OLD / ROUTINE BUSINESS – REVISITED ISSUES / PROJECTS

✓ COUNCIL ORGANIZATIONAL ACTIVITIES, INVESTMENT POLICY (*Resolutions*)

There is several election year business issues scheduled for tonight's meeting. A hearty welcome back to Mayor Abrams who re-joins us. Betty Binder and David Krueger are at-large Councilmembers' elect. Congratulations and welcome to City Government. I will spend some time with both and try to bring them up to speed on current issues. Included with tonight's agenda is the usual housekeeping items associated with elections.

✓ BOARDS & COMMISSIONS (*Resolutions*)

For the most part, election year Boards & Commissions appointments can wait until the meeting of November 24th. This will give the Council more time for consideration. As the Council is aware, we will be selecting a Mayor tonight, which may influence some of these appointments. The extra two weeks will allow some time for consideration between the Mayoral selection and appointments or Mayoral appointment confirmations. We have one board appointment that cannot wait, being the Fire Board. They meet on November 17th, necessitating a move tonight. There are three positions that need appointing, the two citizen representatives, held by Boots Abrams and Rick Clolinger, and the Council Representative, held by outbound Mayor Pro-Tem Christie. Based on time constraints and uncertainty in the Mayoral election, I took the liberty to meet with Mayor Abrams to discuss the matter and suggest a recommendation. We arrived at the choices as stated in the resolution.

✓ PERSONNEL POLICIES & PROCEDURES (Status)

The staff continues to meet with Mr. Nottley and will be back with a final draft shortly.

- DISASTER, EMERGENCY RESPONSE POLICY COMMITTEE (Status)
 We should be back before the Council for discussion on this in the near future.
- VETERANS MEMORIAL (Status) Nothing New.

✓ NON-RESIDENT SERVICES STUDY, RAUBINGER BRIDGE (Status)

The Road Commission tells me the Raubinger Bridge Project has a tentative start date of July 2009. The three-lane conversion of Miller between the two Seymour's has been completed. The results are a big improvement.

✓ OVERHEAD UTILITY REORGANIZATION PROJECT (Status)

As we discussed, the utility companies have lobbied the passing of a number of pieces of legislation that have stripped us of virtually all control of our rights of way. In regards

to the aesthetics, we have little power other than to pay for changes. The next step is to get a contractor's quote for the second round of the technical review of the poles. From here, we may have some power by filing complaints on the safety issues. REI is getting a quote together from their survey division and should be back with it shortly. My thinking is to narrow down the inventory to the downtown, Miller & Elms and Bristol Road. This will hold the cost down and we can always go back and pick up additional sections of the City.

✓ MAJOR STREET FUND, TRAFFIC IMPROVEMENTS (See Individual Category)

BRISTOL ROAD T.I.P. PROJECT, VERIZON INVOICE (Status)

As of yet, no check from Verizon.

THREE LANE CONVERSION, STRIPING (Status)
 Under study. We will be back with some recommendations later in the fall or winter.

ELMS ROAD RE-SURFACING PROJECT (Status) Our match for this project is \$294,477. We have some minor clean-up issues yet to be completed before this project is closed. The County has budgeted \$21,000 for their half of the 1,300' border section and have given us a verbal approval for participation.

MORRISH ROAD RE-CONSTRUCTION PROJECT / MEIJER'S (Status)

As we discussed at the last meeting, we are looking at our options to clean up the utility mess we have along thus section. Given the plans we have for this area and the work we've put into it, it seems ridicules to allow the overhead mess to remain, and then build on it. We met with engineers from Meijer's, Consumers, Comcast, WWS, and the Road Commission regarding utilities and roads. (It is hard to believe, but Verizon did not show up). Consumer's is against the underground relocation of the service lines. They estimate their cost for this would be around \$1,000,000. They will work with us in placing the service on the west side, poles evenly spaced apart (300'), straight and high up overhead. They advise that it is not feasible to push the service to the backside of the properties as service to the existing customers and land acquisition would be costly, if not impossible. The \$1,000,000 seems outrageous to me. I may be all wrong on this, but it seems very strange that we can build an entire road with curb, gutter, engineered storm drains, traffic signals, lighting, sidewalks and a bazillion yards of fill dirt (for the access off of the I-69 ramp), for something close to this number. Consumers also tells me that they do not use conduit for underground electrical service. They bury a single heavy gauge wire down about four feet. I am working to get a direct cost quote to check this price, as a starting point. I am also beginning the letter writing campaign to force Verizon to deal with this. We may have to consider litigation as a means of resolve for this project.

GM-SPO ISLAND CUTS (Status)

This project remains in the 2009 TIP. We are still evaluation the cost vs. benefit ratio. MILLER ROAD REPAIRS (Status)

We are exploring options for preventative maintenance as opposed to waiting until a reconstruction is warranted.

✓ LOCAL STREET FUND, TRAFFIC IMPROVEMENTS

2008 REPAIR ROSTER (Status)

Bid results for Chesterfield from Seymour to Winston, Jennie Lane, Worchester from Winston to Daval and Daval from Oakview to Winshall are \$398,154. We have placed all local street re-surfacing on hold for a bit while we explore funding options.

- TRANSPORTATION ASSET MANAGEMENT EVALUATION (Status) Pending report.
- SEWER REHABILITATION PROJECT, I&I, PENALTIES (Status)
 Phase II was approved on October 13th and will begin shortly. I will keep the Council posted on progress.
- ✓ FIRE DEPARTMENT EVALUATION, CONTRACT RENEWAL, BUDGET (Status)
 I am waiting on the seating of the Township Board to begin the contract review.
- WWS INTERGOVERNMENTAL JURISDICTION ORDINANCE (Status)
 Pending. We are still working on this with Mr. Delzer. We may have something at the next meeting.
- NON-MOTORIZED TRAIL SYSTEM, PHASE I (Status) Pending
- SR. CENTER, LEVY, BUILDING & FUTURE FUNDING PLAN (Status) Pending

✓ **SPRINGBROOK**, **HERITAGE STREET-LIGHTING** (Status)

I am working on a recommendation and a policy in handling our condominium associations in an effort to treat them all the same. I will be back at a near future meeting for discussion and the adoption of a policy.

