OLD / ROUTINE BUSINESS – REVISITED ISSUES / PROJECTS

✓ 2010-2011 FISCAL BUDGET (*Resolutions*)

Included with tonight's program are resolutions that set the levy, adopt the budget, set the next fiscal years' Council schedule, and allow for year-end adjustments. As a quick re-cap on finances, the cumulative loss of all taxable property dipped from the 2009 value of \$189,926,029 to \$158,211,244... an adjusted difference of \$31,714,785... or about 16.7%. The settlement of the General Motors appeal for 2009 and 2010 calendar years, but posted in our 2010-2011 Fiscal Year, amounts to the bulk of this. The actual decrease of all other properties is 8% of the 16.7% figure. Here are fund totals of the final proposed budget:

Regarding year end fiscal adjustments, I've included a snapshot of where we stand right now on budgeted departments vs. YTD expenses. With the exception of Major Streets 202, all look to land right where we predicted they would. On Major Streets, it was a guessing game as to whether the expenses would land in last fiscal year or this, so we split them. Most landed in this fiscal year causing an accrual deficit of around \$200k. As you may recall, this project cost the City nothing as the developer contributed the bulk of the dollars for the improvements, with the rest coming from TIP grants. As we have discussed, I can no longer bring a revenue neutral budget to the Council. We will be facing extensive layoffs within 12 months unless we find an alternate and long term solution of funding for this structural deficit. I am making lots of noise on consolidation solutions with neighboring communities. I continue to meet regularly looking for interest with our neighbors. Here is a revised schedule:

I have set a short discussion to bring the Council up to date on the trail funding scheduled in the TIP, as indicated above.

MILLER ROAD PROJECT, ELMS-TALLMADGE (Status)

The contractor is Cadillac Asphalt LLC of Wixom Michigan, bid amount of \$507,816.54. This project also includes the extension and widening of Elms Road for the Family Farm & Home Project and the removal of the concrete traffic island on Miller between I-69 and Elms. The work schedule has been set back to June 20th with a ten week completion estimate. Assuming all estimates are as stated, the local match is 34% of the total construction, design and construction engineering costs. Bear in mind that the grant was always capped at \$339k. We added the Elms extension (Family Farm & Home) and the removal of the traffic island to the project.

✓ LOCAL STREET FUND, TRAFFIC IMPROVEMENTS □ 2008 REPAIR ROSTER (Status)

As a re-cap, the contractor's are Maintenance & Construction Company, of Romulus Michigan, at \$101,547, with construction engineering and testing (\$1,980), the total being \$103,527, and Lang Construction of Flint Michigan, in the amount of \$8,523 for the storm sewer repairs. Totals are:

✓ COUNTY WWS ISSUES PENDING (See Individual Category) □ KAREGNONDI WATER AUTHORITY (Status)

Pending.

- SEWER I&I PENALTIES, REHABILITATION (Status) Implementation delayed until sometime in 2011.
- SEWER USE ORDINANCE INDUSTRIAL PRE-TREATMENT (Status) Mr. Figura is working with the County's attorney on a final draft.

□ WATER RATE INCREASE (Status)

WWS has notified the City of a water rate increase of .22¢ per 100 cf, effective on all water after July 1st. The increase represents county pass along of increases from Detroit and Flint. We will need to begin collecting this increase in the August billings. As of now, it is being viewed by staff as a "pass along" increase only. The 22¢ computes to just over 8%. As of writing, we have seen nothing regarding sanitary sewer rates.

✓ MARATHON REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT (Status)

Marathon Oil has proposed that we deed the property over to them and they will clean it up, all of it. Then, with our help, they will sell it to recover the expenses involved with the cleanup. I've informed Marathon that we have an interest in exploring this option, conditioned on what the City's goals and objectives are. We are in the process of getting a handful of the attorneys lined up to explore the proposal to see if we can arrive at an equitable solution for all of the concerns.

✓ PERSONNEL & POLICIES & PROCEDURES (Status)

I know it's been a while on this (actually, quite a while). Not to make excuses, but it's been a wild ride here since late 2007 just to stay above water. I've made a good dent into finishing this and should have it in the near future.

