Assuming this list will be approved, all of the streets we have submitted finished near the top of the repair list. All of the streets are within the funding level, with the exception of the Miller Road piece between Morrish and Seymour, which falls just below the funding line. As a note, Fairchild, Cappy, Worchester and Winston may likely be pulled from the funding section by MDOT as the traffic counts are not significant enough to justify limited funds. Even so, we would be able to repair Miller from Morrish to Dye, with the exception of the piece near I-69. It's probably a safe bet that Miler between Morrish and Seymour will not make the 2014-2017 funding call. Not a bad finish though...

☐ MORRISH ROAD BRIDGE PROJECT (Status)

The Morrish Road Bridge Project is the last remaining project funded in the 2011-2014 TIP. WE had received a compliancy letter from MDOT as the low bidder had not secured a performance bond on this project as well as several others they were in line for award on. The company was able to get the bond underwritten and has been cleared to proceed by MDOT. The only item we do not have a price on yet are the four lights included in the design. We are awaiting this data from Consumer's Energy. Cost estimates, using the lowest bid return, are as follows:

□ BEAR CREEK SANITARY SEWER AGREEMENT (Status)

As the Council is aware, some of the elected positions have changed in Gaines Township. I'm going to let this sit a bit longer to allow the new board to acclimate before addressing it. The County WWS has it on their radar and may push in the near future to reach a resolve.

✓ MARATHON REDEVELOPMENT PROJECT (Status)

The Council selected the Biggby Project at the Special Meeting of February 20th. Here is the revised schedule:

The Circuit Court has granted a default motion to quiet title. The title company is collecting the paperwork needed for closing and the Atkinson's are reviewing the requested deed covenants offered by the Marathon Petroleum Company.

- ✓ PERSONNEL: POLICIES & PROCEDURES (Status)
 Pending.
- ✓ CITY PROPERTY, 4438 MORRISH ROAD (Status)
 We'll look at a disposition for the house at 4438 Morrish in the spring.
- ✓ LABOR CONTRACTS, SHARED SERVICES, BUILDING DEPARTMENT (Status)

The POLC, AFSCME, Supervisor, Assessor, Zoning Administrator and Part-Time Police Officers have been settled. The remaining loose ends are the building inspector's employment agreement, which in part is addressed in the Shared Services

Study and the City Manager contract. Mundy Township has officially offered its commitments to perform building services for the City and Flint Township. We continue to look into the building services consolidation.

✓ FIRE DEPARTMENT: BUDGET, CONTRACT & COST RECOVERY (Status)

I met with the township regarding the contract. The meeting produced a step closer to resolving the CIP issue. I'm doing a bit of research before a yet to be scheduled second meeting.

✓ SPRINGBROOK EAST & HERITAGE ASSOCIATION S.A.D. (Status)

All that remains is to accept the streets into our Act #51 Street System. This process is a bit lengthy insofar as legal steps required assuring a proper transfer. Mr. Figura has prepared the paperwork on this end. There are several steps the Associations need to complete before we can begin our process. As soon as we get past this busy spurt, I'll fire up the Associations to start the process.

✓ MEIJER OPENING, INTERSTATE TRAFFIC SIGNAL (Status)

The Council approved an amended site plan allowing for the construction of a gross square foot store of 192,214 along with related changes to parking, traffic circulation, lighting, landscaping, and signage, all of which have been deemed by the City's staff as minor and within the general concept of the original site plan approval. On paid-in capital, Meijer funded improvements capped at \$1,500,000. To date, they have paid \$1,095,000. They owe the City \$52,873, which when invoiced and paid, will put their contribution, to date, for the Morrish project at \$1,147,873. This leaves \$352,127 left to fund traffic signals and other related improvements.

We have updated costs estimates for the signal, as follows:

Despite all the delays, cost overruns and other holdups we've had on the traffic signal, it appears that we might just have this installed and running before the opening of the retail center (but not the fuel station).