✓ LABOR CONTRACTS & RETIREE HEALTHCARE (Status)

Mr. Kehoe still needs a basic employment agreement and the Supervisor's contract has a wage re-opener. I will look to meet with them very shortly.

On my contract, it probably needs visiting for update purposes. I would like to take a pass on any rate increases for another year or two and until we are on better financial ground. I am not sure how the Council desires to handle an evaluation. As you recall, a couple of years ago I created a list of accomplishments and shortfalls as I saw them. I could bring the list up to date and then bring it back to the Council for discussion and review. Unless the Council has strong input one way or the other, I will do this and set it for a discussion item, hopefully soon. We can then go from here.

We have POLC and AFSCME labor contracts that will be coming up very soon. The prospect of rate increases seems slim.

✓ MARATHON STATION BLIGHT & NON-CONFORMING USE (Status)

The owner has removed the pylon sign and the canopy. As you recall from previous discussions, we have a third party of interest here, being the bank. Earlier information we had received was that the bank was going to move for default foreclosure in August; however, for reasons that are unclear, this is delayed. The property owner was pushing for a quick sale to recover some of their losses. It does not appear that this may happen with eventual foreclosure being likely. I am unsure what the bank's position will be if, and when we move to raze the building. We are working with them to get this question answered. I do believe that they may be easier to work with than the current owner may. I will keep the Council posted.

COUNTY E.M.S. ORDINANCE, AMBULANCE SERVICE (Status) Pending.

✓ FEES, RATES & SERVICE CHARGES (Status)

As you are aware, we have water rate increases now in effect. We can float for a bit using Fund Balance, but we will have to do something by next summer. As we have discussed in the past, the entire water rate system is in need of re-structuring. In short, it needs to go to a ready to serve charge with a per use charge. We will be back with some recommendations for new ordinances sometime towards the end of the year or very early next year.

- SALE OF CITY PROPERTY 5129 MORRISH ROAD (Status) Pending
- PROPOSED ART FAIR, ELMS PARK (Status) Pending.
- ✓ FINANCIALS, 2007-2008 AUDIT (Status) The audit fieldwork has been completed. We are waiting for the Sr. Center Audit. When we get this, we should be ready for a draft.
- ✓ WWS, STORM WATER MANAGEMENT AGREEMENT (Status) We are still looking at this.

NEW BUSINESS / PROJECTED ISSUES & PROJECTS

✓ POLICE DONATIONS, SWARTZ CREEK WOMEN'S CLUB (*Resolution*)

Included with tonight's agenda is the acceptance of two donations from the Swartz Creek Women's Club, to the Police Department. One is for the purchase of the Miller Road Banner earlier this summer, and the second is to be used for Camp 911.

✓ TREE SERVICE BIDS (*Resolutions*)

We expend a fair amount of money on tree maintenance, such as trimming and removal. We have seen an upward rise in this, the causes being the Emerald Ash Bore, tree population age and interference with water – sewer lines. Additionally, we lay off a small portion of wood chipping when the load exceeds our labor staff capacity. Because of this, I feel we needed to bid these services to price check the competitiveness. We have three companies that expressed an interest, being Mitchell Tree Removal of 4101-306 South Sheridan, Lennon 48449, Clear View Tree Service of 12215 West Baldwin Road, Gaines 48436 and Jerry's Complete Tree Service, P.O. Box 388, Swartz Creek 48473. In review of the returns, it appears the best interest of the City would be to split the services between the low bidder of the trimming and removal, and the low bidder of the chipping service. The trimming and removal low bid is Mitchell's of Lennon and the chipping low bid is Clear View, of Gaines. I have resolutions to split the bid and award accordingly.

✓ **PROPERTY PURCHASE OFFER**, (Information)

Included with tonight's agenda is a letter from Mr. Roger Sharp (Sharp Funeral Home) regarding a house that the company owns at 8118 Miller Road. They are offering to sell it to the City. At this point, I don't see a foreseeable use of the property. The DDA may have another view on the matter. I will drop this over to Adam when he gets back on line and have him look into it and report to the Council.

✓ NEIGHBORHOOD STABILIZATION PROGRAM (Information)

Included with tonight's packet is an application for grant funding, via the County Metropolitan Planning, for grant funding related to abandoned houses that deteriorate neighborhoods. As of yet, I have no details as to the programs criteria, but it is worth the application efforts. I will keep the Council advised on progress.

Council Questions, Inquiries, Requests and Comments

- Cooperative Fuel Purchasing. We are looking at options.
- C.S.O. Plaques, Lobby. I am looking at options.
- Mast Arm Traffic Lights, Street Sign Anchors (Silver vs. Black). I have passed this along to our engineer who is checking into the replacement.

COUNCIL ORGANIZATIONAL ACTIVITIES: DESIGNATION OF DEPOSITORIES, ADOPT INVESTMENT POLICY

Motion by Councilmember: _____

I Move the Swartz Creek City Council adopt the Investment Policy and Designation of Depository for City Funds, as follows:

CITY OF SWARTZ CREEK INVESTMENT & CASH MANAGEMENT POLICY November 10, 2008

I. POLICY

It is the policy of the City of Swartz Creek to invest public funds in a manner that will provide the highest investment return with the maximum security while meeting the daily cash flow demands of the City of Swartz Creek and conforming to all State statutes and local ordinances governing the investment of public funds.

II. SCOPE

This investment policy applies to all short term operating funds of the City of Swartz Creek and any new fund created by the local unit, unless specifically exempted by the City Council. These assets are accounted for in the City of Swartz Creek's annual financial report.

