Design on the Morrish Road Bridge is complete and has been submitted to MDOT for review. Incorporated into the design are the non-participating enhancements as well as the road closure for construction. The project is estimated to last for two months and will be timed while the school is on summer break (2013). I'll keep the Council posted on developments.

☐ SEWER I&I PENALTIES, REHABILITATION (Discussion)

We approved Phase IV of the sewer rehabilitation project (Winshall Drive) at the meeting of July 25th, the cost being \$82,492.50 (work halted at around \$10k). The TV work has revealed we have one for sure, and possibly a second that will need to be excavated to repair. The first is a broken line that's off-set and the second is a "top down" lead into the main that the connection at the main is crushed. The second may be able to be lined but we must be prepared to excavate if the process fails.

We approved light design engineering, survey and bid package preparation in the amount of \$6,847 at the meeting of February 27th. Bids are back on the project and frankly put, they're ugly. Lou has gone back to the drawing board to figure out another solution. I've set this for a short discussion to bring the Council up to date along with theories as to where we are headed.

□ BEAR CREEK SANITARY SEWER AGREEMENT (Status)

Pending the outcome of the Morrish Road Bridge Project.

✓ MARATHON REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT (Status)

As discussed at the meeting of July 23rd, we are in Circuit Court for quiet title acquisition. I'll keep the Council posted on developments.

✓ PERSONNEL & POLICIES & PROCEDURES (Status) Pending.

✓ CITY PROPERTY, 4438 MORRISH ROAD (Status)

We'll look at a disposition for the house at 4438 Morrish in the spring.

✓ LABOR CONTRACTS, BUILDING DEPARTMENT (Status)

The POLC and AFSCME contracts have been settled. The Supervisor's contract has a tentative agreement that's vastly similar to the others. As of writing it is still being drafted. It should be back for Council review at the meeting of August 27th. The only loose ends are the at-will part time police officers and the building inspector's employment agreement. I'll keep the Council informed on progress.

✓ FIRE DEPARTMENT: BOARD, CONTRACT & COST RECOVERY (Status) Pending.

✓ SPRINGBROOK EAST & HERITAGE ASSOCIATION S.A.D. (Status)

All that remains is to accept the streets into our Act #51 Street System. This process is a bit lengthy insofar as legal steps required assuring a proper transfer. Mr. Figura has prepared the paperwork on this end. There are several steps the Associations need to complete before we can begin our process. As soon as we get past this busy spurt, I'll fire up the Associations to start the process.

✓ **SIGN ORDINANCE** (Status)

Pending draft changes from the meeting of February 2nd.

✓ SHARED SERVICES INITIATIVE (Resolution)

Included on tonight's CD (but not printed) is a draft report from Mr. Nottley on the shared services evaluation. The document is a bit lengthy and as of writing, the staff has not fully reviewed it. Rick is in general agreement with it, but has identified some omissions that do affect the final cost savings analysis. I suggest we dust off the committee that we appointed a while back (the Mayor, Mayor Pro-Tem and Councilmember Hurt) to make a full review and recommendation back to the Council. I have a proposed resolution to this effect included with tonight's agenda.

✓ **SCHOOL PERFORMING ARTS CENTER** (Status)

Construction and associated "dry weather dust" continues to progress.

✓ STREET RE-STRIPING & SYMBOLS (Status)

Tom is trying to get another round of crack filling into the budget for Miller Road. For the obvious reason, any striping will have to be done after this project. We will be back in a month or two with a recommendation.

✓ MEIJER SITE PLAN & ADDENDUM (Status)

The Council approved an amended site plan allowing for the construction of a gross square foot store of 192,214 along with related changes to parking, traffic circulation, lighting, landscaping, and signage, all of which have been deemed by the City's staff as minor and within the general concept of the original site plan approval. We are in the process of re-negotiating the development agreement with Meijer. On paid-in capital, Meijer funded improvements capped at \$1,500,000. To date, they have paid \$1,095,000. They owe the City \$52,873, which when invoiced and paid, will put their contribution, to date, for the Morrish project at \$1,147,873. This leaves \$352,127 left to fund traffic lights that *may or will* be needed at the Morrish Road I-69 ramp and at Bristol and Morrish intersection. Progressive AE has submitted preliminary design plans to MDOT and they are awaiting an answer. Construction has begun.

✓ FIVE-YEAR PARKS & RECREATION PLAN, ELMS PARK PROJECT (Status) Awaiting a draft.

