OLD / ROUTINE BUSINESS - REVISITED ISSUES / PROJECTS

✓ 2010-2011 FISCAL BUDGET (Discussion)

We are working on the final budget draft and barring any more bad news, should have it back at the next meeting. I have a resolution to set a public hearing with tonight's agenda. We'll look to publish the public hearing notice on May 1st with the public hearing to be held at the meeting of May 9th. In the meantime, I have set this for a brief update and preview discussion for tonight's meeting. Here is a revised tentative schedule:

□ 2008 REPAIR ROSTER (Status)

As a re-cap, the contractor's are Maintenance & Construction Company, of Romulus Michigan, at \$101,547, with construction engineering and testing (\$1,980), the total being \$103,527, and Lang Construction of Flint Michigan, in the amount of \$8,523 for the storm sewer repairs. Totals are:

□ KAREGNONDI WATER AUTHORITY (Status)

Pending.

□ SEWER I&I PENALTIES, REHABILITATION (Status)

Implementation delayed until sometime in 2011.

☐ SEWER USE ORDINANCE – INDUSTRIAL PRE-TREATMENT (Status)

As the Council is aware, WWS has given the City a thirty day ultimatum to enact the Sewer Use Ordinance (along with appropriation of the delinquent CCIF) and the perpetuity agreement or face termination from further connections to the system. The ultimatum is in to Mr. Figura for an opinion. The Council has requested that he attend the meeting tonight, however, he is unable to do so. He will be attending the meeting of April 24th to discuss options.

□ DELINQUENT COUNTY CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT FEE (C.C.I.F.) (Status)

At the meeting of March 28th, we appropriated \$36,566.34, with conditions. I'll keep the Council posted on progress and developments associated with this.

✓ MARATHON REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT (Status)

Marathon Oil has proposed that we deed the property over to them and they will clean it up, all of it. Then, with our help, they will sell it to recover the expenses involved with the cleanup. I've informed Marathon that we have an interest in exploring this option, conditioned on what the City's goals and objectives are. We are in the process of getting a handful of the attorneys lined up to explore the proposal to see if we can arrive at an equitable solution for all of the concerns.

✓ PERSONNEL & POLICIES & PROCEDURES (Status)

I know it's been a while on this (actually, quite a while). Not to make excuses, but it's been a wild ride here since late 2007 just to stay above water. I've made a good dent into finishing this and should have it in the near future.

✓ SALE OF CITY PROPERTY 5129 MORRISH ROAD (Status)

Pending a report back to the Council with recommendation on the structure as well as the house the City owns at Morrish & Fortino.

✓ LABOR CONTRACTS (Resolution)

As a short re-cap, all our labor contracts are frozen. The POLC agreement has been frozen since January 2009. The AFSCME agreement has been frozen since July 2008. The Supervisor's agreement has been frozen since July 2007, however, to even this agreement out a bit, an additional 40 hours of absent time was granted. The extra absent time cannot be cashed out, rolled over, accrued or paid out in any way. The City Manager Contract has been frozen since December 2004. The extra absent time provision within the Supervisor's agreement is also applied to the City Manager's Contract. There are no plans to replace Mr. Zettel's position. We have two other "at will" classifications, which are without agreements, being our part time police officers and our building inspector. The part time police have been frozen since March 2004 with a change in November 2009 to allow time and a half on holidays. The building inspector is part time and has remained unchanged since October 2006 when the position was established to replace the full time assessor / building inspector. Contracted positions are the assessor and trade inspector's, being electrical, plumbing and mechanical. I've met with the POLC and discussed the financial future of the City and its relevance to rate increases, which frankly speaking, remains bleak. They don't like it, but they do understand. At the meeting of January 10th, we approved a letter of understanding that allows a "me too" clause for all our labor units. I have met with the AFSCME unit and they have requested to be included with the additional "no value" 40 hours of absent time. I expressed concerns that over too much time would have a backward effect and actually cost money. The compromise was that AFSCME group would return back 16 hours from the paid unused absent time (from 72 to 56) and the City would add 20 additional absent hours (2.5 days). I've included a copy of the section that addresses absent leave from the collective bargaining agreement for reference. I recommend approval of a letter of understanding.

On another note, with Adam leaving we have a problem with Zoning Administration, Code Enforcement, and to a lesser degree, DDA, Planning Commission and CDBG administration. I am currently working on a solution to this.

✓ GO GREEN, EECBG PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING HVAC GRANT (Status)

The system has been installed. We are in the process of reconciling submittals to the state for re-imbursement.

✓ FIRE DEPARTMENT: 2011 BUDGET & COST RECOVERY (Status)

The 2011 Budget was adopted at the meeting of November 22, minus CIP contributions. As indicated, we are looking at long term solutions to all public safety. The cost recovery issue plays into this, however, it is now in a bit of a state of flux based on the introduction of legislation that may prohibit such ordinances. The legislation has been stalled in committee. On the cost recovery, we'll watch it for a while to see where it heads. Regarding the agreement, the Fire Board has proposed some changes to the contract. I have met with the Township on the agreement, but for now, it appears stalled. The contract expired April 1st; however, there is a roll-over clause that allows continuation. I hope to have a draft for Council review very soon.

✓ SPRINGBROOK EAST & HERITAGE ASSOCIATION S.A.D. (Status) Pending.

✓ ZONING CODE AMENDMENT (Resolution)

Included with tonight's agenda is a draft ordinance, as recommended by the Planning Commission, for managing Medical Marijuana dispensaries and growing facilities. Legislative briefs seem to indicate the state will be revisiting this issue; however, it will be some time before they get to it. As the Council is aware, we have a moratorium placing a 90 day hold on such businesses, the moratorium expiring on May 24th. If the Council is inclined to pass this ordinance tonight, we can time the effective date to coincide with the expiration of the moratorium. If the Council decides to delay action on this matter tonight, then we will need to extend the moratorium at the next meeting.

✓ WASTE & RECYCLING SERVICES CONTRACT (Status)

We are out to bid. Return and opening is scheduled for April 18th.

✓ **NEIGHBORHOOD STABILIZATION PROGRAM** (Status) Pending.

✓ AYSO GROUND LEASE REQUEST (Status)

The local AYSO (American Youth Soccer Organization) has inquired if the City would be interested in a "no cost" ground lease agreement for the 20 acres of City property located on Bristol Road between the west lot line of GM-SPO and the Heritage Village Subdivision. They would like to construct soccer fields for practice and competition events on the land. Their proposal fits with our plans for a sports park on the land. As we all know, it will be many years before, and if ever, we have the funds to pursue our plan. I will be back in the future with a better defined direction after I spend additional time with the organization.