III. INVESTMENT OBJECTIVES

The following investment objectives, in priority order, will be applied in the management of the City of Swartz Creek's funds.

Safety

The primary objective of the City of Swartz Creek's investment activities is the preservation of capital in the overall portfolio and the protection of investment principal.

The authorized investment staff will employ mechanisms to control risks and diversify investments regarding specific security types or individual financial institutions.

Liquidity

The investment portfolio will remain sufficiently liquid to enable the City of Swartz Creek to meet operating requirements, which might be reasonably anticipated.

Return on Investment

The investment portfolio shall be designed with the objective of attaining a market rate of return throughout budgetary and economic cycles, commensurate with the investment risk constraints and the cash flow characteristics of the portfolio. Return on investments shall be of secondary importance compared to the safety and liquidity objectives above.

IV. PRUDENCE

In managing its investment portfolio, City of Swartz Creek officials shall avoid any transaction that might impair public confidence. Investments shall be made with judgment and care, under circumstances then prevailing, which persons of prudence, discretion and intelligence exercise in the management of their own affairs, not for speculation, but for investment, considering the probable safety of their capital as well as the probable income to be derived.

The above standard is established as the standard for professional responsibility and shall be applied in the context of managing the overall portfolio. Investment officers of the City of Swartz Creek, acting in accordance with State statute, this Investment policy, written procedures as may be established, and exercising due diligence, shall be relieved of personal responsibility for an individual security's credit risk or market price changes, provided that deviations from expectations are reported in a timely fashion, and appropriate action is taken to control adverse developments.

V. DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

Authority to manage the City of Swartz Creek's investment program is derived from State statutes.

Responsibility for the investment program is hereby delegated to the City Manager, or his designated representative hereinafter referred to as investment officer, who shall establish written procedures for the operation of the investment program consistent with this investment policy. The Investment Officer shall be responsible for all transactions undertaken, and shall establish a system of controls to regulate the activities of subordinate officials.

VI. ETHICS AND CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Officers and employees involved in the investment process shall refrain from personal business activity that could conflict with proper execution of the investment program, or which could impair-or create the appearance of an impairment on--their ability to make impartial investment decisions. Employees and investment officials shall disclose to the City Manager any material financial interests in financial institutions that conduct business with the unit, and they shall further disclose any large personal financial investment positions that could be related to the performance of the City of Swartz Creek's portfolio. Employees and officers shall subordinate their personal investment transactions to those of the City of Swartz Creek, particularly with regard to the time of purchases and sales.

VII. SAFEKEEPING AND CUSTODY

1. <u>Authorized Financial Dealers and Institutions</u> - The Investment Officer will maintain a list of financial institutions. In addition, a list will also be maintained of approved security broker/dealers selected by credit-worthiness, who maintain an office in the State of Michigan or who are "primary" dealers or regional dealers that qualify under Securities and Exchange Commission rule 15C3-1 (uniform net capital rule.) No public deposit shall be made except in a qualified public depository as established by State law.

All financial institutions and broker/dealers who desire to become qualified bidders for investment transactions must supply the Investment Officer with the following: audited financial statements for the most recent fiscal year; certification of having read and agreeing to abide by the City of Swartz Creek's investment policy and the pertinent State statutes; proof of National Association of Security Dealers certification; and proof of State registration, where applicable.

An annual review of the financial condition and registration of qualified bidders will be conducted by the Finance Director. Information indicating a loss or prospective loss of capital on existing investments must be shared with the City Manager of the City of Swartz Creek immediately upon notification.

2. <u>Internal Controls</u> - The Investment Officer shall establish a system of internal controls, documented in writing, which is designed to prevent losses of public funds arising from fraud, employee error, and misrepresentation by third parties, unanticipated changes in financial markets, or imprudent actions by employees and officers of the City. The internal control structure shall be designed to provide reasonable assurance that these objectives are met. The concept of reasonable assurance recognizes that (1) the cost of a control should not exceed the benefit likely to be derived and (2) the valuation of costs and benefits requires estimates and judgments by management.

All securities purchased by the City of Swartz Creek under this section shall be properly designated as an asset of the City and held in safekeeping by a third party custodial bank or other third party custodial institution, chartered by the United States government or the State of Michigan, and no withdrawal of such securities, in whole or in part, shall be made from safekeeping except by the Investment Officer as authorized herein, or by respective designees.

Internal controls will also encompass at a minimum the additional issues:

separation of functions including transaction authority from accounting and record-keeping, delegation of authority to subordinate staff members written confirmation of telephone transactions, specific guidelines regarding securities losses and remedial action, documentation of decisions made at the committee level and avoidance of physical delivery securities. Further all confirming written transactions shall be signed by the Investment Officer or Finance Director.

3. <u>Delivery vs. Payment</u> – all trades will be executed by delivery vs. payment to ensure that securities are deposited in an eligible financial institution prior to

release of funds. Securities will be held by a third-party custodian as evidenced by safekeeping receipts.

The City of Swartz Creek will execute third party custodial agreement(s) with its bank(s) and depository institution(s). Such agreements will include letters of authority from the City of Swartz Creek, details as to responsibilities of each party, notification of security purchases, sales, delivery, repurchase agreements and wire transfers, safekeeping and transactions costs, procedures in case of wire failure or other unforeseen mishaps including liability of each party.