The tentative schedule for the opening of the Meijer Fuel Station is Thursday April 18th. The store has a soft opening scheduled for Thursday May 16th with a grand opening set to begin Sunday May 19th. Meijer states this will be their 200th store and the 10th in the Flint area. They are planning a big splash to coincide with the 200th opening.

✓ MI-LCC PENDING LICENSES (See Individual Category)

☐ CLASS "C" NEW, 8013 MILLER, MONTINI (Status)

The Council has referred this to the Planning Commission. The request needs review as it may be a significant change of use and accompanies a request for outdoor sales. The applicant, via his attorney, has been informed that they need a formal submission. As of yet, they have not filed with the City.

✓ I-69 MORRISH ROAD BRIDGE REPAIR, FLOOD RELIEF GRANT (Status)

Returns are back and have been reviewed by the City's Engineer. Out of seven returns ranging from a high of \$48,000 to a low of \$27,000, the lowest was L. Zeller & Sons Excavating, of Flint. Mr. Fluery is familiar with the low bidder and endorses their work. We are working to get the project started in April, prior to the opening of the Meijer store. As the Council may recall, we have been awarded a \$30,000 grant from the State'[s Emergency Management Division as the overpass was damaged during the May 4th 2012 flood. Additionally, this is the jurisdiction dispute with MDOT as to which road agency is responsible for repairs. We sort of dropped the complaint when the State Police awarded the grant.

✓ MPSC COMPLAINT, FRONTIER v CITY (Status)

I met with Frontier in late January, the meeting being quite positive. They will be formerly addressing the Council this month. In the meantime, they continue to repair poor workmanship locations in the overhead infrastructure. I'll keep the Council posted on developments.

✓ MI-DEQ SCRAP TIRE GRANT (Status)

The Council approved the application to the MI-DEQ for a 50% construction cost grant for public paving improvements that use recycled scrap tires in the asphalt process. We are looking at our parking lots, being Public Safety Building and the north alley lot behind Hank & Don's, as a test. The estimated total project costs are \$322,000 of which the City's match would be \$182,000 (includes design and construction engineering). We've made it past the initial application process and have been invited to continue in the process. On another note, if the grant works, then it may be something to look at for paving some of the local streets in the future.

√ FARMERS MARKET (Resolution)

As we discussed at the last meeting, Richard Mattson has offered to conduct the Farmers Market this summer, on behalf of the City. The DDA desires the market in the center of the downtown area as it offers the most benefit to the area businesses. As we discussed, we cannot find a suitable location in the direct downtown, which is why we looked at the Holland Park location. In discussions with Mr. Mattson and the staff, a better location would be along the north side of Fortino Drive, west of Morrish, or at the City Hall Lot. The Holland Park vs. Fortino Drive does not directly serve the downtown purpose, so the question becomes what is the best location for the market, absent the down town desires? The second issue is whether the DDA will fund the The DDA has not met since we discussed this at the last meeting. In venture. conversation with Adam, he believes they will still fund it, albeit reluctantly. Having said this, we need to proceed now id we desire to hold the event this summer. propose that if the Council wants the program, then we underwrite it with General Fund appropriations pending the decision by the DDA. In other words, we proceed and ask the DDA. If they refuse, the City will fund it. I have a resolution that includes:

- 1. Hire Mr. Mattson as a summer temp at \$10 per hour. The job description will reflect such and will not be subject to union membership, per the AFSCME CBA.
- 2. Allow for the use of the property along the north side of Fortino Drive, west from Morrish Road. The Market will run beginning in May and ending in September, Sundays only. Hours of operation, approximately 10:00 AM through

2:00 PM, variable a bit either way based on vendor availability and seasonal commodities.

3. Create general ledger adjustments to reflect in-bound revenues and expenses, revenues estimated to be around \$1,200 and expenses at \$4,000.

