97 cfs based on a 2-year storm event for an undeveloped site condition. The City requires Genesee County Drain Commissioner's Office – Surface Water Management (GCDC-SWM) standards be met for storm water detention. GCDC-SWM typically holds a maximum restricted outlet rate of 0.2 cfs/acre which would yield a restricted outlet rate of 0.56 cfs. It appears that there may not be sufficient detention volume provided to meet GCDC-SWM standards.

SUBSIDIARIES: AIR-LAND SURVEYS FLINT, MI 2) There appears to be some discrepancies on the Open Detention Pond Volume Area calculation sheet. The total pond volume is stated at 8,993 cubic feet and the pond high water elevation is stated at 807.00. It appears that the proposed high water elevation is 807.6 and the volume provided is 13,663 cubic feet. The plans and calculations should be reviewed for consistency.

3) The Proposed Standpipe Calculations indicate that two (2) 1" holes are proposed in the standpipe where the plans indicate that six (6) 0.5" holes are proposed. The plans and calculations should be reviewed for consistency.

- 4) Restrictor pipe calculations should be included with the detention calculations to show that the proposed 6" restrictor pipe will restrict the flow from the detention area to the allowable discharge rate.
- 5) It appears that underground detention is proposed along the south property line. It could not be determined where the underground detention volume is accounted for in the detention volume calculations.
- 6) Storm sewer capacity calculations were note provided for review. It can not be determined if the proposed storm sewer was sufficiently designed per GCDC-SWM standards at this time. This can be reviewed during construction plan development.

General

- The Miller Road entrance was revised to provide better maneuverability for larger vehicles. Turning templates show that a garbage truck will be able to adequately maneuver through the proposed entrance. Turning templates also show that a school bus will not be able to maneuver through the proposed entrance without riding on the proposed curb.
- The site plan should show the proposed easements and easement widths for the proposed public sanitary sewer and watermain.
- 3) According to the City of Swartz Creek Design Standards and Construction Specifications, detention basins shall become publicly owned with an agreement with the property owner that the property owner shall maintain the detention basin at the property owner's cost. An agreement should be made with the developer and the site plan should note this and show the proposed public easement around the detention area and detention area outlet.
- 4) We recommend that cast in place or grouted detectable warning strips be provided on the ADA sidewalk ramps.

Sheet 1 of 9: Site Plan

- The detention pond proposed high water elevation is stated at 807.6 where sheets 4 and 5 of the site plan state the proposed high water elevation at 807.0. The plans and calculations should be reviewed for consistency.
- 2) The proposed underground detention system should be shown on the site plan.
- 3) Has the revised site plan layout been submitted to the Genesee County Drain Commissioner's Office for review? A plan submittal log on the cover sheet would be helpful to determine if and when the plans have been reviewed by the appropriate agencies.



Here are our comments regarding access and circulation.

- 1. Valid concern by Rowe turning templates indicate that the current entrance design will not provide adequate ingress or egress for standard fire truck vehicles (length/design of such vehicles vary). Assuming the island will stay to help direct the one-way flow, the internal driveway radii on each side will need to be enlarged (with a possible loss of one parallel parking space on each side). The need for directional signage on the island appears to preclude the use of rolled curb on the island as a potential option for a wider truck path.
- 2. The signpost on that entry island facing Miller Road should also include a Keep Right sign. The need for the second sign/post on that island (facing east) is not clear and would not appear offhand to serve a viable function (as an internal WB driver is allowed to go straight or turn right).
- 3. The 30-foot wide drive along the front of the buildings is okay (22 feet for driving, 8 feet for parking) but still a little wide. The 25-foot width along the remaining 3 sides is significantly more than is needed for a one-way operation and will likely promote additional onstreet parking and potential two-way use. Although that width may be okay in the corners (for fire/truck turning), it should be narrowed to 18-20 feet along other areas, especially the long southern east/west section.
- 4. To further define the one-way operation, the city may want to consider requiring Do Not Enter/Wrong Way signs on both sides of the "street" at two locations; just east of the island (facing west), and at the southwest corner of the site (facing east).
- 5. Pavement markings on the driveway will be needed; a yellow line to define the two directions of the entry drive, and a stop bar (with sign) on the exit lane located at the appropriate location.