VIII. AUTHORIZED AND SUITABLE INVESTMENTS

1. The City of Swartz Creek is empowered by State statute (1988 Public Act 239, M.C.L. 129.91) to invest in the following types of securities:

a. Bond, securities, and other obligations of the United States, or an agency or instrumentality of the United States including securities issued or guaranteed by the Government National Mortgage Association;

b. Certificates of deposit, savings accounts, deposit accounts, or depository receipts of a bank which is a member of the federal deposit insurance corporation or a savings and loan which is a member of the federal savings and loan insurance corporation or a credit union which is insured by the national credit union administration, but only if the bank, savings and loan or credit union is eligible to be a depository of surplus funds belonging to the state under section 5 or 6 of Act No. 105 of the Public Acts of 1855, as amended;

c. In United States government of federal agency obligation repurchase agreements.

d. In banker's acceptances of United States banks;

e. Mutual funds registered under the investment company act of 1940, title I of chapter 686, 54 Stat. 789, 15 U.S.C. 80a-1 to 80a-3 and 80a-4 to 80a-64, with the authority to purchase only investment vehicles that are legal for direct investment by the City. This authorization is limited to securities whose intention is to maintain a net asset value of \$1.00 per share.

f. Investment pools through an inter-ocal agreement under the urban cooperation act of 1967, 1967 (Excess) PA 7, MCL 124.501 to 124.512. All of the pools are limited to investments described in Sections a-f.

g. Investment pools organized under the surplus funds investment pool act, 1982 PA 367, 129.111 to 129.118. All of the pools are limited to investments described in Sections a-f.

2. The Investment Officer is restricted to investments that meet the statutory restrictions above and limitations on security issues and issuers as detailed below:

a. Repurchase agreements shall be negotiated only with dealers or financial institutions with whom the City has negotiated a Master Repurchase Agreement or with the City of Swartz Creek's primary bank. Repurchase Agreements must be signed with the bank or dealer and must continue provisions similar to those outlined in the Public Security Association's model Master Repurchase Agreement.

b. Certificates of Deposit shall be purchased only from financial institutions, which qualify under Michigan law and are consistent with Opinion No. 6168, Opinions of the Attorney General (1982).

c. To the extent possible, the investing officer will attempt to match investments with anticipated cash flow requirements. Specific City Council approval is necessary for investments exceeding eighteen months. Unless matched to a specific cash flow requirement, the City of Swartz Creek will not directly invest in securities maturing more than 10 years from the date of purchase. No more than 25 percent of the City of Swartz Creek's total investment portfolio shall be placed in securities maturing in more than 10 years. No more than 50 percent of investment vehicles maturing in any given month shall be of non-liquid nature (nonnegotiable CD's, commercial paper, etc.)

d. No more than 50 percent of any one fund's surplus operating cash may be invested in commercial paper rated at the time of purchase within the 2 highest classifications established by not less than 2 standard rating services and which matures not more than 270 days after the date of purchase; Commercial Paper held in the portfolio which subsequently receives a reduced rating shall be closely monitored and sold immediately if the principal invested may otherwise be jeopardized.

e. Investments will be diversified by security type and institutions. With the exception of U.S. treasury securities and authorized investment pools (as a long-term investment program), no more than 50 percent of the total investment portfolio will be invested in a single security type or with a single financial institution. With the exception of using affiliates of the major Banking Institute and upon receipt of written confirmation that funds are fully insured when held by the affiliates.

Excluding the Property Tax Bank Account, with 100 percent of funds being deposited with the City of Swartz Creek's major Banking Institute with monies in the checking and Municipal Governmental Cash Investment Fund to be liquid and transferable to the respective taxing agencies on a biweekly basis during the tax collection period.

Excluding amounts pooled in the Commercial Sweep Account and held for less than 91 days which will remain liquid and transferable to meet financial obligations associated with daily operations.

IX. CASH MANAGEMENT

The City of Swartz Creek's Policy regarding cash management is based upon the realization that there is a time-value to money. Temporarily idle cash may be invested for a period of one day to an excess of one year depending upon when the money is needed. Accordingly, the Finance Director shall prepare a written cash management procedure which shall include, but not be limited to, the following:

Cash Forecast: At least annually, a cash forecast shall be prepared using expected revenue sources and items of expenditure to project cash requirements over the fiscal year. The forecast shall be updated from time to time to identify the probable investment balances that will be available.

Pooled Cash: Except for cash in certain restricted and special accounts, the investment officer may pool cash of various funds to maximize investment earnings. Investment income shall be allocated to the various funds based upon their respective participation.

X. INVESTMENT PERFORMANCE AND REPORTING

All investment transactions shall be recorded in the various funds of the City of Swartz Creek in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles as declared by the Government Accounting Standards Board.

The Investment Officer shall submit a semi-annual investment report to the City Manager that provides the principal and type of investment, annualized yield, earnings for the period, market price and a summary report of cash and investments maintained in each financial institution.

Performance of the portfolio shall be reported periodically and submitted to the City Manager. Reports shall include details of the characteristics of the portfolio as well as its performance for that period. Reports shall be submitted at a minimum on an annual basis. Material deviations from projected investment strategies shall be reported immediately to the city manager.

XI. INVESTMENT POLICY ADOPTION

The City of Swartz Creek investment policy shall be adopted by resolution of the City of Swartz Creek legislative authority. Modifications made at any time or when necessitated by State statutory revision must be approved by the legislative authority of the City of Swartz Creek. Investments conforming to the investment policy guidelines prior to any amendatory act are hereby validated.

XII. DESIGNATION OF DEPOSITORY

The Swartz Creek City Council designates the following banking-financial institutions and their affiliates as depositories for City funds:

DESIGNATION OF PLACE OF PUBLICATION

The Swartz Creek City Council designates The Flint Journal, The Swartz Creek News and the Advisor as newspapers in general circulation for publication of legal notices of the City of Swartz Creek. Additionally, the City designates the City website at <u>www.cityofswartzcreek.org</u> as electronic posting locations for City Publications.

GENERAL COUNCIL OPERATING PROCEDURES

MEETING OPENED TO THE PUBLIC

All Council meetings except otherwise allowed by law shall be open to the public and shall be subject to the provisions of Act 267 of the Public Acts of the State of Michigan of 1976, as amended.

REGULAR MEETINGS

The Council shall hold regular meetings at least two times per month. A twelve-month schedule of meetings preceding each fiscal year shall be adopted by the Council, on or before the last meeting in June.