✓ SALE OF CITY PROPERTY 5129 MORRISH ROAD (Status)

Pending a report back to the Council with recommendation on the structure as well as the house the City owns at Morrish & Fortino.

✓ LABOR CONTRACTS (Status)

As a short re-cap, all our labor contracts are frozen. The POLC agreement has been frozen since January 2009. The AFSCME agreement has been frozen since July 2008. The Supervisor's agreement has been frozen since July 2007, however, to even this agreement out a bit, an additional 40 hours of absent time was granted. The extra absent time cannot be cashed out, rolled over, accrued or paid out in any way. The City Manager Contract has been frozen since December 2004. The extra absent time provision within the Supervisor's agreement is also applied to the City Manager's Contract. There are no plans to replace Mr. Zettel's position. We have two other "at will" classifications, which are without agreements, being our part time police officers and our building inspector. The part time police have been frozen since March 2004 with a change in November 2009 to allow time and a half on holidays. The building

inspector is part time and has remained unchanged since October 2006 when the position was established to replace the full time assessor / building inspector. Contracted positions are the assessor and trade inspector's, being electrical, plumbing and mechanical. With Adam leaving we have a problem with Zoning Administration, Code Enforcement, and to a lesser degree, DDA, Planning Commission and CDBG administration. I am currently working on a solution to this.

✓ FIRE DEPARTMENT: 2011 BUDGET & COST RECOVERY (*Resolution*)

The 2011 Budget was adopted at the meeting of November 22, minus CIP contributions. As indicated, we are looking at long term solutions to all public safety. The cost recovery issue plays into this, however, it is now in a bit of a state of flux based on the introduction of legislation that may prohibit such ordinances. The legislation has been stalled in committee. On the cost recovery, we'll watch it for a while to see where it heads. Regarding the agreement, the Fire Board has proposed some changes to the contract. I have met with the Township on the agreement, but for now, it appears stalled. The contract expired April 1st; however, there is a roll-over clause that allows continuation. I hope to have a draft for Council review very soon.

On another matter, there is an invoice in the amount of \$2,248 included with tonight's packet. The fire department has submitted it to us for payment, outside of the budget. The invoice is for our half of the local match portion of a recent grant they received for the purchase of miscellaneous equipment. I have a resolution for appropriation included with tonight's agenda.

✓ NEIGHBORHOOD STABILIZATION PROGRAM (Status) Pending.

✓ AYSO GROUND LEASE REQUEST (Status)

The local AYSO (American Youth Soccer Organization) has inquired if the City would be interested in a "*no cost*" ground lease agreement for the 20 acres of City property located on Bristol Road between the west lot line of GM-SPO and the Heritage Village Subdivision. They would like to construct soccer fields for practice and competition events on the land. Their proposal fits with our plans for a sports park on the land. As we all know, it will be many years before, and if ever, we have the funds to pursue our plan. I will be back in the future with a better defined direction after I spend additional time with the organization.

✓ GO GREEN, EECBG PUBLIC SAFETY BUILDING HVAC GRANT (Status)

The system has been installed. We are in the process of reconciling submittals to the state for re-imbursement.

✓ SPRINGBROOK EAST & HERITAGE ASSOCIATION S.A.D. (Status)

The two associations are reviewing data and deciding what they desire to pave. There is risk with including the vacant lots as vacant land has little value in this economy, thus leaving them exposed to owner abandonment resulting in the discharge of taxes and assessments. The low bid contractor desires to do this project in late summer or early fall, thus creating a bit of time for decision before we begin the SAD process. I'll keep the Council informed on progress.

On another note, we are looking at using these time and material prices to perform other repairs. There are two areas on Major Streets that are very distressed, Fairchild at Miller and Winston at Miller. We are also going to look at some repairs to the Public Safety Lot. Included in tonights packet is a response to our insurance carrier's note that outlines concern over slip and fall hazards in the public safety lot.