Typically it is (or should be) required that site plans show where other existing/planned driveways are located adjacent to the site and on the opposite side of the street. That way we can provide additional input to the city regarding the appropriateness of the proposed driveway location (to note improper spacing or poor offsets that can affect

safety). I don't recall that there are any driveways currently on the north side of Miller in this area, but that may be an issue (individual single family driveways are not a problem).

- \cdot $\,$ In the front, I would just reduce that from 30 feet to 28 feet.
- I don't want to do the engineering for the applicant, but it appears that a 30-foot radius on the inside radii (radii to Miller are already shown at 30 feet) would work instead of the 20-foot radii, and the island should also be located about 5 feet further south (okay to narrow-up the WB "thru" lane).
- Other than the markings I noted earlier, the driveway design (accel/decel tapers) appear okay to me as long as they meet any standards that the city may have created.

The size, determined by the city, should be at least 6". I would prefer 8", but will accept 6", since the main on Miller road is 12" and not very far from the structures.
- 2. If the entrance triangle is removed, 1 hydrant can be substituted for 2 and be located in front of the center building. By removing the triangle, a fire truck can tap into the hydrant and go either direction around the development, and at the same time, keep free the opposite direction for additional fire apparatus.
- 3. If the triangle remains, 2 hydrants will be required and positioned between the buildings on the street edge.
- 4. Because of the potential for difficult apparatus access, it not recommended that the access drive to the east were used. It is preferred the current entry plan proposed be utilized.
- 5. The size of the road around the complex should be sufficient for apparatus to pass in the event a disabled vehicle were in the way. If the were road were to include a modified curb system, that would still allow for passage by 2 vehicles, that would acceptable, provided the specifications are acceptable to Swartz Creek.


My review of the Cedar Creek development on Wednesday, March 12, as resulted in the following conclusion:

WHEREAS, the Developer has proposed to develop a commercial retail development in a Planned Unit Development in two phases ("Project") upon certain vacant property located within the City, legally described in attached Exhibit A ("Property"); and

WHEREAS, the Property is part of an area for which the City has adopted a Conceptual Site Plan for a Planned Unit Development District pursuant to Article XI of the City's zoning ordinance, which Planned Unit Development District is known as the North Morrish Road Planned Unit Development, dated August 14, 2006, and is more fully described in attached Exhibit B; and

WHEREAS, the Developer has secured all of the zoning approvals and other approvals required by law for its plans to develop the Project on the Property, including, without limitation, site plan, special land use, planned unit development or other approvals; and

WHEREAS, said approvals of the City are conditioned, in whole or in part, upon various agreements of and commitments made by the Developer in connection with the plans for the development of the Project; and

WHEREAS, the City and the Developer wish to set forth in this agreement all of the duties and responsibilities of both parties in connection with the Project, as well as the remedies for failure of a party to comply with said duties and/or responsibilities.

NOW, THEREFORE, the City and the Developer, acting by and through their duly authorized representatives, hereby **AGREE AS FOLLOWS**:

1. Definitions.

May 1, 2008

- A) "City" means the City of Swartz Creek, a Michigan Municipal Corporation with principal offices at 8083 Civic Drive, Swartz Creek, Michigan 48473.
- B) "Developer" means Meijer, Inc., a Michigan Corporation, with principal offices at 2929 Walker Avenue NW, Grand Rapids, Michigan 49544.
- C) "Project" means the development in two phases of a commercial retail development in a Planned Unit Development on the Property as set forth and as described in the Project Plans, as approved by the Swartz Creek City Council on August 14, 2006.
- D) "Project Plans" means the site plan, surveys, other drawings and any other written or graphic documentation submitted by the Developer to the City and which were the basis for the zoning and other approvals given by the City for the Project and which were approved by the City, together with the conditions upon which any City approval was based. Said plans, surveys, drawings, written or graphic documentation and conditions are attached hereto as Exhibit C.
- E) "Property" means that certain property within the City which is legally described in Exhibit A attached hereto.
- F) "Public Improvements" mean public streets, alleys, sidewalks, trails, sanitary sewer lines, municipal water lines, storm sewers and drainage facilities, street lighting, public recreational facilities, parkland and all easements and rights of way associated therewith.

2. The Project.

The Project consists of the development in two phase of a Meijer's retail store, gas station and unrelated commercial businesses on the Property in accordance with and as provided for in the Project Plans and will consist of the following private and public improvements:

A) Private Improvements.