SPECIAL MEETINGS

- A. Special meetings may be called by the City Clerk on the written request of the Mayor, City Manager, or any two (2) Councilmembers, by providing each Councilmember and the City Manager with eighteen (18) hours written notice served personally or left at his usual place of residence, or as applicable by The Open Meetings Act or other such statute.
- B. The written notice shall include the date, hour, meeting place, and the purpose for which the Special Meeting was called, and shall include related material where possible.
- C. Any special meeting at which all members of the Council are present or have waived notice thereof in writing shall be a legal meeting for all purposes.
- D. Business transacted at any special meeting shall be limited to subjects recited in the notice of such meetings.

QUORUM OF COUNCIL

Four members of the Council shall be a quorum for the transaction of business at all Council meetings. In the absence of a quorum, any number of members less than a quorum may adjourn any regular or special meeting to a later date or may compel the attendance of absent members (ref City Charter, Chapter 5, Section 5.5(c))

A majority of the full Council, or a $\frac{2}{3}$ "super" majority, where required, shall be necessary for the passage of any question before it (i.e. four (4) votes being a majority, or five (5) votes being a "super" majority where required. Ref City Charter Chapter 5, Section 5.12(c)).

MAINTAINING ORDER

Councilmembers shall preserve order and shall do nothing to interrupt or delay the proceedings of Council.

COUNCILMEMBER'S RIGHT TO SPEAK

- A. Right to Speak The Mayor, or in his/her absence, the Mayor Pro-Tem, will have the responsibility to recognize a Councilmember's right to speak before the body.
- B. Discussion A Councilmember may discuss any one subject in its order on the agenda for a maximum of five (5) minutes. After all Councilmembers who wish to speak have exercised their right to speak on the subject, a Councilmember may be heard a second time for a maximum of five (5) minutes. With the consent of a majority of Council, a Councilmember may be permitted to speak for a longer period of time.
- C. Privilege of Closing Discussion The Councilmember moving the adoption of an Ordinance or Resolution shall have the privilege of closing the discussion after all Members wishing to speak on the subject have had the opportunity.
- D. The City Manager may speak on any subject before Council. He may answer questions about the administration of the municipality or he may ask another administrative officer to answer for him. All questions about internal operation of the municipal corporation shall be directed to the City Manager.
- E. Right to Appeal Councilmember shall have the right to appeal from a decision of the Chair. A majority of Council will determine the matter.

RIGHT TO SPEAK UNINTERRUPTED

A Member duly recognized shall be allowed to speak on the topic under discussion for the prescribed time and may be interrupted if a point of order is raised. If the Councilmember is judged to be out of order, he must change his remarks or surrender his right to continue speaking.

ORDER OF BUSINESS

The order of business at regular council meetings is as follows. Deviation is permissible when special circumstances warrant so.

Note: Each Report on the Agenda, where necessary, will have an abstract after the title.

PREPARATION OF AGENDA

- A. The Agenda will be prepared by the City Manager with the assistance of the City Clerk.
- B. Material for the Agenda will be submitted to the City Clerk by Wednesday prior to the regular meeting.
- C. The finished Agenda for a regularly scheduled meeting, with associated material, shall be delivered to each Councilmember no less than forty-eight (48) hours prior to the meeting.

MOTIONS & RESOLUTIONS

- A. All Motions and Resolutions, whenever possible, shall be pre-written and in the positive, meaning yes is approved and no is defeated. All motions shall require support. The Mayor will assign, by rotation, the reading of motions & resolutions. A Councilmember whom reads/moves for a motion may oppose, argue against or vote no on the motion.
- B. To Adjourn

A Motion to adjourn is out of order under the following conditions:

- 1. When a vote is being taken.
- 2. If a person is speaking.
- 3. If the previous questions are ordered.
- 4. If repeated without the intervention of additional business.
- 5. Prior to midnight if all items on the agenda have not been completed.

An unqualified motion to adjourn shall not be debatable.

C. To Lay Question on the Table

A motion to lay on the table is not debatable and precludes amendments or debate on the subject under consideration. A motion to lay on the table cannot be reconsidered. A motion to take a subject from the table is not debatable.

D. Motion Asking for Previous Question

This motion is not debatable. When the previous question is called for there shall be no further amendments or debate and pending amendments shall be taken in their order before the main questions. A $\frac{2}{3}$ vote is required.

E. To Postpone To Another Time

This motion is debatable and may be amended as to time. All debate must be confined to its merit only and cannot go into the main question except for debate of the immediately pending question.

F. To Refer to Committee or Individual

This is debatable.

- G. Amendments
 - 1. Ordinance

An Ordinance may be amended when not in the hands of a City Board or Commission. If any section of an ordinance is amended after reading, the amended section will be read again.

2. Amendments

An amendment may be amended, but further amendments are out of order. Any amendment must be germane to original motion.

H. Motion to be Stated by the Chair.

When a motion is made and seconded, it shall be stated by the Chair before debate. All main motions shall be in written form if requested by a Member of the Council.

- I. Withdrawal of Motion
 - 1. A motion may be withdrawn by the person making the motion with the consent of the person seconding the motion if debate has not begun.
 - 2. A motion may be withdrawn after debate with consent of the majority of Council.

PUBLIC ADDRESS OF COUNCIL

The public shall be allowed to address the Council under the following conditions:

- 1. Each person who wishes to address the Council will be first recognized by the Mayor and requested to state his / her name and address.
- 2. Individuals shall be allowed five (5) minutes to address the Council, unless special permission is otherwise requested and granted by the Mayor.
- 3. There shall be no questioning of speakers by the audience; however, the Council, upon recognition of the Mayor, may question the speaker.
- 4. No one shall be allowed to address the Council more than once unless special permission is requested, and granted by the Mayor.
- 5. One spokesperson for a group attending together will be allowed five (5) minutes to address the Council unless special permission has been requested, and granted by the Mayor.
- 6. Those addressing the Council shall refrain from being repetitive of information already presented.

