# OLD / ROUTINE BUSINESS - REVISITED ISSUES / PROJECTS

$\checkmark$	MAJOR STREET FUND, TRAFFIC IMPROVEMENTS (See Individual Category)
	☐ MORRISH ROAD BRIDGE PROJECT (Undate)

The contractor has withdrawn their appeal. There will be no cost to the city for disputed work, save for costs incurred already for preparing the appeal defense. This is the best case scenario.

# ☐ MILLER ROAD RESURFACING PROJECT (Update)

OHM started design engineering for Miller Road between Morrish and Dye. When preliminary work is completed, we will be back to discuss design options and costs. What follows is the background as written in the initial report.

# ☐ MORRISH ROAD RAIL CROSSING (Update)

CN has informed us that they will be repairing the rail crossing on Morrish Road. Details of what level of repair is being proposed are unknown, but they intend to perform this work on May 19 and 20. The road will be closed during that time.

# ✓ WINCHESTER STREETS (Update)

Tom and I have been working with the engineer on some very conceptual numbers for a range of fixes to streets in the village. Once we can present something to the council that outlines what we are looking at, we can move forward with a plan to explain the situation to the residents this summer.

- ✓ WATER SEWER ISSUES PENDING (See Individual Category)
  - ☐ SEWER REHABILITATION PROGRAM (Update)

Liqui Force is working the village as we speak.

# □ BEAR CREEK SANITARY SEWER AGREEMENT (No Change of Status)

WWS advises that now that we have cleared the sanitary sewer concerns as it relates to the main that crosses the creek at the bridge, they'll begin preparing agreements for transfer of the main to the County. As soon as I get a draft of the agreement, I'll set the matter up for discussion on the terms.

# ☐ KWA (No Change of Status)

The city enacted a pass-along increase beginning after the first of the year for the first phase of the debt retirement for the KWA. Costs for future service are very uncertain and will undoubtedly rise much. Despite that, I believe that we need to look at local increases to support a local capital improvement program for aging infrastructure. This may not amount to much, but we need to start somewhere. If we

simply pass along increase from the other authorities, we will not even be able to keep up with inflationary increases for operating.

On the bright side, those continuing to purchase Detroit water may find rates tripling! This could encourage Oakland County to join the KWA or make rates in Genesee County even more competitive. I have attached an interesting Free Press Article on the matter.

# □ STORM SEWER (No Change of Status)

Mr. Svrcek has been working with the Michigan Department of Environmental Equality on some permitting issues that every city in the urban area of the county is dealing with. We are not thrilled with the expectations. What appears to be the heavy hand of the DEQ may put us out of the business of providing many basic services, or at least radically changing the way we do business. This could result in many new ordinances and expenses regulating a variety of practices including how we store road salt, where we can dump street sweepings, and how residents can discharge a pool. We will likely be addressing this in mid-summer, but we want to take our time due to the wide reaching effect that this could have on the community.

# ✓ PERSONNEL: POLICIES & PROCEDURES (No Change of Status)

I have a couple templates that I am looking at with some of the supervisors. The police department has an extensive handbook that is updated regularly. We expect to adopt a similar (but different) set of policies to cover all other employees.

### ✓ CITY PROPERTY, 4438 MORRISH ROAD & THIRD STREET(Update)

The tentative DDA budget includes some funds for demolition of these structures. Tom and I are looking at prices, unless there is an objection from the council. The city council will need to approve any demolition actions and costs. If and when this is completed, the city can begin planning for potential uses on these properties.

Hazardous material testing has been completed so a proper demolition bid can be created.

# ✓ LABOR CONTRACTS, SHARED SERVICES, BUILDING DEPARTMENT (Update)

We are operating with a reduction of clerical staff. The city has been functioning with four such positions, down substantially compared to prior years. With the temporary leave of the staff position at the public safety building, the inefficiencies of operating two offices with three staff were problematic. The clerical duties of the police have been moved to city hall as indicated in the last report. We will report on how this works out as time goes on.

# ✓ SPRINGBROOK EAST & HERITAGE S.A.D. – VACANT LOTS (Update)

Following are issues pending for the three Associations:

The home owners association in Springbrook East drafted a letter to the city regarding the sale of the 12 lots the city owns. I find their position to be well stated, but I am not

sure what the complete history and intent of lot ownership is. For that reason, I have placed this on the agenda for discussion. For my part, it seems reasonable that the city be made whole and additional lot sale revenues be used to assist the home owners association in some form. This appeared to be the intent back in October of 2013.

There is quite a buzz going on around town concerning these lots. There is strong interest to buy them by interested home owners, investors, and builders. This is exemplified by an additional letter received on the matter by James Realty. Please read this as well. I don't know exactly how the city should dispose of these lots, but it should happen soon.

In other news, I have contacted the legal counsel of Heritage Village to work out a dedication. It is not moving quickly.

#### **✓ MEIJER COMMUNITY DONATION** (Status)

Regarding the Meijer Community Donation, we are still looking at several options for consideration, one of which is a sidewalk segment that would accompany the parking lot tire grant work we are looking to do. The costs for this may be a burden. I will be looking at options with Mr. Svrcek and bouncing those off the council and Meijer.

# ✓ EVIP COMPETITIVE GRANT ASSISTANCE PROGRAM (No Change of Status)

A state senate committee is proposing to do away with EVIP and increase revenue sharing. This would certainly be a step in the right direction. As I indicated in an email this week, the increase will likely generate \$10,000-\$20,000 for the city. However, the MML indicates that our city is short \$220,000 this year due to changes to revenue sharing disbursements, and we have lost about \$1.6 million over the last 12 years. So, forgive me if I am not jumping for joy at this apparent change of direction.

