☐ MILLER ROAD PROJECT, ELMS-TALLMADGE (Status)

The contractor is Cadillac Asphalt LLC of Wixom Michigan, bid amount of \$507,816.54. This project also includes the extension and widening of Elms Road for the Family Farm & Home Project and the removal of the concrete traffic island on Miller between I-69 and Elms. We also appropriated an additional amount of \$16k at the meeting of June 27th, for concrete repairs east of the intersection. Work is underway, ahead of schedule and to date, slightly under cost. Unless Council has any objections, if additional funds from the proposed work become available, we will use them for concrete repairs east of the intersection. Here are the latest cost assumptions for this project:

As a re-cap, the contractor's are Maintenance & Construction Company, of Romulus Michigan, at \$101,547, with construction engineering and testing (\$1,980), the total being \$103,527, and Lang Construction of Flint Michigan, in the amount of \$8,523 for the storm sewer repairs. Totals are:

The work has been completed. Take a look at the streets we did if you get the time. We are looking into this process as a potential repair for some of the village streets, if we can find the funds. On another note, when the final slurry coat was applied, we neglected to give advance notice to residents, which in turn caused discomfort for some. We've been apologizing and will work to see that this doesn't happen in the future.

☐ SEWER I&I PENALTIES, REHABILITATION (Resolution)

Included with tonight's agenda is a resolution to begin Phase IV of the sewer re-hab program. This phase will perform a mixture of re-lining, video and jetting of sewer lines along Winshall Drive. As you may recall from past discussions, this was originally planned as a six year program. The economy caused us to scale it back wherein it may take ten or so years to complete the village section. I think we're good though as long as we continue some reasonable forward progress. Additionally, we slowed down re-lining work to become a bit more aggressive on the manhole work. The reason for this is that by repairing the chimney's in the structures located within ditch's that held standing water, the result in stopping surface water from entering the sanitary system is significant. We've pretty much taken care of all of the high exposure manholes in ditches in Winchester Woods and along Bristol Road. At any rate, we scaled back work to meet a cost that we feel is comfortable, being \$82,492.50.

☐ SEWER USE ORDINANCE – INDUSTRIAL PRE-TREATMENT (Status)

The ordinance, or a reference thereof, needs to be advertised. A soon as this occurs, it will go into effect within 30 days afterward.

✓ MARATHON REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT (Status)

As we discussed, the staff is proceeding with the drafting of an RFP - Development Agreement to transfer the property under stipulation and conditions. I've informed Marathon of our position. They advise that the MI-DNRE has denied their permit for a "facility closure" and the company may desire to do some additional work on the site. I informed them that we would assist to whatever extent we could. I'll keep the Council informed on progress.

✓ PERSONNEL & POLICIES & PROCEDURES (Status)

I know it's been a while on this (actually, quite a while). Not to make excuses, but it's been a wild ride here since late 2007 just to stay above water. I've made a good dent into finishing this and should have it in the near future.

✓ SALE OF CITY PROPERTY 5129 MORRISH ROAD (Status)

Pending a report back to the Council with recommendation on the structure as well as the house the City owns at Morrish & Fortino.

✓ LABOR CONTRACTS (Status)

As a short re-cap, all our labor contracts are frozen. The POLC agreement has been frozen since January 2009. The AFSCME agreement has been frozen since July 2008. The Supervisor's agreement has been frozen since July 2007, however, to even this agreement out a bit, an additional 40 hours of absent time was granted. The extra absent time cannot be cashed out, rolled over, accrued or paid out in any way. The City Manager Contract has been frozen since December 2004. The extra absent time provision within the Supervisor's agreement is also applied to the City Manager's Contract. There are no plans to replace Mr. Zettel's position. We have two other "at will" classifications, which are without agreements, being our part time police officers and our building inspector. The part time police have been frozen since March 2004 with a change in November 2009 to allow time and a half on holidays. The building inspector is part time and has remained unchanged since October 2006 when the position was established to replace the full time assessor / building inspector. Contracted positions are the assessor and trade inspector's, being electrical, plumbing and mechanical. With Adam leaving we have a problem with Zoning Administration, Code Enforcement, and to a lesser degree, DDA, Planning Commission and CDBG administration. I am currently working on a solution to this.