The following private improvements will be constructed by the Developer:

- a) a super market store of approximately 207,000 square feet;
- b) a gas station and convenience store:
- c) a storm water detention facility;
- d) parking and loading facilities;
- e) landscaping;
- f) signage (internal circulation and identification);
- g) two (2) service roads;
- h) lighting facilities;
- i) pedestrian access facilities.

May 1, 2008

All such private improvements shall be constructed in compliance with the Project Plans, all ordinances and construction standards of the City and other requirements of law.

B) Public Improvements.

The following public improvements will be constructed by the City and will be paid for, in

advance of construction, by the Developer:

- A. Road improvements to Morrish Road, including, but not limited to, curbs, curb cuts, lane widening, repaving, signals, signage, pedestrian access, lighting, drainage and ditching with cost distribution and construction in accordance with Appendix A attached hereto.
- b) The developer shall deposit a sum equal to one-million, five-hundred thousand dollars (\$1,500,000.00) with the City, said funds to be used for construction of the improvements as described above.

3. Conditions and Acknowledgments.

Site plan approval for the Project, as a part of the North Morrish Road Planned Unit Development, is subject to the following conditions and acknowledgments:

- A) The Site shall be developed solely in the manner set forth in the approved PUD Site Plan dated August 14, 2006 and submitted by the Developer to the City as said Plan has been modified by the action of the City of Swartz Creek Planning Commission and the City of Swartz Creek City Council. The Developer shall not engage in, participate in, or assist in any activity to develop the Site in any manner different from, or contrary to, that described in the approved Final PUD Site Plan unless appropriate changes are approved by the city administration or City Council in accordance with the procedures set forth in the City's Zoning Ordinance.
- B) The Site and the Project, with the modifications and waivers approved and/or established by the Planning Commission and the City Council, meet the standards of Section XI (PUD standards) and all other relevant sections of the zoning ordinance of the City of Swartz Creek.
- C) The Final Site Plan for the Property and the Project, as approved with modifications, is deemed to be consistent with the existing Design Guidelines for the North Morrish Road Planned Unit Development Concept Plan, and, except as otherwise provided in the Final Site Plan for the Property and the Project, the Property shall at all times be subject to said Design Guidelines as presently established. Any future changes or additions to the Property and any future Site Plan shall comply with said Design Guidelines as may be in effect at the time of said future change or addition.

- D) As a condition of receiving driveway (curb cut) permits for access to Morrish Road, the Developer agrees to pay for public improvements to Morrish Road as described in 2.B. above at a time, in the manner, and by such party as the City shall decide. [We need to decide how we wish to proceed on the road... who designs, constructs, funds, etc]
- E) Any time the City determines that an intersection created by any driveway access to and from the site to Morrish Road meets the warrants for a signalized intersection under the Uniform Manual for Traffic Control Devices, the City shall present the Developer with the plans and costs for the design, purchase, and installation of a traffic signal at such intersection for the Developer's review. If the cost of such design, purchase and installation are commercially reasonable, the Developer shall pay for 100% of the costs of the design, purchase and installation. Such determination by the City need not be concurrent with the traffic study paid for by the Developer.
- F) If, between the time of execution of this agreement and the time the City decides the intersection created by the project's driveway access to and from Morrish Road meets the warrants for an additional signalized intersection under the Uniform Manual of Traffic Control Devices, another development within the North Morrish Road Planned Unit Development is presented to the City for zoning approval, the City shall, to the extent permitted by law, require, as a condition of such zoning approval, such development to share in the cost of the design, purchase and installation of said traffic signal on a pro-rata basis with the Developer. Cost sharing will be determined based on the ratio of each project's gross square footage of land divided by 4,039,546 square feet.
- G) To the extent permitted by law, the City shall require, as a condition of the site plan approval for any project in the North Morrish Road Planned Unit Development presented to it for zoning and/or site plan approval after the installation of said public improvements as described in section 2.B. above, or after installation of said traffic signal, the developer of such project to reimburse the Developer and any other party providing funds for said traffic signal under subsection 6, above, of a proportional share of the cost paid by the Developer or such other party for said traffic signal. Cost sharing will be determined based on the ratio of each project's gross square footage of land divided by 4,039,546 square feet.
- H) The City will use its best efforts to obtain pro-rata reimbursement for the costs of public improvements as described in section 2.B. above, and of any traffic signal construction costs incurred by the Developer; however, it is mutually agreed that under no circumstances will the City be responsible to reimburse the Developer for any cost associated with the design, purchase and installation of the traffic signal, including legal or collection expenses. [Are there other public improvements...?] Specifically,

the City's failure or inability to place a reimbursement condition on any site plan approval or the failure of any entity to reimburse the Developer for their proportional share of the signalization expense shall not be cause to seek redress from the City.