#### ✓ WINCHESTER WOODS LOTS (No Change of Status)

I suggest we delay any sales or negotiations until a land sale policy is adopted. Prior to the last meeting, staff notified the interested parties that a sale will not be forthcoming anytime soon. They do not appear to be in a hurry and will await the council's decision.

I want to take a harder look at the development of this area. Previously, the city considered an assessment that would provide drainage, curbs, gutters, road construction, street lights and sidewalks. The price per lot was absurd. I think the goal should be to make these lots buildable for quality homes. The city could probably achieve this with less intensive ditching and surfacing of the roads, sans the underground drainage system, lights, curbs, and sidewalks. This would drastically reduce the scope of the project.

A sale of lots to an adjacent property owner could compromise the success of any special assessment for improvements and the ability to use these lots for single family homes.

#### ✓ NEWSLETTER (*Update*)

The newsletter has been mailed. The next is scheduled for November or late October.

# ✓ **SEWER RATES** (No Change of Status)

They are going up. I suggest we look at increasing ours to cover our costs and any projected deficit that is apparent. Unless there is such an objection, staff will plan to do so as the anticipated budget progresses.

# ✓ **RENTAL REGISTRATION AND INSPECTIONS** (No Change of Status)

We have begun preparing for a rental registration program. One of the first steps will be to adopt the property maintenance code. Now that this is done, I will be working with Mr. Johnson and the council to begin developing a program that is compatible with our community goals.

# ✓ WINSHALL PAVILION (Update)

The contractor that received the low bid by the insurance carrier was not responsive. We have moved ahead with the next lowest bidder and hope for better results. Costs will still be covered by Meadowbrook above the city's deductible.

# ✓ OTHER COMMUNICATIONS & HAPPENINGS (Update)

Most of the non-business communications are routine and I see no issues. The letter from Mr. Belzer was not unexpected. He informed me a while back that he was looking at different condominium options. It appears he has found another home in the city that is to his liking.

The request under the METRO Act to extend the at&t permit is more routine than one might think. Under City Ordinance Apppendix B, Article 6, Section 5a, I intend to administrative approve this extension (with the required name change to "Swartz Creek"). If there are objections, we can take a closer look, but I do not see any good coming from delay. Back in 2002, when the METRO Act passed, all of the municipalities lost their minds with the broad sweeping rights that were given up without much financial consideration. We slammed tables and shook our fists for quite a while, but ultimately there was not much we could do. It is pretty much required that we approve these within 45 days...or else.

# ✓ BOARDS & COMMISSIONS (See Individual Category)

# □ PLANNING COMMISSION (Update)

The planning commission reviewed site plans for O'Reilly's Auto Parts and General Motors. Recommendations for approval were made in both cases.

# □ DOWNTOWN DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY (No Change of Status)

The DDA met again in April. It appears there will be over \$100,000 of revenues in the DDA budget this year. This amount is unprecedented. In fact, they have not had any tax revenues in about five years. With the new revenues looking more secure, the board amended their budget to include an additional contribution to the public safety parking lot and potential demolitions of houses on city owned property downtown. Details are in the city budget.

# ☐ **ZONING BOARD OF APPEALS** (No Change of Status)

The ZBA is not up to much lately. Their annual meeting was held on March 19, 2014. All officers were reinstated.

# ☐ PARKS AND RECREATION COMMISSION (Update)

A successful cleanup was completed on May 3, 2014 by service groups. There have also been volunteers working to spruce up play equipment at Winshall Park. There are still hopes to renovate the bathrooms at Elms Park with a Recreation Passport Grant. I will work with the commission to this end.

# **NEW BUSINESS / PROJECTED ISSUES & PROJECTS**

#### ✓ MTA PRESENATION (*Presentation*)

Mr. Messer would like to present a status report to the city council regarding the Mass Transportation Authority. This authority has a set of four-year levies that apply to city tax payers, such levies are renewable in stagger, two year terms. The MTA owns and operates a center on Dye Road in the city, including Your Ride services. There are no fixed routes within the city at this time.

#### ✓ HOMETOWN DAYS FESTIVAL (Resolutions)

Included with tonight's program are the permits related to the Hometown Days festival. Also included with the HTD grouping of permits are requests for the a 5k foot race and a street closure by the fire department for a water-ball contest. The entire permit package is available, but at 71 pages, I did not include it here. I have included the cover letter from the chief and their new disaster policy. If you wish to see the applications, insurance documents, or property permission slips I can get those to you printed or via email.

#### ✓ BUDGET HEARING (Resolution)

The council needs to set a public hearing on the budget. This is routine.

#### ✓ MI-DEQ SCRAP TIRE GRANT PROJECT, PARKING LOTS (Resolution)

Bids have been received for all paving work. Note that the alley and streetscape enhancements are to be bid separately since these are funding by CDBG funds. We should know what those costs will be soon. The new estimates are as follows:

Rowe Professional Services has reviewed the bids, and they find that he lowest bid qualifies. They recommend that L & M Landshaping be approved in the amount of \$259,520. Staff concurs. This company has done similar work in the past with good results. They are currently working on the county contract for Miller Road between Linden and Dye.

#### ✓ ASSESSING POLICY (Resolution)

The State of Michigan is auditing the assessing and equalization departments of all municipal governments in the state. This is known as the 14 point review. Among other requirements, they are requesting a policy for review copying of documents. Our assessor feels this is a weak spot in our policy that we need to remedy. Existing Freedom of Information Act polices have not been accepted in other municipalities. We found a similar template that the state recommends for similar situations that we believe will work. The requirements and impact of the instrument are pretty well outlined. We would like approval of this so we can move on.