✓ SIGN ORDINANCE (Information)

Adam tells me that the date on this was extended to 2012 when we adopted our Appendix A. Either way, maybe later into the summer when we get past the budget season, we can talk about some solutions here.

NEW BUSINESS / PROJECTED ISSUES & PROJECTS

✓ PROCLAMATION'S (*Proclamations*)

We have a couple of proclamations tonight, as follows:

- #1. The Swartz Creek Varsity Poms have landed the 2011 National Dance Alliance (NDA) Championship for the Medium Pom Division. The finals were held at Universal Studios in Orland Florida the weekend of March 12th. The squad of 13 young ladies was coached by Lisa Badgley and our own Stephanie Zettel. Congrat's.
- #2. Also included with tonight's program is a proclamation to declare April 10th through the 16th National Library Week.

✓ PARK USE, VETERANS MEMORIAL COMMITTEE (Resolution)

Mr. Rick Henry, representing the Veterans Memorial Committee, has requested the use of two pavilions and the tennis and basketball courts in Elms Park on Saturday June 4th. The purpose is to conduct a fundraiser for the memorial. June 4th is in the height of the reservation season and all pavilions are reserved. We do have one of the small pavilions that we do not reserve but set aside for use on a fist come basis. We can allow this one to be reserved for this one time event. As a general rule, we do not allow

the reservation of tennis and basketball courts on the weekends as it is understood that these will be available, first come first serve, to those who have reserved pavilions, or otherwise. We *probably* can allow the reservation of the tennis and basketball courts and most likely will *not* run into problems. If we do, we can always offer to refund the reservation fee. I recommend we allow it... council choice.

✓ BID AWARD & APPROPRIATION, LAWN CARE SERVICES (Resolution)

We went out to bid for lawn care services for properties owned and maintained by the City. We had a total of three returns including one from our contractor for the last two years (Mike's Service's, Flint). The high bid was \$1,000 per "cut" (roughly every week), to the low of \$815. Funny thing, the lowest bid here is about 30% lower than the lowest bid we awarded in 2003-2004. At any rate, Royalty Landscaping Services of Byron Michigan is the low bidder. Tom visited the company and interviewed the principals. He rates the company as excellent and recommends award.

✓ REQUEST UTILITY RATE REVIEW, RACETRACK (Discussion)

Included with tonight's packet is a letter of complaint regarding utility billings for Sports Creek Raceway. The letter allures that there was a 216% increase. The raw numbers are true, but many variables have been discarded. First, let me go back and lay a bit of history. Since the beginning of "utility time", our ordinances gave breaks for high end users, i.e., our 6" metered customers. We had a minimum use that was varied over the years and we had an industrial rate for sewer use. The County recognized this rate and billed us less, accordingly. About three years ago, the County eliminated all of these arrangements and went to a ready to serve water & sewer charge and a metered sewer charge. In other words, the more water you used, the more water you paid <u>AND</u> the more sewer you paid. No more discounts for large users. We continued for a while under the old system, until we changed over, about a year ago. As we have discussed, our high end users, particularly our 6" meter customers, had sticker shock. compound this problem, the REU's for the racetrack were computed when it was built. They were set at 79 units. As a comparison, Parkridge Subdivision has 90+ homes, so in theory, the racetrack's REU's are nearly the same as what the sewer capacity for the entire Parkridge subdivision is. The question becomes, is it accurate? The units calculated at the time never mattered as the racetrack was given an industrial rate by the Council, honored by the County. When it all fell apart, the racetrack, as well as the other large metered customer's, saw dramatic increases. The County was asked to review the REU's. They did and they felt they were too high. They have been adjusted downward to 48 REU's, effective on the April 1st County billing cycle. They will not refund retroactive. The racetrack has asked for relief. I have set this for discussion to explore possibilities with the Council.

Council Questions, Inquiries, Requests and Comments

- □ *Traffic Lights, Bristol-Miller, GM-SPO.* Pending the direction that GM takes. New traffic counts as to warrants would need to be taken.
- Deteriorated Retaining Walls & Planters at City Buildings. The north wall at the Public Safety Building behind the Police Department collapsed. We are looking at solutions to take care of this more pressing problem first.
- □ Tabled Garbage Collection Policy. Resting comfortably... for now.
- Youth Programs in Park. Looking into this. This item is something that might best be suited for the City's School Liaison Officer. The matter has been referred to the Police Department for review and recommendation.

ADOPT ORDINANCE #407; REGULATE MEDICAL MARIJUANA DISPENSARIES & GROWING FACILITIES

Motion by C	Councilmember:

I Move the City of Swartz Creek adopt Ordinance No. 407, an Ordinance To Amend The Zoning Ordinance of the City of Swartz Creek To Regulate Medical Marijuana Dispensaries and Growing Facilities in response to the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of 2008, as follows:

THE CITY OF SWARTZ CREEK ORDAINS:

CITY OF SWARTZ CREEK ORDINANCE NO. 407

An Ordinance To Amend The Zoning Ordinance of the City of Swartz Creek To Regulate Medical Marijuana Dispensaries and Growing Facilities in response to the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of 2008.

THE CITY OF SWARTZ CREEK ORDAINS:

The City Council of the City of Swartz Creek hereby amends the City Zoning Ordinance as follows:

<u>Section 1</u>. Amendment of Section 2.07 of Article 2 of the City of Swartz Creek Zoning Ordinance.

The City Council hereby amends Section 2.07 of Article 2 of the City Zoning Ordinance by adding thereto the following new definitions:

Medical Marijuana (Marihuana) Dispensary. A medical marijuana dispensary shall mean a facility, jointly owned or operated by two or more "primary caregivers," where marijuana is stored, dispensed or offered for sale to "qualifying patients" under the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of 2008. A "primary caregiver," "qualifying patient" and "marijuana" shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of 2008.

Medical Marijuana (Marihuana) Growing Facility. A medical marijuana growing facility shall mean a facility, jointly owned or operated by two or more "primary caregivers," where marijuana is grown, cultivated, processed and/or packaged for "qualifying patients" but is not offered for direct or retail sale at this location to "qualifying patients" under the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of 2008. A "primary caregiver," "qualifying patient" and "marijuana" shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of 2008.

<u>Section 2</u>. Amendment of Section 14.02 of Article 14 of the City Zoning Ordinance.

The City Council hereby amends Section 14.02 of Article 14 of the City Zoning Ordinance by adding thereto a "medical marijuana dispensary" as a use permitted as a Special Land Use in the GBD, General Business zoning district.

Section 3. Amendment of Section 17.02 of Article 17 of the City Zoning Ordinance.

The City Council hereby amends Section 17.02 of Article 17 of the City Zoning Ordinance by adding thereto a "medical marijuana growing facility" as a use permitted as a Special Land Use in the I-2, Heavy Industrial zoning district.