✓ TITLE VI & L.E.P. REQUIREMENTS (Status)

At the last meeting, I provided a notice of compliancy from the State's Civil Rights Commission on Title VI and Limited English Plan (L.E.P.). Basically, the state is telling us we have to develop a plan relative to the two documents if we are to receive any grant funds that are rooted in federal money. Title VI and the L.E.P. are requirements that flow outwards from the 1964 Federal Civil Rights Act. Because we belong to cooperative efforts through the County for all federal and state grants funding, we've always come under the wings of their plans when we utilize such grant sources. Apparently this has changed and we now must adopt plans of our own. There's still no problem with this as the state has templates, however, they are overreaching in that we may be committing to follow these policies for all our purchasing, bids, contracting, irrespective of the funding sources. Still not a lot of problem with this as we are always fair and unbiased in our purchasing, but the policies are cumbersome, specific, expensive and complex, so one has to ask the question that if we purchase a box of pencils, are we civilly liable if we do not precisely follow this policy? We are under a rather tight time frame to submit drafts to the state for approval, even so before approval of the Council, which will ultimately be needed. As you may know, I dislike "straw approvals", but this may be a case where that's exactly what's happening by way of the twisted arm approach. Included with tonight's packet is a draft that we've submitted to the state.

NEW BUSINESS / PROJECTED ISSUES & PROJECTS

✓ APPROPRIATION & BID AWARD, POLICE VEHICLE (Resolution)

Included with tonight's program is a resolution for bid award and appropriation to purchase one police vehicle. It is a budgeted item, the last one being resolute in December 2011 and delivered in the late spring. We are a bit late on ordering this one as the deadline for ordering is later this month. We have used Macomb County cooperative purchasing in the past with Slingerland Dodge of Corunna being the delivery point. There's a bit of a change this year, being that Macomb has awarded the bid to Sterling Heights Dodge on Van Dyke Road, Sterling Heights. The price this year is actually cheaper than last year, however, Macomb has added a sur charge to out of area purchasers (like us), which brings the vehicle to \$72 over last years. At any rate, Staff recommends to award and purchase.

✓ CAPPY LIFT STATIONS (Discussion)

I've set this as a discussion item to chat about improvements and upgrades to the Cappy Lane Lift Station that may have significant costs attached. We've been working with a mechanical contractor, Kennedy Industries of Milford Michigan, who is advising us that pumps and electrical panels within the underground structure may well be approaching its end life phase. Were not in trouble by any means, but, this is looming and rather than scrapping around on eBay to find used parts, and/or taking the sole word of our contractor who I'm sure is good, but has a financial interest, I'd prefer to take our time and look at all technologies and options available before we decide. The

first step is to bring the council up to date with the second being the employ of our engineering firm to evaluate and make a recommendation. That's the basis of tonight's discussion. Lou's working up a cost proposal to evaluate and may have something prior to the meeting. Any actual work would be a year or more off, save for any unforeseen catastrophe. I've included some photographs of the unit on your CD, if you are unfamiliar with what this critter looks like. For those real adventuresome, give Tom a call and you can climb down and look.

An ordinance to amend sections of Appendix A, the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Swartz Creek.

THE CITY OF SWARTZ CREEK ORDAINS:

Section 1. Amendment of Appendix A by the Deletion of Section 21.07 of Article 21.

Section 21.07 of Article 21 of Appendix A, the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Swartz Creek is hereby deleted in its entirety.

Section 2. Amendment of Section 29.07(B) of Article 29 of Appendix A, the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Swartz Creek.

Section 29.07(B) of Article 29 of Appendix A, the Zoning Ordinance of the City of Swartz Creek is hereby amended to read as follows:

B. Building Materials.

- 1. Durable building materials which provide an attractive, quality appearance must be utilized.
- 2. New structure exteriors shall be predominantly (75% or more) constructed from quality materials such as earth-toned brick, native stone, and/or glass products. The planning commission may choose to allow distribution of coverage across all elevations evenly or to concentrate such coverage on more visible elevations, provided no elevation shall have less than 50% of its exterior constructed of such materials. Tinted/textured concrete masonry units may be used as accent materials on all sides and as a primary material on side and rear elevations.
- 3. Other materials such as smooth-faced concrete block, EIFS panels or pre-fabricated steel panels should only be used as accents and not dominate the building exterior of the structure.
- 4. Metal roofs may be allowed if deemed by the planning commission to be compatible with the overall architectural design of the building.