### ✓ O'Reilly Auto Parts Site Plan (*Resolution*)

The city council is required to approve all site plans in the city. O'Reilly's has petitioned the city to build a new retail store where the old party store was located on the corner of Miller and Elms. Staff and the planning commission have reviewed this plan and recommend approval. Site plan details, the staff review, and the planning commission findings are included in the packet.

### ✓ GENERAL MOTORS SITE PLAN AMENDMENT (Resolution)

General Motors has petitioned the city to amend their site plan that was approved for demolition and site alterations late last calendar year. Staff and the planning commission have reviewed this plan recommend approval. Site plan details, the staff review, and the planning commission findings are included in the packet.

# ✓ FIRE DEPARTMENT: COST RECOVERY & APPARATUS (Discussion)

The fire board is at the end of their bidding process for a new piece of equipment. At this point, the council will be asked to support such a purchase. The official request is for \$170,000. Based upon the tentative budget, the city could use the balance of the fire equipment fund, as well as additional installments of about \$20,000 annually for 5 years to pay off this purchase. As was discussed on April 28<sup>th</sup>, there is a need to plan for ongoing equipment purchases, thereby requiring the city to contribute something each year in the form of a depreciation expense, equipment rental, or an equipment fund allocation.

The council should make a decision on this purchase and ongoing funding sometime in the month of May. If there are no objections, we will get final purchasing information from the fire department and plan to structure a purchase and payment resolution for inclusion on the meeting agenda of May 27, 2014.

#### ✓ AT&T AMENDED TERMS (Discussion)

AT&T is really pushing for a negotiation concerning the lease space on the cell tower on Elms Road, north of the creek. This is the same topic that was noted in the last city manager report. At that time, they were pursuing a large rent reduction, a decrease in

the inflationary escalator during renewal times, and some adjustments to the lease language to ensure use rights. I have included the term sheet.

I informed them that the city was not inclined to renegotiate this contract, and they responded with new terms. They concede that a rent reduction is not merited, but they still are requesting consideration of the other terms. They believe the use terms and the escalator change are essential to keeping this site active in their portfolio.

As I noted previously, this is a question of balancing risk and reward. At any time, cellular providers could consolidate or discover new technology that makes these leases obsolete or much less desirable. It is also possible to have lease terms that make some arrangements marginal given alternatives in the market place.

I think it would be prudent of the city council to consider the use terms. This ensures some site flexibility and should keep us off any black list. The rent is a non-issue, but the escalator is still in question. Currently, we are looking at an annualized escalator of about 3.72% (20% every 5 years). They are proposing 1.92% (10% every 5 years. The national average for the last one hundred years or so is about 3.22%. The current rate is a bit high and the proposed rate is low. Given the value of real estate and the state of the local economy, their request is not unreasonable. It is probably something we can manage.

If the council is interested, I can get a revised term sheet. If not, I will relay the information and see if/how they respond. Either way, I still have issues with the provisions on taxes, sublease rights, and removal/restoration. We can discuss this at the meeting in more detail. In summary, we can probably work with them to provide some different terms, but I would need the ability to negotiate these in more detail.

#### ✓ BS&A SOFTWARE SERVICE CHARGES (Resolutions)

The city uses BS&A software as a platform for nearly all of the city's financial and data tracking needs. This integrated software package tracks all properties and cases across all services, including assessing, utility billing, building, and permits. It also is used to coordinate and track all of the city's finances, including modules for general ledger, accounts payable, cash receipts, payroll, and tax.

There is an annual fee associated with ongoing updates, service, and support. This has typically been under the \$5,000 charge that requires city council approval, but due to added modules and inflation that is no longer the case.

Staff is very pleased with this software package, and we definitely rely on regular updates and support. We request the council approve the annual fee for these services.

# ✓ FISCAL YEAR 2014 AMENDMENTS (Resolutions)

The city council has requested more details on end-of-year adjustments for past budgets. I believe Juanita and Deanna will be able to deliver on those expectations this year. As in the past, there are some adjustments needed to accurately reflect the realities of revenue collection and appropriations in the fiscal year, including tax appeal losses, fees collected and similar revenues. There are also some adjustments on the expense side.

To keep things simple, we are planning on visiting a couple funds each meeting between now and the end of the fiscal year. This will give the council a chance to look at all of the proposed changes and ask questions. At this meeting, we have proposed adjustments to the Motor Pool, Local Street Fund and Downtown Development Authority Funds. The changes are highlighted.

# ✓ SPRINGBROOK EAST LOTS (*Discussion*)

As noted in the city manager's report, there is a general expectation that the city sell these lots. There is also an expectation within the Springbrook East homeowners association to 'make them whole.' If it were up to me alone, I would prepare and request for proposals to sell the lots to a single buyer with conditions to develop them in conformance with site plan expectations and architectural continuity. There is certainly an indication that any sale funds received by the city in excess of the city's cost to acquire and handle the lots be a benefit to the HOA. Thoughts?

### Council Questions, Inquiries, Requests and Comments

- □ Additional Lighting, Miller Fairchild Intersection. We are back trying to get a review by Consumers Energy.
- Parkridge Parkway "No Parking Signs". They are missing in the back phase near Hickory Lane. We are working to replace them, but it will likely be when the ground thaws.

No person shall be a solicitor and/or solicit in the City of Swartz Creek without first obtaining a license therefor. An application for a license shall be made to the City Clerk. In the event that the application is made by an organization, group, association, partnership, corporation, trust, business entity or any combination of the above, an application must be made for each agent or employee who will be engaging in the act of soliciting.