<u>Section 4</u>. Amendment of Section 30.09 of Article 30 of the City Zoning Ordinance.

The City Council hereby amends Section 30.09 of Article 30 of the City Zoning Ordinance by adding thereto, under subsection (A), a "Medical Marijuana Dispensary" and "Medical Marijuana Growing Facility," as uses requiring specific site and/or use standards.

<u>Section 5</u>. Amendment of Section 30.09 of Article 30 of the City Zoning Ordinance.

The City Council hereby amends Section 30.09 of Article 30 of the City Zoning Ordinance by adding thereto, under subsection (B), the following specific site and/or use standards for a "Medical Marijuana Dispensary" and "Medical Marijuana Growing Facility," to read as follows:

Medical Marijuana Dispensary and/or Medical Marijuana Growing Facility.

- A. Dispensary & Growing Facility Location Limitations. The contemplated location of any medical marijuana dispensary or growing facility shall not be permitted within 500 feet of the following uses. The distance between such uses shall be measured along the center line of the street or streets of address between 2 fixed points on the center line determined by projecting straight lines, at right angles to the center line, from the center of the primary entrance of the contemplated uses and the center of the primary entrance of the relevant use as follows.
 - 1. Any other medical marijuana dispensary or growing facility;
 - 2. Any residential district or use;
 - 3. Any nursery, licensed day care center or other building used for the care or instruction of children under 18 years of age;
 - 4. Any church, house of worship or other religious facility or institution:

Furthermore, the contemplated location of any medical marijuana dispensary or growing facility shall not be permitted within a 1,000 foot radius of any school, public or private, and any public or municipal park.

B. Operational Limitations.

- A medical marijuana dispensary or growing facility operation shall be limited to operating between 8:00 A.M. and 8:00 P.M., Monday through Saturday and 12:00 noon and 6:00 P.M. Sunday.
- 2. A medical marijuana dispensary or growing facility shall comply at all times with each and every provision of the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of 2008 (MCL 333.26421, et seq.), and with all provisions of federal law, as enforced.
- 3. Marijuana or cannabis shall only be grown, manufactured or harvested inside a fully enclosed structure or building that is kept

secured with locks to prevent unintended or uninvited access.

- 4. Persons under the age of eighteen (18) years of age are not permitted to be on the premises of any medical marijuana dispensary and/or growing facility unless they possess a valid Medical Marijuana Registry Card issued by the State of Michigan or another state.
- 5. All employees of a medical marijuana dispensary and/or growing facility shall have a valid primary caregiver card or a valid qualifying patient card issued by the State of Michigan.
- 6. The cultivation, manufacturing, growing, packaging, storing or distribution of marijuana shall not occur in connection with or at a location at which any other commodity, product or service is also available.
- 7. A facility that is limited to selling or dispensing medical marijuana shall provide detailed information regarding the growing facility from which it receives its stock of medical marijuana and illustrate the lawful connection between the source product grower and the dispensary's primary caregivers.
- 8. Marijuana shall not be smoked, eaten or otherwise consumed at any dispensary or growing facility.
- 9. The owner of a medical marijuana dispensary and/or growing facility who violates these sections shall be liable for all costs associated with the investigation, prosecution and enforcement of that violation.
- **C. Site Plan Requirements.** A site plan shall be submitted, conforming to all requirements of Article 29 of the City Zoning Ordinance and which shall include the following:
 - 1. Security system details which shall include, at the minimum, audible and silent alarms and video surveillance cameras.
 - Details regarding the building electrical system, power demands of specialized lighting and other necessary equipment, and method proposed to prevent excessive heat build-up and risk of fire within the building.
 - 3. Ventilation equipment details, including fresh air intake and filtration of exhaust air to prevent offensive odors from leaving the site.
 - 4. Proposed methods for controlling insects within the building and preventing insects from becoming a nuisance or health hazard off the site.
 - 5. Anticipated quantity of water to be used by any proposed hydroponics growing system(s), anticipated quantity of wastewater to be generated, and method for treating and properly discharging wastewater so as not to become a hazard or nuisance to nearby properties.
 - 6. A description of the operation of the dispensary or growing facility in sufficient detail to permit the City to determine if the

operation, as described, would be lawful and fully compliant with the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of 2008.

D. Inspections and Fees.

- An application and review fee, established from time to time by resolution of the City Council, shall accompany each application for approval of a medical marijuana dispensary and/or growing facility.
- 2. Approved medical marijuana dispensaries and/or growing facilities shall submit annual permit renewal and facility inspection fees in amounts set by the City Council by resolution.
- 3. All approved medical marijuana dispensaries and/or growing facilities shall permit authorized City zoning and building inspection and/or law enforcement personnel to make unannounced, inspections for purposes of verifying compliance with all requirements of the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of 2008 (MCL 333.26421, et seq.) and the City Zoning Ordinance, and any reasonable conditions placed upon the special land use permit by the City Council.

Section 6. Effective Date.

This ordinance shall take effect on May 24, 2011 Councilmember _____ Moved: Second: Councilmember Voting For: Voting Against: Absent: The Mayor declared the ordinance adopted. Richard B. CITY OF SWARTZ CREEK ORDINANCE NO. 407

An Ordinance To Amend The Zoning Ordinance of the City of Swartz Creek To Regulate Medical Marijuana Dispensaries and Growing Facilities in response to the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of 2008.

THE CITY OF SWARTZ CREEK ORDAINS:

The City Council of the City of Swartz Creek hereby amends the City Zoning Ordinance as follows:

Section 1. Amendment of Section 2.07 of Article 2 of the City of Swartz Creek Zoning Ordinance.

The City Council hereby amends Section 2.07 of Article 2 of the City Zoning Ordinance by adding thereto the following new definitions:

Medical Marijuana (Marihuana) Dispensary. A medical marijuana dispensary shall mean a facility, jointly owned or operated by two or more "primary caregivers," where marijuana is stored, dispensed or offered for sale to "qualifying patients" under the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of 2008. A "primary caregiver," "qualifying patient" and "marijuana" shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of 2008.

Medical Marijuana (Marihuana) Growing Facility. A medical marijuana growing facility shall mean a facility, jointly owned or operated by two or more "primary caregivers," where marijuana is grown, cultivated, processed and/or packaged for "qualifying patients" but is not offered for direct or retail sale at this location to "qualifying patients" under the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of 2008. A "primary caregiver," "qualifying patient" and "marijuana" shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of 2008.

Section 2. Amendment of Section 14.02 of Article 14 of the City Zoning Ordinance.

The City Council hereby amends Section 14.02 of Article 14 of the City Zoning Ordinance by adding thereto a "medical marijuana dispensary" as a use permitted as a Special Land Use in the GBD, General Business zoning district.