- 7. All comments and / or questions shall be directed to and through the Mayor.
- 8. Public Hearings. The Mayor may invoke the circulation and posting of the following rules for public hearings when, at his / her discretion, time or attendance numbers warrant its use:

PUBLIC HEARINGS CITY OF SWARTZ CREEK

Public Hearings are held for the purpose of allowing community input on a specific piece of City legislation being considered for adoption by the City Council and/or Planning Commission. Citizen's comments will be considered by the Council/Commission in their deliberations following the closure of the public hearing.

Procedure shall be as per the following:

Public remarks shall be limited to 5 minutes. An extra minute may be allowed by the chair for that person to conclude their statement.

No person may delegate his or her time or the balance of his or her time to another individual.

Remarks shall be restricted to the topic of the hearing.

No person may speak again until all others wishing to speak have had their turn.

Remarks must be directed to the Council/Commission and not to the public body.

Speakers need not to be a citizen of the City of Swartz Creek.

Questions asked of the Council/Commission are not usually answered at this time, as it is the public's occasion to speak. However, the chair may rule that either a member of the Council/Commission or a member of City Staff may make a response, following the query.

Decorum shall be maintained.

Crude, lewd and/or profane speech is not permitted. Removal of the individual using this type of language will be immediately.

MAYOR

The Council, at its first regular meeting following a regular city election, shall elect one of its members mayor for a term of two (2) years. The mayor shall preside at meetings of the Council, shall be the chief executive officer of the City insofar as required by law, and for all ceremonial purposes and shall have a vote

on all matters, but no administrative duties or veto power. The Mayor shall sign ordinances, deeds, bonds, contracts and other such instruments as may require authentication under the provision of law and when authorized by the Council to do so. The Mayor shall perform only such duties as shall be specifically conferred or required by law.

MAYOR PRO-TEM

The Council shall choose one of its members Mayor Pro-Tem who shall act in the temporary absence or disability of the Mayor.

The Mayor Pro-Tem shall succeed to the office of Mayor in the case of a vacancy in the office of Mayor. The senior member of the Council from the standpoint of continuous service shall then act as Mayor Pro-Tem. As between persons of equal seniority, the person who received the highest number of votes at the time of his last election shall sit.

COMMITTEES

- A. The Mayor, with the advice and consent of Council, may appoint temporary committees whose membership may include persons not on Council.
- B. Committees will be appointed to study specific matters and a time limit shall be placed on the length of the study. The committee will make a report to the Council at the predetermined time. All committee reports upon which action is expected shall be in written form and copies shall be available to each member of Council.

VOTING RECORD OF COUNCIL

A vote upon all proposed ordinances and resolutions shall be taken by "YES" and "NO" vote and the vote of each Councilmember entered upon the journal, except that where the vote is unanimous it shall be necessary only to so state.

VOTING REQUIREMENTS

A Councilmember shall not vote on any question in which the Councilmember shall have a direct personal financial interest, other than as a citizen of the community, but on all other questions the Councilmember shall vote, unless excused there from by a vote of at least six (6) of the members of Council.

MEETING MINUTES

A record shall be kept of all meetings and the actions taken at these meetings. The names of members present and those absent shall be part of the minutes. There shall be a journal of proceedings of all Council meetings, signed by the Mayor and City Clerk and to which the Public shall have access at all reasonable times.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS

The Chief of Police shall act as Sergeant-at-Arms at Council meetings if so requested to by the Council or City Manager.

AMENDMENTS TO RULE OF COUNCIL

The rules of Council may be amended by a two-thirds vote of the entire membership of Council. Amending action will become final at the meeting following introduction of the amendment if voted on favorably.

TRAVEL REIMBURSEMENT POLICY

GENERAL PROVISIONS:

A representative of the City is expected to use good judgment regarding the nature and extent of expenses incurred while traveling. Expenses for members of one's family or guests who may accompany, are not reimbursable.

The provisions of this policy shall apply for travel expenditures of all individuals traveling on behalf of the City.

Approved travel for all City Employees shall be at the discretion of the City Manager; provided, funds in the appropriate budget category are available for such purpose. Travel expenses shall be subject to the City's Purchasing Ordinance.

Travel of Councilmembers and Members of City Boards or Committees may be approved by the City Manager; provided, funds in the appropriate budget category are available and budgeted for such purpose. Travel expenses shall be subject to the City's Purchasing Ordinance.

Travel of the City Manager shall be approved by the City Council.

One engaged in travel for benefit of City has a responsibility to keep accurate, substantiated cost records and to submit requests for reimbursement promptly upon return.

EXPENSES APPROVED FOR REIMBURSEMENT:

The following expenses are authorized for reimbursement when an expense report has been submitted which itemizes the actual and necessary expenses related to the travel:

- 1. Use of personal car shall be reimbursed at the current rate of mileage for the miles driven; except in the instance of the City Manager whose car allowance shall be the remuneration for use of personal vehicle.
- 2. Use of City car Expenses incurred such as gas, oil, and repairs.
- 3. Lodging Hotel accommodations shall be reimbursed when receipts for all lodging costs are secured. If family members or guests accompany, the reimbursable lodging cost shall be that of a single room.
- 4. Meals Reasonable expenses for meals will be reimbursed at actual cost. Receipts for meals are not required, but should be secured when available. Alcoholic beverages are specifically excluded from reimbursable expenses.

- 5. Local Transportation Local transportation costs, such as taxi fare (including tips) shall be reimbursed. Parking expense for a personal or City car shall also be included.
- 6. Registration Fee Fees for registration at any meeting or convention attended are allowed for reimbursement. A receipt for the registration fee is required.
- 7. Gratuities Reasonable expenses for tips are reimbursable and should be reported by day.