- I) The Developer further agrees to cooperate with the City in the placement and construction of any and all public improvements, including any traffic signals as may be required, including a grant of any temporary or permanent easements necessary for its construction.
- J) The Developer shall insure that clear, unfettered vehicular and pedestrian access for the public exists into, from and across all internal drives, roadways and parking areas of the Project in order to connect the Project to other developments in the North Morrish Road Planned Unit Development. To that end, as a condition precedent to the final approval of the Site Plan for the Project, the Developer shall provide the City with such easements on or over the Site as shall be reasonably necessary for such purposes.

4. Time for Performance.

The Developer shall not commence work on the Project until all approvals of the City and any other governmental or regulatory agency required for the Project have been obtained and no work on the construction of any structure shall begin until a building permit therefor has been issued. The Developer shall pay a penalty equal to the amount of the building permit for work on any structure begun prior to issuance of a building permit by the City. This does not preempt the City from taking other appropriate actions in response to such, or any other, violation of City ordinances.

As the Project is to be constructed in phases, the Developer shall complete construction of each phase by the following dates:

5. Survey(s).

The Developer shall provide to the City a survey prepared and certified by a registered land surveyor clearly designating the boundaries of the Property. Such survey shall be supplied to the City prior to the commencement of any construction work on the Project.

In addition, where lots or condominium sites are created as part of the Project,

the Developer shall provide to the City a survey prepared and certified by a registered land surveyor clearly designating the boundaries of each lot or condominium site so created. Such surveys shall be supplied to the City prior to the issuance of a building permit for the construction of a structure on such lot or condominium site.

6. Permits, Approvals and Variance.

The following permits, approvals and variances of the City and any other governmental or regulatory agency have been issued:

- A. City approval for rezoning of the Property;
- B. Special Land Use Permits;
- C. Approval of Planned Unit Development Agreement; and
- D. Preliminary and Final Site Plan Approval.

The Developer shall not commence work on the Project, and no building permit shall be issued in connection therewith, until the following approvals and variances of the City and any other governmental or regulatory agency have been obtained or recording requirements have been met:

- A. Approval of the Project Plans by the City Engineer;
- B. All easements and dedications required for the Project are obtained and recorded;
- C. Issuance of a grading permit by the City, if required;
- D. Certification by the City Engineer that the public improvements required for commencement of the Project are substantially complete and all road rights-of-way, easements and other public dedications are recorded.
- E. If the Project includes a platted subdivision, approval of the plat by all required approving authorities and recordation of the plat with the Genesee County Register of Deeds:
- F. If the Project includes a condominium, approval of the master deed and all condominium documents by the State of Michigan as may be required by law and recordation of the master deed with the Genesee County Register of Deeds.

7. Development Activities.

A) Inspection and approval of work on public improvements by City Engineer.

All work on public improvements is subject to inspection and approval by the City Engineer, or his/her representative. The City reserves the right to reject any materials or supplies not meeting the City's standards, and the City may require the removal and replacement, at no expense to the City, of any public improvement which fails to comply with established standards and specifications of the City, which fails to comply with the Project plans, or which was constructed without inspection by the City

Engineer or his/her representative.

B) Street work and signage.

If the Project includes the construction or modification of any public street or private road, or otherwise requires the addition or alteration of any street signage, the City Engineer will prepare a signage plan for the Project, and the City will provide and erect the necessary signage. The Developer shall pay for the cost of said signage including the cost of the installation thereof, plus 10% for the City Engineer's time in preparing the plan. The Developer agrees to install signage consistent with the design standards that are established by the Swartz Creek Downtown Development Authority at the time of construction.

C) Street lighting.

The Developer, at its sole expense, shall provide street lighting, as needed, in accordance with a plan prepared by the Developer and approved by the City Engineer. The Developer agrees to install lighting consistent with the design standards that are established by the Swartz Creek Downtown Development Authority at the time of construction.