✓ FIRE DEPARTMENT: 2011 BUDGET & COST RECOVERY (Status)

The 2011 Budget was adopted at the meeting of November 22, minus CIP contributions. As indicated, we are looking at long term solutions to all public safety. The cost recovery issue plays into this, however, it is in a state of flux based on the introduction of legislation that may prohibit such ordinances. The legislation has been stalled in committee. On the cost recovery, we'll watch it for a while to see where it heads. Regarding the agreement, the Fire Board has proposed some changes to the contract. I have met with the Township on the agreement, but for now, it appears stalled. The contract expired April 1st; however, there is a roll-over clause that allows continuation. I hope to have a draft for Council review soon. Additionally, we have a capital request to replace a grass fire rig. I'll add it to the list of items that need resolve with the Township.

✓ NEIGHBORHOOD STABILIZATION PROGRAM (Status) Pending.

✓ GO GREEN, EECBG PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING HVAC GRANT (Status)

The system has been installed. We are in the process of reconciling submittals to the state for re-imbursement.

✓ SPRINGBROOK EAST & HERITAGE ASSOCIATION S.A.D. (Resolutions)

The last step in the process will take place tonight. Starting our business agenda is a public hearing on the assessment roll for each association, followed by a resolution of determination and order for warrant and collection. In the interest of keeping things moving, I have also included a resolution to award the bid to Ace Asphalt and execute an agreement. The last item on this will be to set up the finances and bring them back for final approval. They will be back in two weeks for Council review and resolution. The schedule is as follows:

On another note, we are looking at using these time and material prices to perform other repairs. There are two areas on Major Streets that are very distressed, Fairchild at Miller and Winston at Miller. We are also going to look at some repairs to the Public Safety Lot.

✓ WASTE & RECYCLING SERVICES CONTRACT (Status)

I have a draft agreement close to ready that will be back at the next meeting. Containers have been delivered with a number of complaints, primarily senior citizens with low trash output, on the size. Complaints should all be resolved this week.

✓ **SIGN ORDINANCE** (Information)

Adam tells me that the date on this was extended to 2012 when we adopted our Appendix A. Either way, maybe later into the summer when we get past the budget season, we can talk about some solutions here.

✓ SHARED SERVICES INITIATIVE (Resolution)

As a bit of history on this subject, after a number of meetings with Flint, Clayton and Mundy Township's, three out of four have decided to proceed to the next step, being consultant services to quantify feasibility. Among the current committee, being Supervisor Karyn Miller (Flint Township), Supervisor Dave Guigear (Mundy Township) and myself, a high degree of enthusiasm is present to take a hard look at this. We've bounced around a number of scenarios and we all concur that long-term funding for public safety (police and fire) is on the forefront. A half step behind are other services, such as assessing and building, that we should also study. We quickly arrived at the

conclusion that none of the communities involved have either the expertise or the objectivity to undertake such an evaluation. In discussions though, we learned that all three of the participating communities used the same auditing firm, being Plante-Moran. Plante-Moran is a national and international company in which the Detroit office offers a wide range of expert business and government services, such as what we seek here. It seemed a logical step to seek assistance through them. Respective attorneys for the municipalities agreed. We met with Plante-Moran staff who outlined specifics of what their company could provide. From this point, we set the meeting with the three municipalities on July 20th.

Although it may have appeared that the meeting was rough, I was pleased with the results. Whether we are able to proceed to the study phase as a group of three or not, both Flint and Mundy Townships do recognize that government needs to change. Hurdles for such an undertaking are huge. Orchestrating a change in some fifty or one hundred years of institution, tradition, practice and custom is enormous. As for the City, we do need to explore the option of shared or consolidation of services before we can move on to any other solutions. I'm doubtful that the MML will have any funds left for such a study. From the beginning, funding was limited. From what I see, there are many municipal governments across the state in the same position as we are. I suspect that these funds may be significantly tapped. We are pursuing a couple of different directions for assistance with the cost of the study, but, realistically speaking, if the cost to us is \$9k or \$18k, it makes little difference. It's not the cost. It's the pursuit of solutions. If the differential was \$9K to \$100k, it might be different. At any rate, I have this up for a vote tonight. Supervisor Guigear will be taking it up tonight as well. Supervisor Miller will be taking it up with her board on August 8th. As a side note, Mark Nottley contacted me and advised he had recently completed a similar study in the Muskegon Area. As you may recall, Mr. Nottley was the consultant who performed the Fire Evaluation Study for us in 2007. I have included a copy of his Muskegon area study for your review. I did not print it due to the size. You can find it on the CD. It may give you some insight as to what a finished product might look like.

NEW BUSINESS / PROJECTED ISSUES & PROJECTS

✓ TREES (Information)

I have had a number of calls related to the Flint Journal article on our dead tree problem. Interestingly, a fairly large group of people have called to volunteer to remove the trees, without cost, for the wood. As generous as these offers may sound, the requirements that need to be met in order to perform such work in the public rights of way would rule out most everyone but contractors in that, or a related trade. Nonetheless, appreciation extends for the offers.