<u>Section 3</u>. Amendment of Section 17.02 of Article 17 of the City Zoning Ordinance.

The City Council hereby amends Section 17.02 of Article 17 of the City Zoning Ordinance by adding thereto a "medical marijuana growing facility" as a use permitted as a Special Land Use in the I-2, Heavy Industrial zoning district.

Section 4. Amendment of Section 30.09 of Article 30 of the City Zoning Ordinance.

The City Council hereby amends Section 30.09 of Article 30 of the City Zoning Ordinance by adding thereto, under subsection (A), a "Medical Marijuana Dispensary" and "Medical Marijuana Growing Facility," as uses requiring specific site and/or use standards.

Section 5. Amendment of Section 30.09 of Article 30 of the City Zoning Ordinance.

The City Council hereby amends Section 30.09 of Article 30 of the City Zoning Ordinance by adding thereto, under subsection (B), the following specific site and/or use standards for a "Medical Marijuana Dispensary" and "Medical Marijuana Growing Facility," to read as follows:

Medical Marijuana Dispensary and/or Medical Marijuana Growing Facility.

- A. Dispensary & Growing Facility Location Limitations. The contemplated location of any medical marijuana dispensary or growing facility shall not be permitted within 500 feet of the following uses. The distance between such uses shall be measured along the center line of the street or streets of address between 2 fixed points on the center line determined by projecting straight lines, at right angles to the center line, from the center of the primary entrance of the contemplated uses and the center of the primary entrance of the relevant use as follows.
 - 1. Any other medical marijuana dispensary or growing facility;
 - 2. Any residential district or use;
 - 3. Any nursery, licensed day care center or other building used for the care or instruction of children under 18 years of age;
 - 4. Any church, house of worship or other religious facility or institution;

Furthermore, the contemplated location of any medical marijuana dispensary or growing facility shall not be permitted within a 1,000 foot radius of any school, public or private, and any public or municipal park.

B. Operational Limitations.

- 1. A medical marijuana dispensary or growing facility operation shall be limited to operating between 8:00 A.M. and 8:00 P.M., Monday through Saturday and 12:00 noon and 6:00 P.M. Sunday.
- 2. A medical marijuana dispensary or growing facility shall comply at all times with each and every provision of the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of

- 2008 (MCL 333.26421, et seq.), and with all provisions of federal law, as enforced.
- 3. Marijuana or cannabis shall only be grown, manufactured or harvested inside a fully enclosed structure or building that is kept secured with locks to prevent unintended or uninvited access.
- 4. Persons under the age of eighteen (18) years of age are not permitted to be on the premises of any medical marijuana dispensary and/or growing facility unless they possess a valid Medical Marijuana Registry Card issued by the State of Michigan or another state.
- 5. All employees of a medical marijuana dispensary and/or growing facility shall have a valid primary caregiver card or a valid qualifying patient card issued by the State of Michigan.
- 6. The cultivation, manufacturing, growing, packaging, storing or distribution of marijuana shall not occur in connection with or at a location at which any other commodity, product or service is also available.
- 7. A facility that is limited to selling or dispensing medical marijuana shall provide detailed information regarding the growing facility from which it receives its stock of medical marijuana and illustrate the lawful connection between the source product grower and the dispensary's primary caregivers.
- 8. Marijuana shall not be smoked, eaten or otherwise consumed at any dispensary or growing facility.
- 9. The owner of a medical marijuana dispensary and/or growing facility who violates these sections shall be liable for all costs associated with the investigation, prosecution and enforcement of that violation.
- **C. Site Plan Requirements.** A site plan shall be submitted, conforming to all requirements of Article 29 of the City Zoning Ordinance and which shall include the following:
 - 1. Security system details which shall include, at the minimum, audible and silent alarms and video surveillance cameras.
 - 2. Details regarding the building electrical system, power demands of specialized lighting and other necessary equipment, and method proposed to prevent excessive heat build-up and risk of fire within the building.

- 3. Ventilation equipment details, including fresh air intake and filtration of exhaust air to prevent offensive odors from leaving the site.
- 4. Proposed methods for controlling insects within the building and preventing insects from becoming a nuisance or health hazard off the site.
- 5. Anticipated quantity of water to be used by any proposed hydroponics growing system(s), anticipated quantity of wastewater to be generated, and method for treating and properly discharging wastewater so as not to become a hazard or nuisance to nearby properties.
- 6. A description of the operation of the dispensary or growing facility in sufficient detail to permit the City to determine if the operation, as described, would be lawful and fully compliant with the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of 2008.

D. Inspections and Fees.

- 1. An application and review fee, established from time to time by resolution of the City Council, shall accompany each application for approval of a medical marijuana dispensary and/or growing facility.
- 2. Approved medical marijuana dispensaries and/or growing facilities shall submit annual permit renewal and facility inspection fees in amounts set by the City Council by resolution.
- 3. All approved medical marijuana dispensaries and/or growing facilities shall permit authorized City zoning and building inspection and/or law enforcement personnel to make unannounced, inspections for purposes of verifying compliance with all requirements of the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act of 2008 (MCL 333.26421, et seq.) and the City Zoning Ordinance, and any reasonable conditions placed upon the special land use permit by the City Council.

Resolution To Impose Moratorium on Medical Marijuana Caregiver Establishments

Resolution No. 110223-01

(Carried)

Motion by Councilmember Hurt Second by Mayor Pro-Tem Krueger

WHEREAS, the City of Swartz Creek Michigan, by Ordinance, has prohibited the possession or use of marijuana, as well as the sale, display, furnishing, supplying or possession of controlled substance paraphernalia; and

WHEREAS, the use, possession, cultivation, manufacture or sale of marijuana remains a crime under the Laws of the State of Michigan, the United States of America as a Schedule 1 drug under the Michigan Public Health Code and by the Treaty of 1980, entitled: Convention of Psychotropic Substances, and it is illegal to operate a motor vehicle with any amount of THC in an individual's blood system; and

WHEREAS, the people of the State of Michigan by referendum have provided that there shall not be criminal prosecution for the medical use of marijuana in limited and specific ways as provided in MCLA 333.26421 et seq; and

WHEREAS, the City of Swartz Creek Michigan believes that in light of potential adverse effects upon its citizens, by the use of medical marijuana that could affect the public safety, health and welfare, if certain controls were not placed as to where or how such medical marijuana use is carried out; and

WHEREAS, the Swartz Creek City Council believes that its Ordinances will require amendment to comply with the Michigan Medical Marijuana Act (MMMA) and to regulate certain conduct by medical marijuana users and their caregivers; and

WHEREAS, the Swartz Creek City Council believes that the location in which medical marijuana caregivers provide care to medical marijuana patients requires regulation to avoid any harmful impact on the citizens by the placement or concentration of medical marijuana caregivers, within the ambit of the Zoning Ordinances of the City of Swartz Creek.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Swartz Creek City Council by this Resolution determines to place a moratorium upon the establishment of caregiver facilities within its City Limits for a period of ninety (90) days, to allow the City Council to consider amendments to its Zoning Ordinances and to its Drug Control Ordinances. It is the intent of the City to maintain a land use status quo pending final adoption of any proposed zoning plan or changes regarding Michigan medical marijuana caregivers as defined in MCLA 333.26421 et seq. (MMMA).