#### Sec. 12-3. Exceptions to license.

The following activities are exempt from this chapter:

- (1) Solicitations made to a congregation or group in attendance at one location and made by the person or organization inviting the individuals composing the congregation or group;
- (2) Solicitations made over the radio, television or telephone:

- (3) Any communication by an organization soliciting contributions solely from persons who are members of the organization at the time of the solicitation;
- (4) Any solicitation pursuant to a political candidacy or ballot issue qualified pursuant to "The Michigan Election Law" or "The School Code of 1976" as they are amended from time to time;
- (5) Any peddler traveling on an established route at the request, express or implied, of their customers;
- (6) Salespersons calling on clients, customers or business establishments with whom they have established business relationships at the time of the solicitation;
- (7) The distribution of handbills or leaflets where the individual distributing them does not seek or accept payments, orders or contributions;
- (8) A person handling vegetables, fruits or perishable farm products at any established city farmers' market;
- (9) A person who is not a business or merchant, but who engages in a garage sale whereby they are selling their own items from their household.

#### Sec. 12-4. License Application.

A license application filed hereunder shall furnish the following information:

- (1) Name and description of the applicant.
- (2) Permanent home address and full local address of the applicant.
- (3) A brief description of the nature of the solicitation contemplated.
- (4) If the applicant is an employee, the name and address of the employer, together with the credentials establishing the exact employer/employee relationship.
- (5) The length of time the applicant intends to solicit.
- (6) The place where the wares, merchandise, services, items of personal property or real property are located, manufactured or produced and the proposed method of delivery.
- (7) One photograph of the applicant, it being from the applicant's driver's license or identification card.
- (8) The applicant's social security number.
- (9) A statement as to whether or not the applicant has been convicted of any felony, misdemeanor or violation of any municipal ordinance, the nature of the offense and the punishment or penalty assessed therefor. This statement shall be accompanied by a release allowing the City, including the City police department to conduct a criminal background check.

#### Sec. 12-5. Administrative fee and/or license fee.

An applicant shall pay a reasonable administrative processing fee and/or license fee set by resolution of the City Council when submitting his or her license application.

#### Sec. 12-6. Issuance, possession, and presentation of license.

Upon approval of the license application, the City Clerk shall issue a license and license identification card including the name, address, and photo of the licensed person. The licensed person shall visibly display on their person at all times the license identification card when conducting activities permitted by the license.

#### Sec. 12-7. License revocation.

The City may suspend or revoke a license for violation of this article after reasonable notice and opportunity to be heard. The City may suspend on an emergency basis, without hearing, any license issued to the solicitor when it specifies in the notice of emergency suspension, the reasons and grounds indicating the violation of this article which constitutes the emergency. The notice shall set forth that within 48 hours, at a designated time and place, a hearing shall be held on whether the license shall be permanently suspended or revoked.

#### Sec. 12-8. Prohibited activities.

The following acts or activities shall be prohibited:

- (1) Prohibited areas. No solicitor shall obstruct any street, alley, sidewalk or driveway.
- (2) Litter. No solicitor shall litter any street, alley, sidewalk, driveway, or private property in the City.
- (3) Curb service prohibited. No solicitor shall operate or maintain any stand, vehicle, store or place of solicitation on or near any highway. No solicitor shall be permitted to use the streets, alleys, lanes or public places of the City for soliciting or to use any stands, stores or other places of transaction in any manner that requires the person wishing to participate in a transaction, when engaged in the transaction, to stand within the limits of the streets, highways, alleys or public places of the City.
- (4) Prohibition of entry upon private property expressly requesting no solicitation. No solicitor shall enter upon and/or call upon a place of residence or business within the City of Swartz Creek after having been expressly notified by the occupant of the place of residence or business that no solicitation is desired, or if the place of residence or business visibly displays on its property and/or premises a sign indicating "no soliciting", "no solicitation" and/or other language specifically conveying the message that no soliciting is desired.
- (5) Prohibition of creation of nuisance. No solicitor shall threaten or annoy any resident of the City in the course of their solicitation or in any way engage in any conduct which is or would tend to create a nuisance.

#### Sec. 12-9. Hours of operation.

Soliciting may take place within the City between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 8:00 p.m. or sunset, whichever occurs earlier.

#### Sec. 12-10. Penalty.

Any person or persons violating any of the provisions of this article shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and upon conviction thereof, shall be punished by a fine of not more than \$500.00 plus costs of prosecution or by imprisonment for not more than 90 days or by both fine and costs and imprisonment in the discretion of the court.

#### Section 3. Effective date.

This Ordinance shall become effective thirty (30) days after publication.

## **Swartz Creek Hometown Days**

## **Emergency Operations Plan**

This plan is designed to address the major types of emergency incidents which may impact the Swartz Creek Hometown Days festival. It provides primary operating guidelines which will meet the needs of the majority of occurences which may be encountered. It does not replace the need to evaluate each situation and make the proper value judgements as to how to proceed to mitigate injury and/or damage and bring an incident to a successful conclusion.

## ' Festival Grounds

The Swartz Creek Hometown Days grounds are located at 5086 S. Morrish Rd, south of Miller Rd. on the west side. The grounds are closed to civilian motor vehicles and only allow designated marked vehicles and/or vendor, emergency vehicles and Arnold Amusement employees. There is 1 entrance and 1 exit on and off the grounds.

Important locations for emergency response personnel:

• The Festival Office/Information Center - is located on the north side of the grounds midway between the front and back. This office serves as the administrative hub for the Festival Board. Festival Board staff will be present at this location and throughout the grounds for all types of situations. This office has radio/cell phone communication

capabilities and the means to operate the sound system throughout the festival grounds. This office also serves as the information center. Lost and found individuals will be handled at the information center.