Council Questions, Inquiries, Requests and Comments

- □ *Traffic Lights, Bristol-Miller, GM-SPO.* Pending the direction that GM takes. New traffic counts as to warrants would need to be taken.
- Deteriorated Retaining Walls & Planters at City Buildings. Regarding the collapse of the north wall at the Public Safety Building behind the Police Department, we were able to get it repaired for around \$2,000. Badgley Construction is in the process of making the repairs now. There are several other areas in need of repair around this building. For now though, we'll have to monitor them.
- Youth Programs in Park. Looking into this. This item is something that might best be suited for the City's School Liaison Officer. The matter has been referred to the Police Department for review and recommendation.
- □ *Veterans Park Memorial, Street Signs.* We are looking into the purchase of directional street signs.
- □ Deteriorated Consumers' Light Poles, Winchester Village. Looking for solutions for replacement.
- □ Elms Park "Safety" Concerns". The Police Chief is looking into this.

WHEREAS, the City of Swartz Creek ("City") and the Heritage Village Condominium Association entered into that certain Special Assessment District Agreement ("SAD Agreement") dated June 23, 2011; and
WHEREAS , under the SAD Agreement, the City would take over as public streets certain streets within Heritage Village and pave said streets with the full cost of same to be paid for by a special assessment against those properties within the special assessment district benefited by said improvement; and
WHEREAS , in accordance with the SAD Agreement and in further accordance with the City Charter and the Code of Ordinances of the City, on July 11, 2011, the City Council approved the establishment of the Heritage Village Condominium Street Project Special Assessment District No. 1 and directed the city assessor to prepare a special assessment roll for said project; and
WHEREAS following receipt of said special assessment roll, the City Council scheduled a public hearing on said roll to be held on July 25, 2011; and
WHEREAS , due notice of same having been published and mailed as required by law, the City Council has conducted said public hearing.
NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Swartz Creek City Council hereby determines that it is satisfied that the special assessments on the roll have been spread in proportion to the benefits received by the properties in the district; and
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Swartz Creek City Council hereby confirms the special assessment roll for Heritage Village Condominium Street Project Special Assessment District No. 1 and directs that said special assessment roll be placed on file with the city clerk; and
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the city clerk is hereby directed to attach her warrant to the special assessment roll within 10 days from the date hereof; and
BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the city assessor is hereby commended to spread the amounts on the special assessment roll and directs the city treasurer to collect the amounts on the said special assessment roll in full by April 2, 2012, or after that date in five annual installments beginning with the Summer 2012 tax bill and concluding with the Summer 2016 tax bill.

WHEREAS, representatives of the three communities have met with consultants of Plante-Moran, the auditors which represent the City, Flint Township and Mundy Townships, and have asked for a proposal to conduct a feasibility study for the consolidation and/or regionalization of services including, but not necessarily limited to police, fire, assessment and building, Plante - Moran agreeing to submit such a proposal; and

WHEREAS, the committee, along with consultants from Plante – Moran suggest that a joint meeting between the City of Swartz Creek City Council, Flint Township Board and the Mundy Township Board will be a suitable forum to present such a proposal, inclusive of a presentation, discussion and question and answer segment.



PA 312 Reforms Mark Victory for Taxpayers, Will Keep More Police Officers & Firefighters on the Job

LANSING, Mich. – In a huge victory for Michigan taxpayers, the state Senate and House Thursday gave final legislative approval to Public Act 312 reforms that will help local governments maximize public safety resources without jeopardizing collective bargaining rights for police and firefighters.

"By making true reforms to PA 312, the Michigan Legislature has delivered a major victory to taxpayers and to local government officials who now have common sense tools to better manage their budgets," said Samantha Harkins, legislative associate of state affairs for the Michigan Municipal League. "These critical reforms preserve collective bargaining rights for public safety workers and give local governments the authority to negotiate labor agreements based on ability to pay. It's a common sense reform that will keep more police officers and firefighters on the job at a time when Lansing continues to reduce revenue sharing and other funding for essential local services."

Gov. Rick Snyder recently asked the League for reform ideas that would help local communities reduce costs and improve public services. Amending PA 312—the law requiring binding arbitration when a contract impasse is reached between a local unit of government and a public safety union—is vital to making that goal a reality, the League advised Snyder.

Under these reforms, PA 312 defines a community's ability to pay as the number one priority arbitrators must consider when negotiating public safety labor contracts. It means communities will not get stuck with a contract they can't afford. The bill will also limit the arbitration process to six months and requires arbitrators to receive training about the new rules.