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that in compliance with section 32.15 of the zoning code for the City of Swartz Creek, this moratorium shall be effective immediately upon publication of this resolution in a newspaper of general circulation, date of publication February 24, 2011.

American Society of Addiction Medicine Rejects Use of 'Medical Marijuana,' Citing Dangers and Failure To Meet Standards of Patient Care

Cannabis Should Be Subjected to the Standards of Federal Regulators Rather than to Voters' Whims at the Ballot Box

CHEVY CHASE, Md., March 23, 2011 /PRNewswire-USNewswire/ -- Citing the dangers of marijuana, the lack of clinical research on a controlled substance with a high potential for abuse, and the physician's oath to "first, do no harm," the American Society of Addiction Medicine (ASAM) today issued a white paper recommending a halt to using the weed as a medicine in states where it has been declared legal.

The organization—considered the nation's leading professional society of physicians involved in addiction prevention, treatment, research, education, and public policy—supports the need for federal regulatory standards for drug approval and distribution, and discourages state interference in the federal medication-approval process. "Our policy statement is a careful attempt to put marijuana into proper perspective," said Louis E. Baxter, Sr., MD, FASAM, President and Board Chair, American Society of Addiction Medicine. "We do not recognize this as a 'medication,' having not gone through an official FDA-approval process. As experts in addiction medicine, we reject having its use as such foisted upon us to effectively regulate a non-FDA-approved substance to administer as medicine. We also advise physicians against recommending it, as it is, and possibly forsaking the Hippocratic Oath of 'first do no harm."

Currently, laws in 15 states and the District of Columbia allow the use of so-called "medical marijuana." This has resulted in a patchwork system that lacks the patient safeguards normally associated with the appropriate clinical use of psychoactive substances, ASAM policy asserts.

"The informal network puts physicians in an untenable position as gatekeepers to a controlled substance still deemed illicit by the federal government," said Dr. Andrea G. Barthwell, former President of ASAM and a principal advisor to President George W. Bush on policies aimed at reducing the demand for illicit drugs. "We urge physicians to reject this role, and remind those who recommend cannabis that they could fail to meet their professional obligations to patients and possibly have their license revoked."

She added: "The safety and advisability of any prescriptive medicine should depend on years of careful scientific scrutiny, not whims at the ballot box by individuals who lack the qualifications to make such decisions. Allowing cannabis to circumvent FDA approval sets a dangerous precedent and puts us on a slippery slope."

According to her ASAM colleague, Robert L. DuPont, MD, who helped develop the society's public policy: "Marijuana is not the harmless herb many believe it is, but a powerful drug with a variety of effects. It can produce adverse mental, emotional, behavioral and physical changes, and contrary to popular notions, it is addictive. Of the 7.1 million Americans age 12 and older with a substance use disorder related to an illicit drug in 2009, 4.3 million or 60.5 percent were dependent on or abused marijuana. Marijuana was by far the most commonly reported drug of abuse among this population, and nearly equal to all other illegal drugs combined." Dr. DuPont was the first Director of the National Institute on Drug Abuse and the second White House Drug Chief, in the Nixon and Ford Administrations.

Marijuana is generally smoked, and that is dangerous, Dr. DuPont said. Its smoke contains many of components of tobacco smoke, and smoking marijuana can deposit up to four times the amount of tar in the lungs as cigarettes, in part because marijuana smokers inhale deeply and hold their breath.

"We are accumulating knowledge about the body's cannabinoid receptor system. ASAM recommends developing ways to manipulate the system with standardized preparations or single molecules to usher in a new era of medical treatments," he said. As yet, however, "medical marijuana" lacks quality control and standardization, can be contaminated with pesticides and microbes, and does not assure patients a reliable and reproducible dose. Despite this, cannabis dispensaries are proliferating in many states without regulation, distributing products about which little is known. "If physicians were treating patients with other untested substances, there would be a public outcry," Dr. Barthwell said.

"Without a foundation of rigorous data developed in proper clinical trials and published in peer reviewed journals, no cannabis product can gain entrance into the physician's armamentarium and thereby become available to patients as a legitimate option among various treatment choices. And ironically, continued legalized usage undermines any reason to put cannabis-based products through the FDA approval process."

Marijuana made headlines when Californians voted to legalize its use for medical treatment in 1996. Fourteen more states and the District of Columbia have followed suit. As a result, thousands of people, including youths, have

unfettered access to the drug.

Marijuana is the nation's most commonly used illicit drug. More than 94 million Americans (40% of the U.S. population) have tried it at least once, according to the 2003 National Survey on Drug Use and Health.

- B) Prolonged illness in immediate family. Leave shall be provided for in accordance with the Federal Family and Medical Leave Act of 1993.
- C) Personal leave. Upon receipt of a written request stating bona fide reasons for a personal leave of absence, such leave may be granted to a seniority employee for a period not to exceed thirty (30) days. Such leave will be without pay and seniority will accumulate during this thirty (30) day period. Any such leaves that are requested, and subsequently granted, for more than 30 days, or more than once per fiscal year per employee shall be without pay, benefits or the accumulation of seniority.
- D) Educational leave. Employees who have acquired two (2) or more years of seniority, and who desire to further their education in line with their employment, shall be granted a leave of absence, without pay, not to exceed two (2) years. Seniority will accumulate during such leave. The entire period covered by such leave must be used in attending school.

SECTION NO. 20 - SICK/ACCIDENT COVERAGE AND ABSENT LEAVE

A) Short and long term disability. A sick, accident or disability insurance policy, consisting of Short Term Disability (STD, 26 weeks or less), and Long Term Disability (LTD, 180 days to 24 months) will be provided to each full time employee under the age of sixtyfive (65). Coverage shall commence upon hospitalization, accident or on the eighth consecutive day of sickness, whichever occurs first. Any other lost time not covered within the first eight days of STD or LTD shall be taken by the employee as paid time off (vacation, absent or sick leave), or dock time. Benefits will be paid in the amount of sixty (60%) percent of the employee's gross biweekly wage not to exceed One-Thousand and Three Hundred (\$1,300) Dollars in any biweekly period. Such sick. accident or disability coverage will be provided without cost to the employee, and an employee while on sick leave will be eligible for all other benefits provided by this agreement; however, such benefits shall be determined upon the basis of the employee's rate of pay at the time of inception of the sick, accident or disability leave. Increases in salary as provided by this contract shall not operate to increase sick and accident benefits unless and until the employee shall have worked following the effective date of any such increase. Employees sixty-five years old or older shall not be eligible for this coverage.