Dear Mr. Davidek:

We are in receipt of your letter dated September 4, 2008 to the City of Swartz Creek in reference to the City's flow records for the first quarter of 2008. This letter is to inform you there are still unresolved issues with the derivation of the City's flow data as depicted by your office, as well as the methodology used in calculating the city's "excess flows".

In 2005, we met with your staff and the City to discuss our concerns with the inflow and infiltration study that was conducted by your office on the City's sanitary sewer system. Based on your September 4, 2008 data, it appears the city's base flow is approximately 1.6 cfs and the "adjusted" flow using the 0.77 cfs "grace" flow is 2.37 cfs. At this time, we do agree with these figures; however it is unclear how the excess flow lines were developed as shown in your graph. Based on a flow of 2.37 cfs we would expect the excess flow lines to be 4.74cfs(2x), 5.93cfs(2.5x), and 7.11cfs(3x). It appears these lines as show on your graph do not coincide with these figures; at this time we request clarification on how the penalty lines for excess flow were developed.

The second concern is the condition of the County's sanitary sewer interceptor within the city limits. Given the age of the system and its close proximity to the creek, we feel there is a strong possibility that the presence of I/I is significant along this route and could impact the results of the study to show increased levels of I/I from the city's transmission lines. You have indicated the sewer manholes along the interceptor have been rehabilitated, our concern is with the main line itself; has there been any rehabilitation on your *interceptor line* within our jurisdiction?



In addition, we also discussed sanitary flows from the adjacent Townships and where they enter into the city's system, based on the meter locations presented in the study it appeared there were not enough meters utilized to isolate these flows. On 10/31/06 we met with you to discuss this issue and established four areas that required additional monitoring (see meeting minutes attached). Has additional monitoring been completed to verify these areas?

At this point in time, the city is not in agreement with the procedure and methods used to develop the "penalty" system. It is our hope that our offices can work together on this to further review and refine the city's data if necessary.

MEETING MINUTES GENESEE COUNTY I/I PROGRAM OCTOBER 31, 2006

Attendees: Paul Bueche, Swartz Creek Tom Svrcek, Swartz Creek Adam Zettel, Swartz Creek Tim Davidek, Genesee County Water and Waste Lou Fleury, Rowe Incorporated

The following issues relative to the Genesee County I/I Program were discussed:

A. Flow Data:

- 1. Rowe Incorporated received flow data on October 25, 2006, used for determining the City's dry weather flow for 2003 thru 2005.
- 2. Rowe's preliminary review raised concerns with small data samples used in the calculations. Given a regional rain gauge has used to determine eligible days for inclusion in dry weather flow calculations, Rowe suggested they could provide all rain data measured within the city during this time frame. The County's consultant can determine if more days should be included in the dry weather calculation.
- 3. Rowe and the City expressed concerns with existing flows from other jurisdictions which enter into the interceptor between the County's inflow and outflow meters. Specific areas were identified which could potentially impact the city's I/I ratio, they are as follows:
 - a. Three trailer parks along the Elms Road corridor just south of Miller Road.
 - b. All developments situated between Elms and Dye Roads south of the interceptor.
 - c. "Bear Creek"-The County will verify if this system is in operation.
 - d. Bristol Road between Morrish and Elms Road. (The County will do visual inspections in this location)

The County indicated they would monitor flows at Elms Road to determine the wet weather impact the trailer parks may impose on the City. Rowe suggested placing a meter in the interceptor at Elms in order to calculate the total contribution to the inceptor from both the north and south in this area. The City will monitor flows from districts 1, 2 and 13 during this same time frame.

This data will be used to determine potential connections from Flint Township. Rowe and the City requested the County's fee schedule that was utilized for determination of fines as shown in the County's letter dated, September 21, 2006. The County explained "Attachment D" that was included with the September 21st package.

B. County Fee/Fine Program

- 1. Rowe inquired about the "excess wet weather impact definition "as provided in the report date May, 2005. The County explained that in order for a fine to occur, the "excess" peak flow must be longer than a four hour duration. Additionally, if flows exceeded the 4 hour duration, the penalty would be based on the total excess volume measured from the beginning to the end of that particular event.
- 2. Rowe inquired about the timing of the penalty and fines that will be assessed. The County indicated they will begin billing for excess flows in 2008.
- 3. The City inquired about what the collected revenue from this program would be used for. The County indicated an escrow account would be created so that as communities make improvements to the system they would be reimbursed for the funds they have paid provided the new data shows reduced I/I levels.

C. General

The City discussed their ongoing efforts relating to the removal of I/I in their sewer system. A sewer rehab program has been established which will consist of approximately seven (7) phases. Phase I will be awarded at the November 13th Council Meeting. Construction will involve sewer lining, televising and manhole inspections.





NOTICE **2003 MICHIGAN UNIFORM ENERGY TO TAKE IMMEDIATE EFFECT**

In 2002, the Department of Labor & Economic Growth established a committee to review and update Michigan's Uniform Energy Code. After review and promulgation of the code, the Ingham County Circuit Court issued an injunction to halt the February 28, 2005, effective date of the rules. Therefore, the rules have been pending litigation since that time. On October 24, 2008, this matter was before the court with a decision following to dismiss the complaint and dissolve the injunction; thereby making the rules effective immediately.

Therefore, every unit of government enforcing the single state construction code must apply the 2003 Michigan Uniform Energy Code (MUEC) to newly issued permits.

The 2003 MUEC was distributed prior to the anticipated effective date of the rules; however, given the length of time that has passed, the bureau is placing a link to these rules on the web site, www.michigan.gov/bcc in order to download a free copy.

If you prefer the MUEC in the original format; you may purchase a copy at a cost of \$2.50 by downloading and completing the <u>Codes and Standards Order Form</u> and mailing it along with a check or money order made payable to "State of Michigan" to Michigan Department of Labor & Economic Growth, Bureau of Construction Codes, P.O. 