D) Erosion control.

The Developer will provide for erosion control as required and shall obtain any permits therefor required by any governmental or other regulatory agency.

E) Dust control.

The Developer will provide dust control on the Property as necessary through the application of water, dust control chemicals, mulch, or other method approved by the City Engineer.

F) Maintenance of public improvements.

With the exception of Morrish Road, the Developer will remain responsible for the maintenance and operation of all public improvements constructed as part of the development until they are accepted by the City Council. This includes snow plowing of streets.

G) Maintenance of off-site public streets, sidewalks or rights-of-way.

The Developer shall conduct all of its activities in connection with the construction of the Project so as not to cause sand, gravel, dirt, clay, mud or construction materials of any kind to be deposited on any public street, sidewalk or right-of-way. The Developer shall remove any sand, gravel, dirt, clay, mud or construction materials of any kind which it may have caused to be deposited on any public street, sidewalk or right-of-way. If the developer fails to do so within 24 hours,

the City may remove such sand, gravel, dirt, clay, mud or construction materials and the Developer shall pay the cost incurred by the City in doing so.

H) Environmental safety.

The Developer shall conduct all of its activities in connection with the construction of the Project so as not to cause any environmental contamination and shall comply with all environmental requirements of local, state and federal law. The Developer shall be responsible to and shall reimburse the City for any costs incurred by it in the cleanup and remediation of any environmental contamination caused by the Developer's activities in connection with the construction of the Project.

I) Public safety.

The Developer, whether on or off the Project Site, shall conduct all construction covered by this Agreement in a safe manner so as not to cause any threat to the health and safety of the public.

J) Worker Safety.

The Developer shall conduct all of its activities in connection with the construction of the Project in compliance with OSHA, MIOSHA and any other laws or regulations intended to provide for worker safety.

K) Toilet facilities.

The Developer will provide on-site toilet facilities as required by law for use by workers for the duration of the Project.

8. Ongoing Maintenance.

Whenever this agreement or the Project Plans impose a duty or obligation upon the Developer for the maintenance of any improvement on public property, or where this Agreement, the Project Plans, deed covenants, or other document provides for the maintenance and preservation of areas or facilities open to the public but which are not dedicated to and accepted by the City for public use, the Developer shall be responsible for the ongoing maintenance of such improvement, area or facility and shall cause any transferee of the Developer's interest in the Project or the Property to assume said obligation.

9. Construction of public improvements; guarantee; warranty.

If the Developer is to construct any public improvements in connection with the development of the Project, it shall provide the City with an irrevocable letter of credit in an amount not less than 125% of the expected cost of the public improvements being constructed by the Developer. The Developer shall also warrant the public improvements so constructed for a period of one year from the date of acceptance of same by the City

and shall, at its sole expense, repair or replace, at the City's sole discretion, any public improvements which fail during the one-year period following its acceptance by the City Council. The escrow may be reduced as the City accepts the public improvements, by the value of the work accepted, but the additional 25% shall remain in effect for the duration of the one-year warranty period.

10. Construction of public improvements; indemnification; insurance.

The Developer agrees to indemnify and hold the City harmless for any liability, including court costs and attorneys' fees, for damages to property or persons resulting from the Developer's construction of the public improvements. To that end, the Developer shall maintain in full force and effect a policy of public liability insurance in such amounts as is required by the City for public construction contracts and shall list the City as an additional insured party under said policy or policies. The Developer shall provide the City with written evidence of such policy or policies and that the City is named as an insured thereunder. If any such liability policy provides coverage on a "claims made" basis, such coverage shall be maintained in effect for three years after any work on the Project is completed.

11. Escrow fund.

The Developer shall deposit with the City a sum, the amount of which is to be determined by the City, which shall be sufficient to establish an escrow fund which, upon investment by the City, will generate a sum each year sufficient to cover the City's expenses in administering this agreement, including the cost of any inspections.

In connection with the development of the Project, the City shall do the following:

13. Default.

If the Developer is in default of any of the terms of this agreement or the Project Plans, the City may issue a stop work order to the Developer and, upon receipt thereof, the Developer shall immediately stop all work on the Project. In addition, the City may exercise any other remedy it may have under law or equity for the Developer's default.