✓ WASTE & RECYCLING SERVICES CONTRACT (Status)

We are preparing a contract for the automated collection. I will be back with a draft shortly.

✓ **SIGN ORDINANCE** (Information)

Adam tells me that the date on this was extended to 2012 when we adopted our Appendix A. Either way, maybe later into the summer when we get past the budget season, we can talk about some solutions here.

NEW BUSINESS / PROJECTED ISSUES & PROJECTS

✓ PARK FEE WAIVER, GIRL SCOUTS (*Resolution*)

Ms. Bonnie Genovesi, on behalf of a Girl Scout Organization, has requested the use of Elms Park Pavilion #2 on Saturday September 17th for a recruitment picnic. I have a resolution for approval included with tonight's program.

✓ REQUEST, LIQUOR LICENSE TRANSFER (*Resolution*)

Included with tonight's program is a request to transfer a Class "C" liquor license (beer, wine and liquor for consumption on the premises), currently held in escrow, to two gentlemen who recently opened the restaurant at Miller & Bristol (Creek City Grill). As you may know, this location has always had a Class "C" license, but most of the ventures have not utilized it. The Chinonis's and Pavlis placed it into escrow, with Council authorization, and now want it removed and transferred. Reactivation of the license requires Council approval, an investigation and recommendation from the Police Department. After these steps, the MI-LCC makes the final determination.

✓ WOMEN'S CLUB DONATION, HOLLAND PAVILION ROOF (*Resolution*)

The Swartz Creek Women's Club has offered to repair the roof of the Holland Avenue Park Pavilion. It certainly needs it and we have not had the funds to do any of this kind of work. They obtained quotes from area contractors, with Qualified Remodeling being the lowest. Qualified has done work for the City in the past with excellent results. I have a resolution of appreciation and acceptance included with tonight's program.

Council Questions, Inquiries, Requests and Comments

- □ *Traffic Lights, Bristol-Miller, GM-SPO.* Pending the direction that GM takes. New traffic counts as to warrants would need to be taken.
- Deteriorated Retaining Walls & Planters at City Buildings. The north wall at the Public Safety Building behind the Police Department collapsed. We may be able to come up with a repair for around \$21,000. I'll let the Council know.
- Youth Programs in Park. Looking into this. This item is something that might best be suited for the City's School Liaison Officer. The matter has been referred to the Police Department for review and recommendation.
- □ *Elms Park "Safety" Concerns".* The Police Chief is looking into this.

Whereas, Scleroderma can affect many parts of the body including skin, internal organs, and blood vessels; and

Whereas, African Americans are more susceptible to systemic scleroderma; and

DELEGATION OF AUTHORITY

Authority to manage Swartz Creek Area Fire Authority investment program is derived from the following: P.A. 1943, No. 20., as amended by P.A. 1988 No. 285 SS1.

Management responsibility for the investment program is hereby delegated to the Fire Chief and in the absence of the Fire chief the Accounting/Clerical Specialist who shall establish written procedures for the operation of the investment program consistent with this investment policy. Oversight will be provided by the Swartz Creek Area Fire Authority through the Board Treasurer. Procedures should include reference to: safekeeping, PSA repurchase agreements, wire transfer agreements, banking service contracts and collateral/depository agreements. Such procedures shall include explicit delegation of authority to persons responsible for investment transactions. No person may engage in an investment transaction except as provided under the terms of this policy and the procedures established by the Swartz Creek Area Fire Authority. The Swartz Creek Area Fire Authority shall be responsible for all transactions undertaken.

V. ETHICS AND CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

Officers and employees involved in the investment process shall refrain from personal business activity that could conflict with proper execution of the investment program, or which could impair-or create the appearance of an impairment on-their ability to make impartial investment decisions. Employees and investment officials shall disclose to the Fire Chief and the Board Treasurer any material financial interests in financial institutions that conduct business with the unit, and they shall further disclose any large personal financial investment positions that could be related to the performance of the Swartz Creek Area Fire Authority's portfolio. Employees and officers shall subordinate their personal investment transactions to those of the Swartz Creek Area Fire Authority, particularly with regard to the time of purchases and sales.