Michigan Racing Commissioner Issues 2009 Harness Horse Racing Schedule

LANSING, MI - Racing Commissioner Christine C. White today signed orders authorizing the 2009 live and simulcast horse racing calendar for Michigan's four pari-mutuel harness race tracks.

The 2009 live schedule calls for a total of 216 days of standardbred horse racing at the four locations and involves fives corporations.

<u>Hazel Park Raceway</u> – A total of 82 live race dates beginning Friday, May 1 through Saturday, September 19 with live racing being conducted every Monday, Tuesday, Friday and Saturday.

<u>Jackson Harness Raceway</u> – A total of 26 live race dates beginning Saturday, May 2 through Saturday, July 18 with live racing being conducted every Friday and Saturday, and every Wednesday starting June 24. No racing shall be conducted on Saturday, July 4.

<u>Northville Downs</u> – A total of 43 live race dates beginning Friday, February 6 through April 25 with live racing being conducted every Friday and Saturday; then beginning February 12 every Thursday, Friday, and Saturday and then beginning March 4, , every Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, and Saturday.

<u>Northville Racing Corporation</u> (Northville Downs) – A total of 34 live race dates beginning Friday, September 25 through Saturday, November 21 with live racing being conducted every Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday.

Sports Creek Raceway (Swartz Creek) – A total of 15 live race dates in a Winter Meeting, beginning Friday, January 2 through Sunday, February 1 with live racing being conducted every Friday, Saturday and Sunday. Also, a total of 16 live race dates in a Fall Meeting, beginning Friday, November 27 through Thursday, December 31 with live racing being conducted every Friday, Saturday, and Sunday. No racing shall be conducted on Friday, December 25 while racing shall be conducted on Monday, December 28 and Thursday, December 31.

Full schedules with exception days will be posted on the Office of Racing Commissioner website at <u>www.michigan.gov/horseracing</u>.

In addition to the standardbred race dates, Commissioner White also signed orders for the mixed breed meet at Mount Pleasant Meadows and the thoroughbred meet at Pinnacle Race Course in New Boston.

The Office of Racing Commissioner is the official state agency charged with regulating, promoting and serving the horse racing industry in Michigan. Officials continue to debate how to spend millions generated from senior tax

Genesee County -- With a large chunk of money set to be divered away from senior centers and Flint destined to get among the smallest checks, another storm is brewing over how to best spend the millions generated by the new tax to help senior citizens.

The county Board of Commissioners is expected soon to approve a distribution plan for parceling out \$2.6 million to 15 senior centers and another nearly \$1.9 million for home-delivered meals and other services.

But not without more debate and plenty of questions, continuing debate and competition for dollars including:

Who's getting what

Here's how Genesee County senior citizens centers may divide some of the money raised by the county's 0.7-mill property tax for seniors.

• Getting the most: \$215,000 for the Carman Ainsworth, Swartz Creek, Grand Blanc, Loose, Burton, Eastside, Flushing, Davison-Richfield and Kraphol senior centers.

- Next in line: \$131,667 for Hasselbring, Forest, Montrose, Brennan and Thetford senior citizen centers.
- Getting the least: \$106,667 for the Pierce/Haskell senior centers.

• Whether an elder abuse and exploitation program run by county Sheriff Robert Pickell is getting too big a piece of the pie -- \$758,758 to investigate financial and other crimes against seniors.

• How much more money should go to senior centers with stronger programming and services than those that provide less but are still open at least 40 hours a week?

• And whether Flint centers are getting a fair share of the cash because the city offers low levels of service and as a result are on course to get less per center than almost any place else in the county.

"All of the service providers feel like there isn't enough (money) to meet their needs," said Julie Hinterman, director-coordinator of the county Planning Department.

Voters approved the property 0.7 mill tax two years ago and last year the debate was even uglier as the county set up a distribution system for the \$8 million generated annually.

An advisory committee makes recommendations to the county board on how money should be spent, but commissioners can make changes like they did just last week.

The board gave tentative approval to a partial spending plan, including the expansion of Pickell's elder abuse program, but commissioner Rose Bogardus, D-Davison, voted against that funding, saying it missed the intent of the millage.

Bogardus is among those who believe the tax should take care of seniors' most basic needs first -- like hot meals and elementary home care.

"We have people who need to get food ... (and) we're going to spend more than 10 percent of the overall income on this one (elder abuse) program ... That's a very large percentage," Bogardus said.

County Board Chairman Woodrow Stanley said he's also concerned by the division of funds, particularly how little four senior centers in Flint appear set to receive because they offer fewer programs and services than centers elsewhere in the county.

Flint seniors shouldn't suffer with less because the city offers them less, according to Stanley.

"I don't want to punish the citizens (because) the city of Flint administration hasn't shown the level of commitment to the programs," Stanley said.

Flint's Pierce, Haskell, Hasselbring and Brennan centers got the same -- or in some cases less -- perbuilding than very small centers in Thetford, Forest and Montrose townships.

Bev Bloss, senior center director in Forest Township, said she's happy to get the \$131,667 her center is on track to receive for 2009 operations.

"I don't think you can give everybody the same," Bloss said. "Before the millage, we weren't able to do what we do now. It's been very beneficial to us.

"We've grown a lot since then."

Hinterman said the senior tax has been a boost for all the county's centers, replacing funds that have in many cases dried up from local governments.

It also helped boost the county's home-delivered meal program, which serves those 60 and older who have trouble leaving the house or cooking.

Before the tax, the county Community Action Resource Department served about 600 households, but the number has increased to about 900 now.

The home-delivered meal program is expected to receive more than \$1 million in millage funds next year. A congregate meal program, where seniors receive free meals at more than 20 sites throughout the

county, is targeted to receive more than \$204,000.

JoLynn Duty said her parents receive home-delivered meals through the county program, something that allows the couple to stay in their own Clio home.

"They are very happy with what they are getting," Duty said. "We know that at least they have a good meal coming in. That makes an absolute difference."