- First aid There will be an ambulance posted at the front of the grounds on the north side of the entrance road. The ambulance will be staffed by 2 personnel from the Swartz Ambulance Company.
- The Swartz Creek Police/Fire Department is located at 8100 B Civic Dr. located across from the Chase Bank on Fortino Dr. which is north off of Miller Rd. west of Morrish Rd.

#### Lost and Missing Persons:

All lost/missing persons will be reported to the Information Center or to any Festival Grounds Staff member. The person/persons reporting the lost or missing will be escorted to the Festival Office/Information Center. The Festival Office staff will take the information regarding the incident, including a complete description and where the individual was last seen. They will then evaluate the steps needed to address the situation.

#### Options available include:

- 1. Announcing lost/missing person over public address system for an older child or adult to meet their party at the Festival Office/Information Center.
- 2. Announcing over the public address system for patrons to be aware that an individual is lost/missing and needs to be directed/escorted to the Festival Office/Information Center.
- 3. Advise all Festival Staff and volunteers to be on the lookout for the individual and take them to the Festival Office/Information Center if located.
- 4. In the event the lost/missing individual is a young child, mentally handicapped, or has special needs, call 911 and have police meet Festival Staff at the Festival Office/Information Center to discuss the missing person with the person making the report to determine further steps that may need to be taken.
- 5. The Festival Staff will advise the person making the report to remain at the Festival Office/Information Center with them in the event that more information is needed and to have a location for the individual being sought can be brought when they are found.
- 6. Once the lost/missing individual has been located and returned to the Festival Office/Information Center and positively identified by the reporting individual, the staff member will advise all searching parties to cancel their search. The search will only cease when it is **confirmed** the individual has been located.

## Criminal Activity/Traffic Control:

All criminal activity will be dealt with by the Swartz Creek Police Department via 911. The individual making the report will contact 911 and provide the following information, exact location, name of complainant, telephone number, and description of the activity taking place, along with descriptions of individuals involved. If the complainant reports such activity to a Festival Grounds Staff member, the Staff member will take the same steps mentioned above and remain with the complainant until Police arrive. Traffic Control on the Festival Grounds will be handled by the Mundy Township Volunteer Peace officers and Festival Grounds Staff members. In the event that they are unable to handle any situation involving traffic, the Swartz Creek Police Department will be contacted via 911 for assistance and the Festival Grounds ERT team leader will be advised

## Fire:

All fires, regardless of size or items involved, are to be turned over to the Swartz Creek Area Fire Department via 911. Local attempts to extinguish should not be attempted without proper apparatus i.e. fire extinguisher etc. unless properly trained. Persons reporting fires should advise the exact location, what is burning, the extent of the fire, and if anyone is injured. Upon receipt of a fire report, Festival Staff team leader will be notified of the incident.

#### **Medical Emergencies:**

Minor Medical Incidents such as minor cuts, abrasions, sunburn, etc. will be handled by the Swartz Ambulance Crew located on the Festival grounds near the north east entrance. Any individuals seeking medical assistance for non-serious injuries or illness should be directed to the ambulance crew or escorted if applicable where they can be evaluated and treated.

Major Medical Incidents which involve serious and/or life threatening illnesses and injuries are to be immediately reported to 911 and the Festival Grounds ERT team leader. The individual making the report will provide the exact location and nature of the problem. The reporting individual should maintain contact with the patient until emergency services arrive.

Mass Casualty Incidents where a number of patients are present may occur. This may be the result of a ride malfunction, structural collapse, multi-vehicle collision, inclement weather, fire, etc. Mass casualty incidents will be defined as any incident with 5 or more patients. The proper trained emergency responders will be notified via 911. The exact location of the incident will be given, and the nature of the incident. All Festival Committee Staff members will be notified via 2 way radio/cell phone. Based on the type of event and the number of casualties, emergency responder staff members along with Festival staff members will convene in the Festival Office/Information Center to coordinate actions and bring the event to a positive and timely conclusion. The Festival Directors of different areas on the festival grounds will direct members to their respective areas to respond to the incident while maintaining some coverage for the remainder of the festival. The incident will be handled using the command structure of the emergency responders i.e. Police, Fire, EMS. A team effort will be needed for crowd control for access and egress to and from and around the scene of the incident. Volunteer peace officers/festival volunteers, and amusement employees will be useful for any types of these incidents.

## **Bomb Threats:**

Any bomb threat will be reported to 911. The ERT team leader will also be notified via 2 way radio/cell phone. The appropriate emergency responders will respond for the incident. All ERT team members will refrain from using the term "Bomb Threat" or "Explosive", and any similar descriptive terms will not be used on the radios or public announcement system which may be overheard by the public with the intent not to alarm the festival patrons. There should be a "code word" used to describe this type of incident that all Festival Staff/Committee members will be made aware of.

#### Adverse Weather:

Adverse weather will include heavy rain, lightning, high winds, thunderstorms, and tornadoes. Protection from adverse weather should include these options: Evacuation and shelters in place. The presence of a large number of people in a relatively small area with limited parking near the festival grounds makes evacuation an option, but only with well advanced warning, but typical summer thunderstorm buildups do not provide sufficient warning to enable patrons to evacuate in a timely manner. Festival Staff/Committee Members/Arnold Amusement Staff Management will monitor the weather using all available resources which include internet sites such as NOAA, Wunderground, Weatherbug, television stations, etc. In the event there is the possibility of adverse weather, such as the building of thunderstorms or the approach of a line of weather, the Festival Committee/ERT will advise the Festival Chairman/2<sup>nd</sup> Chair to respond to the Festival Office/Information Center along with Arnold Amusement Management to review the weather situation and establish an alternative plan of action. Police, Fire, EMS, and Peace officer volunteers may also be involved to assist. Festival patrons will be notified of such weather using the public announcement system.