14. Gender.

Use of the words "it" or "its" when referring to the developer is for convenience only and shall have the same meaning as "he," "she," "his" or "her" if the Developer is a person.

15. "Developer" is all inclusive.

Whenever a duty or obligation is imposed upon the Developer by this agreement or the Project Plans, or the Developer is prohibited from taking any action under this agreement or the Project Plans, such duty, obligation or prohibition shall equally apply to any contractor, subcontractor, officer, agent, employee, assignee or successor in interest or any other person or entity performing activities on the project under the direction and control of, at the request of, under contract with, or in succession of the Developer.

16. Notices.

Any notice, demand, or communication required, permitted, or desired to be given under this agreement shall be deemed effectively given when personally delivered or mailed by certified mail addressed as follows:

The parties hereto may, by notice given hereunder, designate any further or different address to which subsequent notices, demands, or communications may be given.

17. Term.

This agreement shall commence on the __ day of _______, 2008 and the agreement and any and all City permits and approvals shall be renewable in one year increments beginning August 14, 2008 for a period of three (3) years. After three years, the agreement and all City permits and approvals associated with the Project shall permanently expire unless Developer has begun construction of the Project. The agreement shall also terminate upon completion of the Project, with the exception of the ongoing maintenance obligations of sections 7 and 8, which obligations shall continue in effect for the life of the public and private improvements, common areas or shared use facilities provided for therein, and the warranty obligations of section 8, which shall continue in effect for the warranty period provided for therein.

18. Applicable law.

13. DESCRIPTION OF PROJECT (Briefly Describe The Problems And The Procedures To Be implemented)

The agencies listed above have established a six person cooperative law enforcement unit, with the necessary support staff to process and investigate complaints, involving stolen automobiles and the marketing of stolen vehicle parts. The City of Flint and other Genesee County jurisdictions along the 1-75 corridor currently is in need of additional auto theft enforcement. The unit is governed by a Board of Directors (local elected officials) and an Operation Board (local police chiefs).

There is a marked increase in identity thefts being used to obtain vehicles illegally in Genesee County. These crimes involve Computer usage and Out of State financing. Officers are spending an increasing amount of time tracking fraudulent deals requiring an increased amount of knowledge in Computer, Internet and Financial institution Transaction tracking.

Special Hi-Tech training is being sought to aid the Officers in this area of expertise to reduce man hours involved.

There has been a marked increase in insurance fraud due to economic conditions of the area, including arsons and VIN switching to disguise the identity of leased vehicles. Investigation of these has also increased man hours investigating this type of complaint.

The six Gain officers are working with the other Genesee County agencies, and have established working relationships with them and other auto theft units throughout the State and Out of State. This type of cooperation is necessary to combat a mobile crime, such as auto theft.

In order to continue to reduce theft rates, and the subsequent loss of money to the insurance companies and the general public, it is absolutely necessary to have a specialized unit of experienced auto theft investigators, such as GAIN. The GAIN Auto Theft Unit, since it's history has and continues to be effective in combating Auto Theft in Genesee County.



Dear Friends,

Welcome to my e-newsletter. This month I introduced two important pieces of legislation that I would like to share with you.

The first bill I introduced will make it easier for school districts to purchase food from local farmers for school lunch programs. <u>HB 5967</u> will streamline the bidding process for school food administrators by increasing the schools' small purchase threshold (SPT) for food procurement to \$100,000, up from the current limit of \$19,650.

Michigan's current SPT has proven a barrier for school food authorities who want to increase fresh and local food because food purchases over the SPT require lengthy and complicated bidding procedures. This farm to school effort will not only provide children more opportunities to eat and learn about nutritious foods, but it will expand market opportunities for Michigan farmers and keep more dollars in our state.

The second bill I introduced, <u>HB 5953</u>, is one of a pair of bills that will strengthen Michigan's identity theft laws by providing law enforcement with new tools for pursuing identity thieves. The bills will expand Michigan's racketeering statute to include identity theft and computer crime, and will create a forfeiture statute for identity theft using the same model currently in place for narcotics trafficking.

Identity theft is a complex crime most often involving several individuals. By adding identity theft to Michigan's racketeering statute, we empower law enforcement to pursue the entire organization behind these crimes, rather than only picking off the low-hanging fruit.

Please mark your calendar! On Friday, May 9, I will be holding my first of four Walks and Talks – an active approach to office hours. Come walk with me and talk about important issues that face our state and community.