✓ FLOOD RELIEF (*Resolution*)

We participated in the County Emergency Management Division's collection of damage reports in order to apply for FEMA Disaster Relief Funding. This funding has been denied and in place, the offer of SBA low interest loans. In the meantime, we are now in possession of something close to 200 written "reports of damage" that are being viewed by attorneys and uninsured residents as sewage backup claims against the City for damages. We're working through them with the assistance of MML Claims and Mr. Figura. In addition, the state has made grants available to local governmental entities for damages suffered as a result of the May 3-4 flooding. The applications have a submission deadline of August 28th, are capped at \$30,000 and have a number of conditions and stipulations that make an award difficult, at best. None the less, I think we should submit to see if we can recover some of our out-sourced tree cutting and wood chipping and quite possibly, some of the work that may need to be done on the I-69 Morrish Road overpass MDOT decided we should repair. I have a resolution to apply included with tonight's agenda.

✓ TRAFFIC SIGNALS, BRISTOL & MILLER (Status) Set for review after Labor Day.

✓ CLASS "C", "SDM" LIQUOR LICENSES, NEW (Status) Pending a new submission by the applicant.

✓ I-69 MORRISH ROAD BRIDGE APPROACH, REPAIR DISPUTE (*Discussion*)

As you know, we've run into a bit of a dispute involving the repair of the approach to the bridge deck for southbound Morrish at I-69. The grade on the west side of Morrish just to the north of the bridge deck is extremely steep, maybe around 60°. The side of the embankment is eroding away, the heavy rainfall of May 3-4 having caused significant damage. MDOT is telling us that the repair cost and responsibility is ours. As we discussed at the meeting of July 23rd, I disagree on the repair responsibility. The grade differentials are a direct result of the bridge overpass, which in my point of view, makes

it part of the structure. In addition, it's entirely within their right of way. I've set this matter for a brief discussion to bring the Council up to date on some recent progress.

✓ TRI-COUNTY LEASE AGREEMENT (Status)

As we discussed at the July 23rd Meeting, we have lease agreements with Tri-County Wireless, an internet provider, for the location of a transceiver on top of the water tower at Miller & Seymour. The lease is scheduled to expire in September and Tri-county requests to renew it. They are paid up in good standing. Additionally, they have advised us that they can provide wireless "hotspots" in any or all locations in the City. Out of curiosity, I've asked them to provide independent pricing for such hot-spots for the Civic area and for Elms Park. We'll see what they say before making a final decision on the contract extension.

✓ CITY WEB SITE, RELATED SERVICES (Status) Pending.

NEW BUSINESS / PROJECTED ISSUES & PROJECTS

✓ WOMEN'S CLUB DONATION, POLICE K-9 PROGRAM (Resolution)

The Swartz Creek Chapter Women's Club has been at it again! A July "Rock-A-Thon" fundraiser netted them \$1,700 and they would like to present a check to the City to be used towards expenses associated with the Police Canine Program. Their work towards this program is nothing short of astonishing. I have a resolution of acceptance and appreciation for their dedication and generosity.

✓ APPROPRIATION, POLICE VEHICLE EQUIPMENT INSTALLATION (Resolution)

We have to perform equipment change over for two police vehicles. As a bit of history, Rick had budget requested the purchase of two new vehicles. I cut one vehicle from the motor pool by reducing the budgeted amount by 50%. The current Canine vehicle (the last of the Ford Crown Vic's in our fleet) has been in service for guite a few years now and has reached a point of safety concerns. As a backup plan for the replacement of the canine vehicle, after cutting it from the 2012-2013 budget, we would like to place a newer vehicle in the fleet into that slot and set the current canine Crown Vic out to auction (the next resolution). At any rate, one new Dodge vehicle will be placed into a patrol slot and an existing vehicle will be converted into the dog vehicle and the current dog vehicle will be auctioned. To compound the matter, Dodge design changes have rendered some of the existing equipment obsolete and new items will need to be purchased. Police vehicle build-outs have become quite complex in recent years. Balancing the CAD, AVL, 800 MHz radios, lighting systems, power source, harness, cages, etc., requires highly specialized technicians that are in many ways, general contractors for the equipment. For this reason, bidding this job would be impossible as would trying to purchase all the equipment from the various distributor's and then trying to find a qualified technician to assemble it.

The total cost for change over for the two cars is \$8,976. This cost also includes the purchase of two new overhead light systems as the existing ones are aging and beginning to spark repair costs (they will be auctioned, next resolution). Included with tonight's packet are itemized quotations from the company we've been using, Great Lakes Emergency Products.

✓ AUCTION: POLICE VEHICLE, MISCELLANEOUS EQUIPMENT (Resolution)

As you may recall, we auctioned several vehicles a while back through the municipal web site "Bidcorp.com". The results were far better than expected and all the transactions went without problems. We have a 2005 Ford Crown Vic canine vehicle that needs to go along with a variety of miscellaneous items, such as old police vehicle equipment, prisoner partitions, seats, light bars, mounts, office desks, out-dated computer equipment, etc. I'd like specific authorization to sell the car, and blanket authorization to sell small items and equipment on Bidcorp. The last stop for the small various items will be the trash if they do not sell on Bidcorp. I can report the sale items and the revenue back to the Council as we sell items over the next few months as a record. I have a resolution that allows for the auction included with tonight's agenda.