Rain, unless unusually heavy, will not adversely affect festival operations. However, steady rain over an extended period of time will discourage attendance and cause patrons to leave the grounds. During periods of heavy rain, patrons will seek shelter in commercial/exhibit tents and or buildings. This may cause a problem such as slip and fall hazards due to slick ground surfaces. Use medical protocol instructions if a medical arises due to a slip and fall during the rain.

Lightning can pose a significant threat to patrons. Lightning will also be closely monitored using the resources mentioned above and will also be monitored by Festival Staff/Committee Members/Arnold Amusement Staff. In the event that lightning is detected 6 miles out or less, the Festival Chairman/2<sup>nd</sup> Chair/Arnold Amusement Management willing convene in the Festival Office/Information Center to discuss closing all high rides and to have patrons seek shelter. Depending on the storm intensity, all rides may have to be shut down until the storm passes and the weather is no longer a threat. Festival patrons will be notified of such weather using the public announcement system.

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**High Straight Line Winds** can pose hazards to festival patrons due to flying debris, collapse of tents, etc. Patrons will be advised to take shelter but refrain from entering any tent on the ground due to the collapse hazard. The announcement will be made using the public announcement system.

**Hail,** except in its smallest sizes, can be harmful to humans and animals, and can cause considerable damage to tents, vehicles, rides, etc. When hail is imminent or occurs, festival patrons will be advised to seek shelter in permanent structures and not in tents or other temporary enclosures.

Tornadoes pose the most serious weather hazard. If a tornado is imminent, there are no good alternatives for Festival Committee members or patrons. For this reason, the Festival Staff and all emergency service personnel must be especially aware of the potential for tornadoes and take the appropriate measures, including closing the festival if there is a strong probability for tornadoes. When a tornado watch is issued for Genesee County or the surrounding counties, the Festival Staff/Committee Members/Arnold Amusement Staff will meet in the Festival Office/Information Center to evaluate weather conditions and alternatives. Meetings with ALL Festival Personnel should convene every 30 to 45 min throughout the period the tornado watch is in effect. If a tornado warning is issued for Genesee County or surrounding Counties, a public announcement will be made via the public announcement system to advise festival patrons, staff members, volunteers, vendors, carnival employees, etc. to seek shelter in low areas i.e., creeks, ditches, basements if available. There will also be shelter available at the Swartz Creek Middle School and the local DPW. Any persons seeking shelter in creeks or ditches should lie down and cover their heads with their hands and arms.

#### Festival Grounds Public Announcement System

The Swartz Creek Hometown Days Festival contains a public announcement system located in the center of the grounds. Messages concerning events, festival activities, weather emergencies, and other public service announcements are routinely broadcast over the system.

#### CITY OF SWARTZ CREEK POLICY FOR

#### PUBLIC INSPECTION AND COPYING OF PUBLIC RECORDS

#### **PURPOSE AND INTENT**

The City of Swartz Creek intends to be compliant with the Freedom of Information Act and has a FOIA policy on file. It is also the intent of the city to encourage the dissemination of information and transparency of government under less formal and cumbersome conditions. With the understanding that many routine records, maps, plans, and other documents are requested by the public on a regular basis, including assessing records, utility records, and building records, the city hereby adopts a policy to accommodate such requests.

- 1. Requests for public inspection and copying of public records may be made verbally and/or in writing, including emails to a specific, active email address.
- 2. Said requests may be directed to the city clerk or other authorized individual responsible for said public record.
- 3. Any requests made pursuant to the Michigan Freedom of Information Act, shall be made to the FOIA officer of the city and be subject to the city policy and statutory requirements of the FOIA.

Dear Chairman and Commissioners:

I have reviewed the above site plan review request submitted Mo Anderson Engineering, on behalf of O'Reilly Auto Parts, to develop a retail sales store on the corner of Miller and Elms Roads. The property is zoned GBD (General Business District) with a PUD overlay, which permits retail sales as of right. The plan includes a 7,453 square foot building, underground utilities, parking, landscaping, lighting, and related features.

This development is part of a larger Planned Unit Development that was conceptualized for the Family Farm and Home development, and subsequently amended during the Taco Bell development. The PUD includes a master sign plan, shared drainage, integrated internal traffic circulation plans, and related features. No PUD amendment is requested at this time.

The site plan for this project is substantially complete for review and does not require any special land uses or variances. The site plan is composed of two separate submissions. The large print editions are dated 3/18/2014. However, there are revisions dated 4/3/2014 that were submitted electronically, and these are included in your packet on 8.5x11 sheets. These pages replaced/added to sheets C1, C2, L1, & SP1 of the original submission to clarify details on sidewalks, lighting, and similar features.

#### 1. GBD Standards.

Finding: In compliance

The use meets the intent of the master plan, PUD in effect, and GBD zoning. The proposal also appears to meet layout intent of the ordinance. No setback or other bulk, height, or density conflicts are noted.

#### 2. Site Plan and Structures-Generally.

Finding: In compliance subject to reviews by engineering, safety, and traffic consultants

The elevations meet the ordinance design guidelines. The location of mechanical equipment (HVAC) is unknown. This should be confirmed to be screen on the roof or otherwise screened in accordance with the ordinance. A bike rack is included near the public entrances.

Drainage, underground utilities, traffic circulation, and public safety review are still pending. Approval can be made subject to approval of such features by the city's engineer.

#### 3. Landscaping and screening.

Finding: Not in compliance; recommendations

Staff reviewed the landscape plan in accordance with the requirements in Section 28.02. Since the development is part of a PUD, additional landscaping beyond that required by the zoning ordinance is suggested where appropriate.