VI. SAFEKEEPING AND CUSTODY

Authorized Financial Dealers and Institutions – The Fire Chief will maintain a list of financial institutions approved by the Swartz Creek Area Fire Authority. In addition, a list will also be maintained of approved security broker/dealers selected by credit-worthiness, who maintain an office in the State of Michigan or who are "primary" dealers or regional dealers that qualify under Securities and Exchange Commission rule 15C3-1 (uniform net capital rule). No public deposit shall be made except in a qualified public depository as established by State law.

All financial institutions and broker/dealers who desire to become qualified bidders for investment transactions must supply the Investment Officer with the following: audited financial statements for the most recent fiscal year; certification of having read and agreeing to abide by the Swartz Creek Area Fire Authority's investment policy and the pertinent State statutes: proof of national Association of Security Dealers certification; and proof of State of Michigan registration, where applicable.

An annual review of the financial condition and registration of qualified bidders will be conducted by the Swartz Creek Area Fire Authority through the Fire Chief. Information indicating a loss or prospective loss of capital on existing investments must be shared with the Swartz Creek Area Fire Board immediately upon notification.

VII. INTERNAL CONTROLS

The Fire Chief shall establish a system of internal controls, documented in writing, which is designed to prevent losses of public funds arising from fraud, employee error, and misrepresentation by third parties, unanticipated changes in financial markets, or imprudent actions by employees and officers of the Swartz Creek Area Fire Board *including, but not limited to, the opening and review of bank statements, checks written, and funds collected.* The internal control structure shall be designed to provide reasonable assurance that these objectives are met. The concept of reasonable assurance recognizes that (1) the cost of a control should not exceed the benefit likely to be derived and (2) the valuation of costs and benefits requires estimates and judgments by management.

The Fire Chief shall initiate an annual process of independent review by an external auditor. This review will provide internal control by assuring compliance with policies and procedures.

Hi Chief:

I have the following information on your breathing air compressor filter system. My contacts for the filter systems are Mako, the original manufacturer, and Lawrence Factor, one of the leading manufacturers of filters and filter chambers. Both state that when there is any corrosion through the anodizing, the filter chamber should be taken out of service. Secondly, I was informed that the condensate removal tower shipped with that compressor is rated at 10,000 cycles. A cycle is each time the pressure is raised to 4500, and then drained back to zero. Your compressor has 2026 hours of run time. Assuming that the system automatically drains the condensate system every 10 minutes, and each time the compressor is shut off, there have been many more than 10,000 cycles.

Based on the above, I strongly recommend that you replace both the filter tower and condensate removal tower.

Cost for a Mako filter tower is \$900.86 Cost for a Mako separator is \$900.86

Cost for a Lawrence Factor filter tower is 787.96

Cost for a Lawrence Factor separator is 663.34

The Lawrence Factor filter tower uses the same filter that the Mako filter tower uses. The Lawrence Factor separator is rated at 15,000 cycles.

I anticipate that it will take no more than one hour for installation. Your contract hourly price is \$40.00.