Council Questions, Inquiries, Requests and Comments

- Deteriorated Retaining Walls & Planters at City Buildings. The wall along the north side of the building has been repaired. We are looking at options on some of the other repairs around the site.
- □ Youth Programs in Park. Officer Szmansky conducted the "Cops in the Park" program last week. I'll have the Rick address the review at tonight's meeting.
- Downtown Deteriorated Signs, 8048 Miller. Turned over to our code guy.
- □ Bus, Gil-Roy Plaza. We probably have no authority on this one, but we'll try and get the owner to search for another solution.
- □ Flood Damage, Apple Creek Apartments. Looking into the City's authority.
- Deteriorated Grain Elevator Building, Morrish at CNA Crossing. We met with the owners of the property on the condition of the elevator portion. I'm far less than enthused that there's a simple solution to this. The highest and best use there today is what you see. The cost of the removal of the building and associated compliant environmental work would likely exceed the property value. We'll continue to push for some change but quite frankly, I'm unsure what that might be and might make matters worse (such as all buildings abandoned).

WHEREAS, there are a number of manufactures of such equipment and the purchase, transfer and installation are technical in nature and for safety reasons require specialized services; and

WHEREAS, due to the technical nature of installation and maintenance of police vehicle equipment, there are very few firms that provide such services; and

- i. Due to circumstances beyond the control of the city, the market for such product, material or service is not competitive even though such product, material or service is normally competitive in nature; and
- ii. The economic interests of the city are best served by negotiating a contract with a provider of the product, material or service without requesting sealed bids."; and

WHEREAS, the City finds that the market for such product is not competitive even though such product, material or service is normally competitive in nature.

NOW, THEREFORE, I Move the City of Swartz Creek appropriate an amount not to exceed \$8,976, plus 10% contingency, to Great Lakes Emergency Products of Linden Michigan, for the removal, transfer and purchase of various police vehicle equipment, in accordance with the specifications as presented, funds to be taken from Motor Pool 661, and further, authorize a Motor Pool Fund Balance transfer for any deficit amount and/or the use of donated police canine funds for expenses that relate to the change over and build up of the Police Canine Vehicle.

WHEREAS , the City of Swartz Creek City Council certifies that the Genesee County Emergency Operations Plan was implemented at the onset of the disaster at approximately 10:00 A.M. on Friday May 4, 2012 and all applicable disaster relief forces identified therein were exhausted.
WHEREAS , as a direct result of the disaster, public damage and expenditures were extraordinary and place an unreasonably great financial burden on the City of Swartz Creek, totaling \$

(As you know, the President declined Federal funding through FEMA.)

In conjunction with the Sheriff's Emergency Management, the State of Michigan-EMHSD, an application briefing will be held on August 8, 2012 at 10:00 a.m. in the Harris Auditorium, Third Floor, County Administration Building.

Local units of government wishing to seek disaster funds should attend this meeting. Further, I am including that governmental agencies seeking funds should include representation, namely financial officers, as well as, municipal and/or township managers.

STATE OF EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, on the evening of May 3, 2012, severe thunderstorms and heavy rains struck Genesee County, Michigan, resulting in widespread and severe flooding; and

WHEREAS, the areas affected are the cities of Flint and Swartz Creek, the village of Goodrich, and the townships of Atlas, Clayton, Flint, Grand Blanc, and Mundy, in Genesee County; and

WHEREAS, the storms have caused flood damage to many homes, businesses, and public facilities, threatening the health and safety of the public due to structural hazards and exposure to potential contaminants; and


WHEREAS, on May 4, 2012, Genesee County declared a local state of emergency and activated the disaster response and recovery aspects of its emergency operations plan to cope with the situation; and

WHEREAS, the county and the aforementioned affected local political subdivisions have determined that local resources are insufficient to address the situation and state assistance is required to protect public health and safety; and

NOW, THEREFORE, I, RICHARD D. SNYDER, Governor of the state of Michigan, pursuant to the Constitution of the state of Michigan and provisions of Act No. 390 of the Public Acts of 1976, as amended, do hereby proclaim that a state of emergency exists in Genesee County; and

FURTHER, the Emergency Management and Homeland Security Division of the Department of State Police shall coordinate and maximize all state efforts, and may call upon all state departments to utilize resources at their avail to assist in the emergency area pursuant to the Michigan Emergency Management Plan; and

FURTHER, termination of this emergency will occur at such time as emergency conditions no longer exist and appropriate programs have been implemented to recover from the effects of this emergency, but in no case longer than June 7, 2012, unless extended as provided by Act No. 390.