For the parking lot, there should be 6 trees, two of which are to be within the confines of the lot. This requirement appears to be met. Based upon linear feet of road frontage, there should be an additional 10 trees (one for every 40'). The plans show exactly that.

Additional plantings in the form of dwarf trees and shrubs are proposed. Additional conifer trees in the available open space would be welcome. Overall, there is a lot of open area and parking. Some additional tree plantings would be desirable, perhaps in lieu of some of the shrubs. The ordinance also calls for landscaping adjacent to the building, in this case that would be along the east side, which is highly visible. Additional alberta spruces would suffice.

The applicant is advised to locate the proposed canopy tree further from the dumpster, assuming overhead collection.

The dumpster is screened with split face block to match the building.

#### 4. Parking and Loading.

#### Finding: Subject to commission findings; recommended for approval

There should be a space for every 150 sq. ft. of leasable area. With 43 spaces, this pubs leasable area at about 6,450 square feet (there is 7,453 net square feet proposed). Note that parking can reflect a lower number (which the city prefers) based

upon the demonstrated needs of the applicant. The widths are fine, however, the city's preference is to limit as much impervious surface and asphalt as possible. 24' aisles are recommended instead of 30', and shorter stalls are acceptable as well (18').

The maintenance and location of shrubs should be considered against the backdrop of our recent Michigan winters, which require the deposit of much snow. Hardy, low maintenance shrubs should be considered and spaced so as not to be compromised by snow removal. Snow stacking areas have been shown to address this problem. An additional traffic island would be welcome at the south end of the structure.

"Parking lot deferment: Where the property owner can demonstrate or the planning commission finds that the required amount of parking is excessive, the planning commission may approve a smaller parking area, provided that the area of sufficient size to meet the parking space requirements of this article is retained as open space, and the owner agrees to construct the additional parking at the direction of the planning commission based on observed usage within six months of being informed of such request in writing by the planning commission."

An adequate loading and unloading area is provided.

#### 5. Lighting.

#### Finding: In compliance subject to confirmation of building fixtures

A photometric plan is included, as well as spec sheets on lighting type. Fixtures, poles, and intensity meet the ordinance. Fixtures are 100% horizontal cut-off to eliminate glare. A specification on the decorative accent lighting is not provided. Staff will affirm that these are anti-glare fixtures upon submission of a building permit.

#### 6. Signs.

#### Finding: No findings; subject to administrative approvals

The site signs appear to conform to the existing signs permitted under the planned unit development plan. Building signs must conform to ordinance and can be approved any time with a sign permit. Details on area of the wall signs were not provided so I did not guess at conformity. The sign ordinance controls for area and number. Area for wall signs is 1.2 square feet for every lineal foot of frontage, up to 200 square feet. The existing pole sign for the vacant store must be removed.

#### 7. Vehicular and Pedestrian Circulation.

#### Finding: In compliance

Ingress, egress, and service drive connections look adequate. The walk connecting to Elms Road and the walks along the north and west sides of the building look good and should stay. They applicant as added sidewalk construction along the entirety of the Miller and Elms Road frontages. An easement exists to ensure site connectivity to the property to the east.

#### 8. Natural Features

#### Finding: In compliance

No significant natural features have been identified.

#### **Summary and Recommendation**

This submission objectively meets the requirements of the ordinance with only a couple exceptions. The commission is recommended to make findings to allow a reduced number of spaces based upon petitioner needs, and there is a minor need for some additional landscaping. As a planned unit development, the commission is still encouraged to scrutinize the plan to ensure it meets the intent of the master plan and zoning ordinance. Subject to that review, I recommend approval subject to compliance with the following provisions:

- 1. Approval of plans by the city's engineer
- 2. Additional plantings to screen the east elevation, including no less than six (60) alberta spruce or similar screening trees.





Dear Chairman and Commissioners:

City staff has reviewed the site plan amendment request submitted by SSOE on behalf of General Motors Corporation, to apply an alternate façade material to the south elevation. This is a change to the original submission to demolish the office structure and parking lot on the south side of the Service Parts Operations facility. The original plan included a new parking area, building residing, and landscaping. All other site elements approved in December of 2013 remain the same. The property is zoned I-2.

The review is limited exclusively to the change in the façade as proposed.

#### Site Plan and Structures-Generally.

#### Finding: In compliance

Pre-cast concrete is does not satisfy the durable material requirement of the ordinance in my opinion. However, this is not a commercial structure, nor is it in a commercial district. Lastly, the structure is existing, non-conforming and this material is superior to the existing metal panels that are used on all other elevations. As such, I believe the planning commission has the ability to use their discretion on this issue.

For industrial property, this could probably be an administrative change order. However, the scale of this building is massive, and the site is extremely visible. I want to be sure the planning commission has a say in this alteration. This finish will definitely not appear to be brick, but it is probably as close as can be expected for a warehouse. I have attached photos that best represent what I believe the finished product will look like. I think the color and texture will match what you see in the first image, and the

seams will appears as they do in the second image. I believe this will work in the I-2 district given the quality of the material that is being removed and replaced.





We discussed in our meeting on April 29, 2014, the rescinding of Resolution No. 131014 that dealt with the disposition of city owned vacant lots in Springbrook East. I am writing this letter to inform you and the city council of the wishes of the residents of Springbrook East Condominium Association. However these properties are sold we feel that the residents that were assessed to cover road building costs "be made whole".

Although we, as a group, have had our problems with Kal Nemer/Woodside Builders we can see where it may be advantageous to have Woodside build on the remaining lots to ensure archetectual continuity of the development. However, we feel that there are several competent contractors in the area that would be eager to bid on a project of this scope. If an auction is held to dispose of these lots, it seems only to be good business sense to create some healthy competition and enhance the amount of the revenue received from the sale.