Shared Services Committee Update

(Discussion)

Lengthy discussion took place on the findings and conclusions of the City's Shared Services Committee. As a base, the Shared Services Report conducted by Mr. Nottley of Municipal Consulting Services was used. Findings and recommendations in the report were explored for combination, consolidation and cost cutting options and solutions. The Committee agrees with the study in that the shared fire protection arrangement with Clayton Township is at optimal efficiency. Assessing, as the study indicates, is at maximum efficiency. The Committee agrees that at this point, no additional savings would be realized. The study recommends that the building department be outsourced to Mundy Township with a "pay for use" agreement. The Committee agrees. The staff is currently working towards a solution on

this, as well as Code Enforcement, which to date, is non-existent. The Committee found that options available for police are limited and that any consolidation with neighboring municipalities would not be cost effective and/or would reduce service levels below expected minimums. There are structural deficit problems within the General Fund, which over time, will continue to chip away and undermine police and fire. Short of reducing the level of service to a single police unit to answer calls on a contractual basis with another agency, the only other solution is to ask the public for additional funds via a ballot millage request. The staff will be evaluating the findings and will bring a report and recommendation back to the Council.

Title VI & L.E.P. Requirements

(Discussion)

City Manager Bueche commented the state is telling us we have to develop a plan if we are to receive any grant funds. In years past we have just followed the county's plans. Mr. Bueche is working with City Lawyer, Dick Figura. This will go to Lansing for approval once they approve it then it will come to the council to be adopted.

Rental Ordinance (Discussion)

Councilmember Shumaker wanted to address his concerns about the blight throughout the City. He is concerned that we currently don't have a Code Enforcer. He believes that we need a Rental Ordinance. City Manager Bueche responded that he will check around and see what may or may not be working in other municipalities.

Councilmember Gilbert spoke while walking his dog he has almost been hit in the crosswalk at Fairchild.

Councilmember Hurt congratulated the Eagle Scout. He also commented that he has volunteered to be editor and publisher of the newsletter.

Mayor Pro Tem Abrams commented that the Veterans Memorial Committee has done a great job.

Mayor Krueger wanted to thank the Veterans Memorial Committee for all the work and the beautiful structure. Mayor Krueger wanted to know who does the plan for continuation of rehab project for sewers. Mr. Bueche responded that Tom Svrcek, Director of Public Service along with Lou from Rowe and representative from LiquiForce work together on that. Mayor Krueger wanted to know the status on the Marathon redeveloping. Mr. Bueche responded that we are just waiting on Mr. Atkinson. WATER WAR UNDERMINES FLINT-DWSD RELATIONS

Statement prepared by Bill Johnson for DWSD

The Flint City Council's approval of the Genesee County Drain Commission-backed idea to link Flint and a proposed multi-county connector effectively launched the greatest water war in Michigan's history. The action ignores a credible state-sponsored study that came out against the ill-advised Karegnondi Water Authority (KWA) project. And the vote makes no connection to Flint's fiscal reality.

All things considered, the City of Flint is best served by the Detroit Water and Sewerage Department (DWSD).

At issue is the reckless push for Flint to purchase untreated Lake Huron water through a new multi-million dollar intake pipeline and treat it at the city's treatment plant before distributing it to Flint customers. Theoretically, the KWA pipeline would replace Flint's reliance on treated water from the city of Detroit. But any claim that it would save the cash-strapped city money is specious.