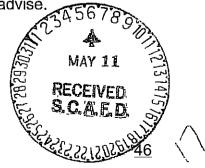

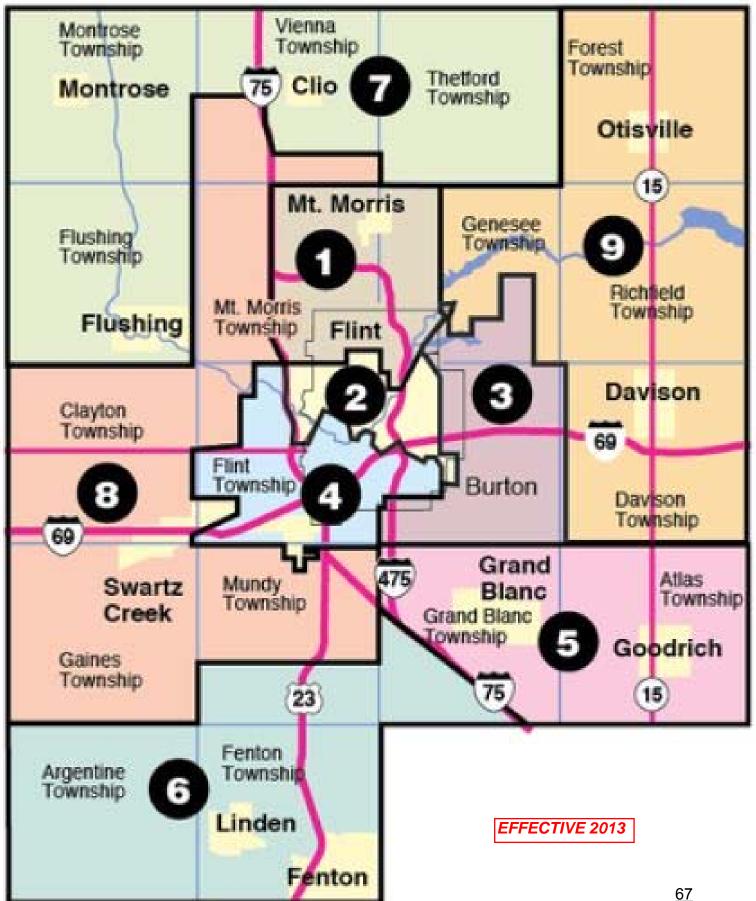

The State Legislature is considering legislation that could make the resolution of simple workplace issues very difficult. HB 4059 would prohibit the City from "entering into or renewing a bargaining agreement that requires or allows paid time for union officials, members, or bargaining representatives to conduct union business or otherwise carry out the duties of the union if the time is paid by the public."

Michigan **AFSCME** Council 25 has worked closely with your City to resolve problems on behalf of its members and to reach fair and equitable contracts that meet the needs of both the City and our members – and most importantly meet the needs of the community. We have mutually agreed to those situations where it is in the best interests of all concerned to conduct that business "on the clock." Eliminating that ability could make grievance resolution more difficult at the first step and cause further problems by failing to resolve minor disagreements early.

HB 4059 could result in contract negotiations and other Labor Management meetings being held at strange hours to avoid unnecessary time off. Decisions as to when such meetings take place should be left to the local elected officials and/or appointed representatives and not mandated by State Law that allows for no local discretion.

We know you share these concerns because we have reached agreement on contract provisions of this nature in the past.

Michigan **AFSCME** Council 25 asks you to send a letter opposing House Bill 4059 to the State Senator(s) within your community's jurisdiction. We would appreciate a copy of your letter as we continue to oppose this legislation in the Senate. Thank you for your consideration.

Governor, Legislature Signal Recognition that Communities & Place Key to Economic Turnaround

Late yesterday the Gov. Rick Snyder and Legislative leadership announced a budget deal that includes \$65 million in additional funding for Michigan communities! This is great news for Michigan Municipal League members and shows that state leaders understand the importance of the cities, villages and urban townships to Michigan's future!

This additional funding comes from the \$310 million available due to updated state revenue estimates announced earlier this week. Here's how the additional funding for Michigan communities breaks down:

- 1. An additional \$50 million will be going into the Business Attraction and Economic Gardening program, which will replace the new brownfield and historic tax credits. This brings that funding to \$75 million, which is a significant victory for League members.
- 2. An additional \$15 million was also announced for the new statutory revenue sharing program known as the "Economic Vitality Incentive Program." This brings that funding to \$215 million, with \$5 million set aside for grants to members who attempt consolidation. The details for the three criteria locals must meet to qualify for the funding was not finalized this week. That language is now expected to be released next week.

This additional funding is a significant step forward for Michigan's communities, as it shows recognition by those in leadership that having attractive places with quality infrastructure and amenities is essential in reshaping Michigan's future.

Stay tuned to the League's website (<u>mml.org</u>) for the latest details as they become available. League members with questions about the revenue sharing dollars can