"This bill adds fiscal sanity to the arbitration process and is a common sense reform to assist local governments in becoming as efficient as possible," said Dan Gilmartin, Executive Director & CEO of the League.

Summer Minnick, director of state affairs for the League added, "The League has been trying to change PA 312 since it was enacted in 1969, and the years of hard work have resulted in something positive for

all Michigan communities. This is a great example of the state Legislature partnering with local governments for better overall government."

Michigan Communities Score Several Victories in Lansing!

Increase in Revenue Sharing and Bills on PERA, Health Care, Urban Cooperation, Are Victories for Michigan Communities

LANSING, Mich. – Michigan communities will benefit greatly by several bills that moved through the legislative process last week, including <u>an amendment</u> to the Public Employment Relations Act (PERA), an <u>opt-out provision</u> to a health care reform bill and <u>increase funding</u> for revenue sharing. Also moving ahead is a <u>new redevelopment tool</u> to help downtowns and business districts with vacant or burned out properties.

These bills come on the heels of one of the <u>biggest victories</u> for Michigan communities—the passage of reforms to Public Act 312, dealing with binding arbitration for public safety workers. The bills were all before Lansing lawmakers last week and several of them either await a vote in the Senate or will now head to the governor for final passage. The Legislature is now on its summer schedule and is only scheduled to meet one day in July and one day in August before coming back for a full session schedule in September.

"It was a great week for Michigan communities," said <u>Dan Gilmartin</u>, Executive Director and CEO for the Michigan Municipal League. "These bills will benefit Michigan cities, villages and urban townships in a variety of ways, including financially, organizationally and in our communities' ability to make decisions on the local level in the best interests of their citizens."

At the beginning of the year, Gov. Rick Snyder asked the League for reform ideas that would help local communities reduce costs and improve public services, and the bills that passed in the Legislature last week would do that, said League President and Alpena Mayor Carol Shafto.

"I'm so proud of the League's Lansing staff and how they continue to fight on behalf of Michigan communities. Their work in Lansing is invaluable to League members. I also want to thank the legislators

for their hard work and votes to make Michigan better," Shafto said. "While the financial struggles of our cities and state are far from over, these measures will certainly help us rebound and move forward."

<u>Summer Minnick</u>, director of state affairs for the League, said there are other bills in the works that help Michigan communities and the progress made so far illustrates how Michigan lawmakers understand the <u>importance of Michigan's cities</u>, villages and urban townships to the <u>state's future and economic turnaround</u>.

"This action shows that legislators recognize that communities are struggling and they are giving us the tools to ensure we can provide services efficiently," Minnick said.

Here is a look at the League-supported bills that once signed into law by Gov. Rick Snyder will help Michigan communities:

- PERA: The House passed Senate Bill 493 that amends the Public Employment Relations Act (PERA). These changes are critical to encourage communities to cooperate and share services. The changes to PERA make the following subjects a prohibited subject of bargaining: the decision to consolidate or share services; the procedures for obtaining a contract to share services, and the identity of the parties who will share services. The bill does still require impact bargaining. The Senate will be convening on July 13, and the League hopes they will concur at that time to send the bill to the governor's desk.
- Health care: Public employees in Michigan would have to pay a prescribed amount for their health insurance policies under the House-passed version of Senate Bill 7. The bill would cap a public employer's contribution at \$15,000 for family coverage and \$5,500 for an individual policy. Employers, which include state and local governments and K-12 districts, would have the option of choosing instead to do an 80/20 premium sharing plan. The victory for local units of government is that they may opt out entirely from either plan by a 2/3 vote of the local governing body. If the city has a strong mayor form of government, the mayor also must vote to opt out of the plan. The bill will go back to the Senate for concurrence on July 13.
- Revenue sharing: The House and Senate passed Senate Bill 138, which increases revenue sharing funds to local units of government by \$33 million. The League worked with the Snyder administration and the Legislature to ensure that this bill move as quickly as possible so that communities will not see cuts due to reductions expected from population declines. The added revenue sharing dollars result from better than expected sales tax collections. SB 138 is a supplemental appropriation that was necessary in order to get these dollars to local communities. Governor Snyder is expected to sign the bill.
- Economic development tool: This legislation, House Bill 4759, creates a new economic development tool for communities by allowing communities to use the Commercial Rehabilitation Act for vacant land in already-designated commercial areas. This law allows communities to freeze taxes of an existing property for 1 to 10 years, and now it can also be used on vacant land.