Sick and accident insurance benefits shall be effective the first day of the month, after 90 full days of service, following the date of hire.

B) Absent Leave. Seniority employees will be allowed to be absent from work up to ninety-six (96) hours during the calendar year. Such absent leave shall be earned at the rate of eight hours leave per calendar month worked; provided, however, that seniority employees shall be credited with ninety-six (96) hours of absent leave on January first of each year for use during that calendar year. If said employee terminates employment during said calendar year and has used more absent leave hours than he or she has earned as of the date of termination, said employee shall reimburse the employer for the excess absent leave used. Absent leave will be prorated on all new hires following

- completion of probation and/or termination, at the rate of eight hours per calendar month of service.
- C) Advance approval. All absent leaves shall be approved in advance by the employee's immediate supervisor and shall be used in increments of no less than one (1) hour. Employees who are absent due to illness shall give notice to their immediate supervisor and give said supervisor reasonable continuing information relative to the expected length of such absence. Prior to the return from any absent leave, the Employer may require medical documentation that the employee is capable of performing his or her job description.
- D) Unused absent leave. If, at the end of a calendar year, an employee has unused absent leave, the employee shall be paid for said absent leave, up to a maximum of seventy-two (72) hours. Such payment shall be made by the employer on the 2nd pay day in January of the next calendar year. Such payment shall be based on said employees hourly wage in effect on the first day of the calendar year during which the unused absent leave is to be paid. No unused absent leave may be carried over for use in a subsequent calendar year.
- E) Probationary employees. Absent leave provisions for probationary employees are subject to Section 10, Paragraph C and D of this Agreement.

SECTION NO. 21 - FUNERAL LEAVE

- A) Funeral leave hours pursuant to this Section are for the express purpose of arrangements and attendance at a funeral. Approved leave hours pursuant to this Section shall not be deducted from the employee's absent or vacation leave unless such deduction is specifically provided for.
- B) An employee shall be allowed to be off from work a maximum of thirty-two (32) hours with pay, per death, beginning with the day of death and terminating with the day of the funeral, as funeral leave, for a death in the immediate family. The immediate family is defined as: The employee's Mother, Father, Brother, Sister, Spouse, Son, Daughter, Step-Daughter, Step-Son, Daughter-In-Law, Son-In-Law, Brother-In-Law, Sister-In-Law, Grandparents, Granddaughter, Grandson, Grandparents of employee's spouse, Mother-In-Law, Father-In-Law, Stepmother or Stepfather.
- C) Employees shall be allowed to be off from work the time necessary, up to a maximum of eight (8) hours with pay, to attend the funeral of a relative. Relative is defined as: The employee's Uncle, Aunt, Spouse's Aunt and Uncle, Niece or Nephew.
- D) Upon request, the City Manager, or his or her designee, may authorize funeral leave, up to 8 hours, for the attendance of a(n) employee(s) at the funeral for a deceased or retired city employee or elected official.
- E) If a funeral for a member of the employee's immediate family or relative is held at a location 150 miles or more from the City of Swartz Creek, two (2) travel days may be authorized; provided, however, such travel days are deducted from the employee's

CHARTER § 8.5

Section 8.2. Budget procedure.

Not later than the first day of February of each year, each officer, department, and board of the city shall submit to the City Manager an itemized estimate of its expected income and expenditures during the next fiscal year for the department or activities under its control. The City Manager shall compile such information and list the same upon a budget proposal form. He shall review such budget requests, and in a column parallel to and adjacent to that containing such budget requests, shall enter his budgetary recommendations for each item requested by the several officers and departments, with such additions thereto and deletions therefrom as he shall deem proper. Not later than the first meeting of the Council in April of each year, he shall submit to the Council a recommended budget for the next fiscal year which, considering any anticipated unexpended balance or deficit at the end of the current fiscal year, is within the tax limit and other anticipated revenue of the city. In addition to the foregoing information, such recommended budget shall include therein at least the following information:

- (1) The detailed estimates of the City Manager, with supporting explanation, of proposed expenditures for each office, department, and board of the city, with a comparison of the actual appropriations for corresponding items for the last preceding fiscal year, in full, and the appropriations for the current fiscal year, together with the expenditures for such year to January first, and estimated expenditures for the balance of the current fiscal year;
- (2) Statements of the bonded and other indebtedness of the city, showing the debt redemption and interest requirements, the debt authorized and unissued, and the condition of sinking funds, if any;
- (3) Detailed estimates of all anticipated revenues of the city from sources other than taxes, with a comparative statement of the amounts established for and actually received from each of the same or similar sources for the last preceding fiscal year in full, for the current fiscal year to January first, and

- estimated revenues therefrom for the balance of the current fiscal year;
- (4) A statement of the estimated accumulated cash and unencumbered balances, or deficits, at the end of the current fiscal year;
- (5) An estimate of the amount of money to be raised from taxes to be levied, from delinquent taxes, and the amount to be raised from bond issues which, together with available unappropriated funds and any revenues from other sources, will be necessary to meet the proposed expenditures.

Section 8.3. Public inspection of budget proposal.

The budget proposal of the City Manager, together with his recommendations and its supporting schedules and information shall be available for public inspection in the office of the Clerk.

Section 8.4. Budget hearing.

A public hearing on the budget proposal shall be held not less than one week before its final adoption, at such time as the Council shall direct. Notice of the public hearing shall be published by the Clerk at least one week in advance thereof.

Section 8.5. Adoption of budget.

- (a) At a regular meeting held not later than the third Monday in May of each year, the Council shall, by resolution, adopt a budget for the ensuing fiscal year and make an appropriation of the money needed therefor. Such resolution shall designate the sum to be raised by taxation for the general purposes of the city and for the payments of principal and interest on its indebtedness. Failure to adopt such resolution within the time herein set shall not invalidate either the budget or the tax levy therefor.
- (b) A copy of the appropriations for each fiscal year, certified by the Clerk, shall be furnished to the Finance Officer within ten days after the date of the adoption of the budget resolution.
- (c) In the event that the Council shall not adopt a budget for any fiscal year by the first Monday in June preceding the commencement of such fis-

cal year, the budget proposal for that year, as presented to the Council by the City Manager, in accordance with the provisions of this chapter, shall be deemed to be the budget for that fiscal year, and there shall be an appropriation therefor, without the necessity of Council action.