The event will begin *inside* the Genesee Valley Mall at the Macy's entrance, located at 4600 Miller Road, Flint Township. Please meet promptly at 9:00 a.m. and we will walk until 10:00 a.m. The event is free and families are encouraged to attend.

Also, on Saturday, May 17, there will be a Household Hazardous Waste Collection Day from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m.

- Things you should bring are aerosol cans, batteries, corrosives, household pesticides, herbicides, mercury, motor oil, oil-based paint, old prescriptions, paint thinners, solvents and tires (you may bring up to seven tires off the rim; tractor and semi tires will not be accepted).
- Things you *should not* bring are commercial waste, explosive material, industrial waste, latex paint, medical waste and radioactive material.

Senate Commerce Committee voted last week on HBs 5539-42, which provide a process for locals to capture revenue that they lost when the Michigan Business Tax exempted personal property taxes. The bills are still expected to see some additional amendments on the floor of the Senate. It looks like the bills will not be passed on the Senate floor until next week; therefore, members will have a very short period of time to prepare their data for submission to Treasury by June 1. Downtown Legislation Hearings Continue –

The Senate Commerce Committee last week took testimony on two more bills in the Downtown Package: SBs 975 (Kahn, R-Saginaw) and 976 (Gilbert, R-Algonac) amend the Neighborhood Enterprise Zone Act to allow its use parcel-by-parcel instead of area wide in downtowns for apartments and other residential structures. The bills would also allow the Act being used to renovate or build hotels to attract visitors to downtown areas. The League testified in support, with a few minor recommended changes. Housing and Community Development Fund

Bills Move – The House last week passed HBs 4657 and 4658 (Tobocman, D-Detroit), which would add downtown improvements to uses of the Housing and Community Development Fund. The Senate Economic Development Committee also passed SB 1273 (Olshove, D-Warren), which makes similar changes to the Fund and would change the Michigan State Housing Development Authority to the Michigan Community and Housing Development Authority. Casinos are killing state's race track industry, lawsuit alleges

DETROIT -- Northville Downs and other Michigan horse racing interests filed a federal lawsuit Thursday against the governor and state attorney general, alleging state lotteries and casinos are killing their industry and state restrictions on installing video lottery terminals and other forms of gambling at Michigan horse tracks violate the U.S. Constitution.

Betting on horse racing plunged 45 percent from \$474.6 million in 1997, before three Detroit casinos opened, to about \$261 million last year, the lawsuit alleges.

It cites the 2005 closure of a harness racing track in Saginaw, the 2007 closure of Great Lakes Downs, the state's last thoroughbred track, and Magna Entertainment Corp.'s recent decision to abandon plans for a new thoroughbred track in Romulus as evidence of an industry in a death spiral.

"Without legislative relief, you will see the end of horse racing in Michigan within three years," said attorney Phillip Maxwell of Oxford, who represents the plaintiffs along with attorney Edward Drugalis of Clawson. "It's very serious."

Targeted in the lawsuit is an amendment to Michigan's Constitution passed as a result of a 2004 ballot initiative which the horse racing interests allege was largely financed by the state's casinos.

The state provision requires both a statewide and a local referendum before any new gambling can occur. Exempted from the provision are the casinos.

The law prevents tracks such as Northville Downs from installing VLTs and benefiting from innovations such as telephone wagering and theater wagering at restaurants, the lawsuit alleges.

Because the state constitutional amendment essentially protects the casinos, it violates the equal protection, due process and commerce clauses of the U.S. Constitution, Maxwell said. He wants the court to declare the provision invalid.

Spokespersons for Gov. Jennifer Granholm and Atty. Gen. Mike Cox had no immediate

comment.

Although Magna in 2007 abandoned its plans for a track in Romulus, plans are proceeding for a new Pinnacle Race Course thoroughbred track in Huron Township, near Detroit Metropolitan Airport.

Maxwell said getting a statewide ballot initiative passed is too difficult in the face of well-financed opposition from the casinos.

Still, Hazel Park has not joined the lawsuit because its owners are planning to attempt a ballot initiative, he said.

The other plaintiffs are Mount Pleasant Meadows and the Great Lakes Quarterhorse Association, which represents horsemen at Mount Pleasant.

The case is assigned to U.S. District Judge Avern Cohn.