Flint's financial flexibility – already precarious – will be impaired far into the future by disconnecting from DWSD. Tucker, Young, Jackson & Tull Inc., a prestigious engineering consulting firm hired by the state Treasurer's office, produced *The City of Flint Water Supply Assessment*, which pegged the cost of the KWA pipeline at more than \$375 million. That's 24 percent more than originally projected, and the assessment didn't take into account unforeseen contingencies like cost overruns and "delays in completion, startup, and debugging of the entire pumping system" that will negatively impact Flint's bottom line.

Once additional costs and risks are factored in, the rates paid by Flint's water customers will be substantially higher than current rates with the DWSD system. More importantly, because Flint is under an emergency manager, the city can't afford the added millions of dollars required to terminate the relationship with DWSD.

For DWSD, the estimated immediate net revenue shortfall from Flint's separation from the Detroit system is approximately \$22 million, or 6 percent of total DWSD water revenue. The cost of that revenue loss will have to be spread across the remaining 3 million customers. Additionally, undetermined costs would be incurred by required modifications to the Lake Huron Plant to resolve water quality issues for Lapeer, Mayfield and Imlay City. The Imlay Booster Station will have to be altered at a cost estimated in the \$1 million range. The 25-mile water line servicing Flint, with a book value at \$5 million or more, would be abandoned; three pumps at the station would be idled.

Last year, DWSD shelled out \$44 million for improvements at the station that primarily serves Flint and Genesee County.

Since 2001, DWSD has attempted to negotiate a new contract that would address Flint's concerns. Flint could have literally saved millions by considering any of the alternatives. Officials adamantly refused to do so.

Five new options are on the table that offers even more savings, including a DWSD offer to sell KWA untreated water from the existing intake on Lake Huron. That alone would make a separate intake pipe unnecessary. The new, more flexible model also allows for Flint to reduce or increase their customer capacity obligations as needed.

And under the new Detroit Board of Water Commissioners (BOWC) concept, Genesee County could have a vote on future rate increases. The caveat: Flint would need to enter into a new 30-year contract with DWSD to make proposed improvements cost-effective.

In a historic ruling last week, Federal District Judge Sean Cox released DWSD from 35 years of court oversight. The judge indicated that DWSD had made "substantial" progress in addressing violations of the Clean Water Act, and the overall operations of the department. It was an exceptional vote of confidence.

The insistence of Flint officials to pursue construction of the KWA pipeline can only be attributed to a "political" objective that has nothing to do with the delivery – or the price – of water. Flint's fiscal integrity is stake. And the State of Michigan has an obligation to prevent the distressed city from dragging DWSD and the region into a deeper financial quagmire.

DSTR COMMENTS

This Diagnostic Study Team Review (DSTR) was scheduled by the Michigan Department of Transportation's (MDOT's) Office of Rail to review current and future safety needs at the Morrish Road at grade railroad crossing in the City of Swartz Creek (City).

Morrish Road is a two-lane road, running in a north/south direction, with a speed limit of 30 mph and approximately 5,095 vehicles per day (2004).

Grand Trunk Western Railroad Company (GTW) has a mainline that crosses Morrish Road at a 65 degree angle, with approximately 32 trains per day at a maximum speed of 65 mph. The crossing is currently protected by back-to-back, side-of-street flashing lights, half-roadway gates and the proper signage for both directions of traffic.

The DSTR was requested by the City to discuss multiple crossing complaints. The DSTR Team reviewed the condition of the mainline crossing and determined it is much lower than the roadway and has multiple loose timbers.

The team agreed that GTW will be responsible to rebuild the crossing surface. This will consist of saw cutting the existing asphalt, removing crossing timbers, replacing deteriorated ties, surfacing through the crossing, installing a new crossing surface and repaving. The team determined that a 12 month time frame for the rebuild is sufficient.

The City mentioned that it is going to have a bridge project north of the crossing starting in June that will last for approximately two months. GTW will coordinate with the City to avoid scheduling the crossing work during this period.