State law reference—Mandatory that Charter provide for an annual appropriation, MCL 117.3(h), MSA 5.2073(h).

Section 8.6. Budget control.

- (a) Except for purposes which are to be financed by the issuance of bonds or by special assessments, no money shall be drawn from the treasury of the city, except in accordance with an appropriation for such purpose, nor shall any obligation for the expenditure of money be incurred without an appropriation covering all payments which will be due under such obligation during the fiscal year. The Council, upon the written recommendation of the City Manager and by the affirmative vote of not less than five of its members, may appropriate unappropriated funds or transfer any unencumbered appropriation balance, including the contingent account of the general fund of the city, or any portion thereof, from any budget item or account, department, or agency to another.
- (b) Expenditures shall not be charged directly to any contingent or general account. Instead, the necessary amount of the appropriation from such account shall be transfered to the appropriate budget item or account and the expenditure then charged thereto.
- (c) During each month, the City Manager shall submit to the Council data showing the relation between the estimated and actual revenues and expenditures to the end of the preceding month; and, if it shall appear that the revenues are less than anticipated, the Council may, by resolution, reduce appropriations, except amounts required for debt and interest charges, to such a degree as may be necessary to keep expenditures within the revenues.
- (d) Within thirty days following the end of each fiscal year, the City Manager shall file with the Council a schedule of all encumbrances upon the budget appropriations existing at the end of the fiscal year, with his recommendations thereon, and the Council shall provide for the payment of

such thereof as constitute valid claims against the city from corresponding budget items from the then current fiscal year.

Section 8.7. Special accounts.

- (a) The Council may, by ordinance, establish and maintain accounts for accumulating moneys to be used for acquiring, extending, altering, constructing, or repairing public improvements and for the purchase of equipment of any type, in each case either for a specific item or items or for future unspecified public improvements or equipment, or both.
- (b) Appropriations to such accounts may be made by the Council either in the annual appropriation resolution or, from time to time during the fiscal year, from available funds, from whatever source derived, which are not required for other appropriations or obligations of the city. Such accounts shall be continuing accounts and the balances therein at the end of each fiscal year shall remain a part thereof.
- (c) Moneys which are accumulated for the purpose of public improvements, as set forth in subsection (a) hereof, shall be used only at the direction of the Council, and only for the purpose provided in the original ordinance establishing such account, unless their use for some other municipal purpose be authorized by a majority vote of the electors of the city who vote on the proposition to amend such ordinance to provide for a change in the use of the moneys in such account. After the purpose of any such account has been fulfilled, any balance remaining therein may be transferred by the Council to any other special account or to the general fund of the city.
- (d) Moneys which are accumulated for the purpose of purchasing equipment, as set forth in subsection (a) hereof, shall be expended only for the purpose provided in the ordinance establishing any such account, or as such ordinance may be amended from time to time, and, when no longer required for such purpose, such moneys or any part thereof, may be transferred to the general fund by a resolution adopted by the affirmative vote of not less than five members of the Council.

Section 8.8. Withdrawal of city moneys.

- (a) Unless otherwise provided by law or by ordinance, all moneys drawn from the treasury shall be drawn pursuant to the authority and appropriation of the Council. The Council, where necessary to expedite operating procedures, may authorize, in writing, other officers and employees of the city to make minor disbursements from petty cash accounts, which disbursements shall be accounted for and shall be audited by the Finance Officer.
- (b) Checks or warrants for the disbursement of city funds shall be signed by the Finance Officer and countersigned by the Treasurer.
- (c) Checks may be issued prior to authorization by the Council for such purposes and up to such amounts as the Council shall provide by ordinance.

Section 8.9. Notice to city for claim for injuries.

The City shall not be liable in damages for injury to person or property by reason of negligence of the city, its officers or employees, or by reason of any defective highway, public work, public service improvement, or facility of the city, or by reason of any obstruction, ice, snow, or other encumbrance thereone [thereon], unless, within sixty days after such injury occurred, the person damaged or his representative causes a written notice to be served upon an officer of the city upon whom process may be served by law. Such notice shall state that such person intends to hold the city liable for such damages, and shall set forth substantially the time and place of the injury, the manner in which it occurred, the nature of the act or defect complained of, the extent of the injury so far as known, and the names and addresses of witnesses known to the claimant. No person shall bring action against the city for damages to person or property arising out of any of the reasons or circumstances aforesaid, unless brought within the period prescribed by law, nor unless he has first presented to the Clerk a claim in writing and under oath, setting forth specifically the nature and extent of the injury and the amount of damages claimed. The Clerk shall present such claim to the Council for action. It shall be a sufficient bar to any action upon any such claim that the notice of injury and the claim in writing under

oath, required by this section, were not filed within the time and in the manner herein provided.

State law reference—City liability for injury on public ways, MCL 691.1401 et seq., MSA 3.996(101) et seq.

Section 8.10. Municipal borrowing power.

- (a) Subject to the applicable provisions of law, the city may borrow money for any purpose within the scope of its powers or which may be permitted by law, and may issue bonds or other evidence of indebtedness therefor. Such bonds or other evidences of indebtedness shall include, but not be limited to, the following types:
 - (1) General obligation bonds, the principal and interest of which are payable from taxes levied upon the taxable real and personal property in the city and for the payment of which the full faith and credit of the city are pledged, upon authority of a three-fifths vote of the constitutionally qualified electors of the city voting thereon;
 - (2) Special assessment bonds which are issued in anticipation of the payment of special assessments for the purpose of defraying the cost of any one or more public improvements, which bonds shall be either solely or obligation of the special assessment district, or both an obligation of the special assessment district and a general obligation of the city as the Council may determine;
 - (3) Revenue bonds, as authorized by law, which are secured only by the revenues from a public improvement and do not constitute a general obligation of the city;
 - (4) Mortgage bonds, as authorized by law, for the acquiring, owning, purchasing, constructing, improving, or operating of any public utility which the city is authorized by law to finance in this manner;
- (5) Bonds issued in anticipation of future payments from the Motor Vehicle Highway Fund or any other fund of the State which the city may be permitted by law to pledge for the payment of the principal and interest thereof;