We also realize that the city has dollars invested in the lots that they would like to recover from the sale. It is our wish that these lots be sold at a price that (no matter the high auction bid) covers the assessments paid by the Springbrook East residents and dollars that the city feel is needs to recover.

The average cost of a lot in Springbrook East, when purchased by a home buyer, was more that \$30,000. These lots have value. Based upon the number of inquires made to our board members and residents and, in fact to the city manager, finding interested investors should not be a problem.

The city council passed Resolution No. 131014 because they had empathy for the Springbrook East residents. We are confident that they will continue forward with the same convictions as this matter is settled.



#### APRIL FANG REPORT

On 4-8-14, FANG officers conducted surveillance on a suspected drug house in the city of Flint. FANG offices followed the suspects away from the residence, observed traffic violations and requested a MSP Post 35 car stop the vehicle. The suspect vehicle did not stop and a pursuit was initiated. The Troopers performed a precision immobilization technique bringing the pursuit to a safe conclusion and both occupants were taken into custody. Officers seized 7 grams cocaine, 2 bags of marijuana and initiated forfeiture proceedings on \$6140.00. Both suspects were lodged at the Flint City Jail.

On 4-8-14, a FANG officer assisted the 3<sup>rd</sup> District Tobacco Tax team by acting in an undercover capacity/witness, while a confidential informant attempted to use a bridge card for unauthorized uses at businesses in the greater Flint area.

On 4-8-14, FANG officers assisted the ATF with the arrest of a male with an outstanding Federal Warrant in the City of Flint. During the arrest, approximately 9 grams of "crack" cocaine were seized from the male. Forfeiture was initiated on \$3129.00 found in the male's possession. The investigation is still on going.

On 4-9-14, FANG officers conducted a controlled purchase of "crack" cocaine using a Confidential Informant. The CI was sent into a house in the City of Flint and made a purchase of .1 grams of "crack" cocaine from a male inside. The investigation is still on going.

On 4-9-14, FANG officers responded to assist Flint Township Police at a possible Methamphetamine lab. FANG officers confirmed that it was in fact a used one pot meth lab. The Meth team responded and did the hazardous clean-up of the lab. The investigation is still on going.

On 4-10-14, FANG officers observed a male walking on the east side of Flint with an outstanding Felony Warrant. The male and a few other males entered a nearby convenient store. Officers entered the store and arrested the male. He was in possession of both heroin and "crack" cocaine. One of the other males with him also had several outstanding warrants. The second male was also found to be in possession of "crack" cocaine packaged to sell. Both males were lodged in the Flint City lock up.

On 4-17-14, FANG officers conducted a search warrant in the City of Flint. Officers located a shotgun in the home. The suspect was a convicted felon. He was lodged in the Flint City lock up for Felon in Possession of a Firearm.

On 4-23-14, FANG officers executed a search warrant in the City of Flint after conducting confidential informant buys from the residence. Officer's seized 75 grams of crack cocaine, 25 grams of powder cocaine, 1 pound of marijuana, 3 handguns, 1 long gun and \$3,300.00 dollars. K9-35, Tpr. Szukhent and "Palin", assisted and were instrumental in locating the 25 grams of powder cocaine stuffed inside a shoe inside the residence. Through further investigation officers identified the suspect maintained a safety deposit box at a bank in Flint. Officers obtained a search warrant finding an additional \$15,000.00 in the safety deposit box. The suspect is a convicted felon, federal charges are being sought.

On 4-23-14, while conducting surveillance prior to a search warrant on an unrelated case, FANG officers observed several subjects posturing as if they were going to fight. One subject was observed adjusting and holding his waist band as if he was armed. The disturbance had been called in by citizens. As marked vehicles arrived on scene, FANG officers observed the aforementioned subject that had been

holding his waistband pull a gun out and throw it in tall grass. FANG officers converged arresting the subject after a brief foot pursuit. The suspect was lodged at the Flint City Jail.

On 4-24-14, FANG officers received information from an informant that a subject we had been looking for on a felony drug warrant was sitting in a vehicle on the north side of Flint. Officers located the vehicle, arresting the subject without incident.

On 4-29-14, FANG officers conducted a confidential informant controlled purchase of heroin from a suspect in the city of Flint. The investigation is on-going.

On 4-29-14, FANG officers conducted a confidential informant controlled purchase of heroin from a suspect in the city of Flint. The investigation is on-going.

On 4-29-14, FANG officers conducted a confidential informant controlled purchase of crack cocaine from a suspect in Mt. Morris Twp. The investigation is on-going.

On 4-29-14, FANG officers conducted a confidential informant controlled purchase of crack cocaine from a suspect in the city of Flint. Officers conducted surveillance after the deal. The investigation is ongoing.

On 4-29-14, FANG officers conducted a controlled purchase of cocaine using a Confidential Informant. The CI was sent into a house in the City of Flint and made a purchase of cocaine from a male inside. Intelligence was gathered on the suspect inside. The investigation is still on going.

On 4-30-14, FANG officers conducted surveillance at a suspected heroin house in the city of Flint. Officers followed a subject away from the house, making contact with the subject a short distance away. The subject was found in possession of heroin. The subject was lodged at the Flint City Jail.

On 4-30-14, FANG officers conducted a confidential informant controlled purchase of heroin from a suspect in the city of Flint. The investigation is on-going.

On 4-30-14, FANG officers conducted a confidential informant buy/bust of cocaine from a subject in the driveway of a residence in the city of Flint. Officers seized approximately 6 grams of crack cocaine. A consent search of the suspect's residence yielded a .22 caliber rifle. The suspect is a convicted felon. The investigation is on-going.