- (6) Water main extension bonds, in an amount not to exceed one percent of the assessed valuation of all real and personal property in the city, for the payment of which the full faith and credit of the city are pledged for the refunding from time to time of moneys advanced or paid on special assessments imposed for water main extensions as buildings are connected with such extensions, which bonds shall be payable in not more than thirty years, with interest thereon at a rate which shall not exceed six per cent per annum;
- (7) Tax anticipation notes, which may be issued in anticipation of the collection of taxes in or during the current or next succeeding fiscal years of the city or any other years permitted by law, in the manner and subject to any limitations provided by law;
- (8) Calamity bonds, issued in case of fire, flood, or other calamity for the relief of the inhabitants of the city and for the preservation of municipal property, in a sum not to exceed three-eighths of one percent of the assessed value of the real and personal property in the city, which shall become due in not more than five years.
- (b) All collections on special assessment rolls or on any combination of such rolls shall be set apart in a separate fund and shall be used for the purpose for which levied, and for the payment of the principal of and interest on bonds issued in anticipation of such special assessments. As to such of said bonds as are also a general obligation of the city, if there is any deficiency in any special assessment fund to meet the payment of the principal or interest to be paid therefrom, moneys shall be advanced from the general funds of the city to meet such deficiency, and shall be placed in the general funds when the special assessment fund shall be sufficient therefor.
- (c) Each bond or other evidence of indebtedness shall contain on its face a statement specifying the purpose for which the same is issued, and the proceeds thereof shall not be used for any other purpose, except that, whenever the proceeds of any bond issue, or a part thereof, remain unexpended and unencumbered for the purpose for

which said bond issue was made, the Council may, by the concurring vote of not less than five members, authorize the use of such unexpended and unencumbered funds:

- (1) For the retirement of such bond issue, or
- (2) If such bond issue has been fully retired, then for the retirement of other bonds or obligations of the city provided for by this section: Provided, that in the case of special assessment bonds, such funds shall be refunded to the owners of property against which special assessments therefor were made, pro rata according to payments made toward the total cost of the improvement for which the bonds were issued, and
- (3) If there be no other bonded indebtedness, other than for special assessment bonds, then for such other purposes as may be permitted by law, subject to the proviso in paragraph (2) above.
- (d) No bond or other evidence of indebtedness, regardless of type or purpose, shall bear interest at a rate exceeding that fixed by law.
- (e) All bonds and other evidences of indebtedness shall be signed by the Mayor and countersigned by the Clerk, under the seal of the city. Interest coupons may be executed with the facsimile signatures of the Mayor and Clerk. A complete and detailed record of all bonds and other evidences of indebtedness shall be kept by the Finance Officer. Upon the payment of any bond or other evidence of indebtedness, the same shall be marked "Cancelled" or otherwise defaced by the Finance Officer to indicate payment.

State law references—City authority to borrow money on the credit of the city and issue bonds therefor, MCL 117.4a(1), MSA 5.2074(1); city authority to borrow money and issue bonds therefor in anticipation of the payment of special assessments, MCL 117.4a(2), MSA 5.2074(2); municipal finance act, MCL 131.1 et seq., MSA 5.3188(1) et seq.

Section 8.11. Limitations upon borrowing power.

(a) The net bonded indebtedness incurred for all public purposes shall not at any time exceed ten per cent of the assessed value of all the real and personal property in the city: Provided, that in computing such net bonded indebtedness, there CHARTER § 9.2

shall be excluded money borrowed under the provisions of Section 8.10(a), clauses (2) to (7), inclusive, of this chapter. The resources of the sinking fund pledged for the retirement of any outstanding bonds shall also be deducted from the amount of the bonded indebtedness.

(b) No bonds shall be sold to obtain funds for any purpose, other than that for which they were specifically authorized, and if such bonds are not sold within three years after authorization such authorization shall be null and void.

State law reference—Limitations on net bonded indebtedness incurred for all public purposes, MCL 117.4a(1), MSA 5.2074(1).

Section 8.12. Depositories.

The Council shall designate depositories for city funds in accordance with law, and shall provide for the regular deposit of all city moneys.

State law references—Designation of depositories, MCL 129.12, MSA 3.752; deposit of public moneys, MCL 211.43b, MSA 7.86.

Section 8.13. Independent audit.

An independent audit shall be made of all accounts of the city government at the close of each fiscal year, and shall be completed within ninety days thereafter. Special independent audits may be made at any time that the Council may designate. All such audits shall be made to the Council by a Certified Public Accountant designated by it. Each audit and reports supplemental thereto shall be made public in the manner that the Council determines and copies thereof shall be placed in the office of the Clerk, and the Swartz Creek Library.

Section 8.14. Annual report.

The City Manager shall prepare an annual report of the affairs of the city, after completion of the annual audit. The report shall include condensed financial statements showing the results of all city operations, including statements for each public utility owned or operated by the city. Copies of such report shall be made available for public inspection and distribution at the office of the Clerk and by such other method as the Council may determine.

CHAPTER 9. TAXATION*

Section 9.1. Power to tax-Tax limit.

The city shall have the power to assess taxes and to lay and collect rents, tolls, and excises. During the first five years of the existence of the city, the annual general ad valorem tax levy for municipal purposes shall not exceed one-half of one per cent (5 mills) of the assessed value of all real and personal property in the city as determined by the City's Assessor and Board of Review, or one-quarter of one per cent (21/2 mills) of such assessed value, as equalized by the State of Michigan, as required by law, whichever basis of limitation will result in the lesser taxation upon the taxable property in the city. Thereafter, the levy shall not exceed one per cent of the said assessed value as determined by the City's Assessor and Board of Review, or one-half of one percent (5 mills) of such value as equalized by the State of Michigan, as required by law, whichever basis of limitation will result in the lesser taxation upon the taxable property in the city, unless the proposition to approve an increase above the tax rate so limited is first approved by the electors of the city. No such increase shall cause the total tax rate to exceed two per cent of the assessed value of all real and personal property in the city.

State law reference—Mandatory that Charter provide for annually levying and collecting taxes, MCL 117.3(g), MSA 5.2073(g).

Section 9.2. Subjects of taxation—Tax procedure.

- (a) The subjects of ad valorem taxation for municipal purposes shall be the same as for state, county, and school purposes under the general law.
- (b) Except as otherwise provided by this chapter, city taxes shall be assessed, levied, and collected in the manner provided by law.

State law references—Mandatory that Charter provide that subject of taxation for municipal purposes shall be the same as for state, county and school purposes under general law, MCL 117.3(f), MSA 5.2073(f); property subject to taxation, MCL 211.1 et seq., MSA 7.1 et seq.

Dear Paul,

I was shocked when I saw the most recent water and sewer bill for Sports Creek Raceway had increased by 216% over the bill we had paid for the same quarter a year ago. Upon examination it revealed the vast majority of the increase was due to the water and sewer readiness charges. Our bill for the quarter had jumped from \$3002.95 a year ago to the current bill for \$9489.10

With the steady decline in our business I have been trying to keep our expenses under control in an effort to keep our operation viable. I know that the volume to our water and sewer usage has dropped significantly from the early years of the track's operation. These facts make the dramatic increase in our water and sewer even more difficult to accept.

We hope that serious consideration will be given to adjusting the water and sewage billing for Sports Creek Raceway to a special usage rate similar to the previous industrial rate we once had.


