A Message from Mayor Nate Henry!

When you drive through a neighborhood that's decorated for the season, it just feels good. Whether it's pumpkins and ghosts in October or lights and wreaths in December, those touches bring life and energy to our streets. They show pride in our homes, pride in our City, and a sense of community that's hard to put into words but easy to feel.

You don't need to have the biggest or brightest display to make a difference. Sometimes it's the small things—a single pumpkin, a strand of lights, or a simple wreath—that make a neighborhood feel warm and welcoming. Those little efforts, when added up across the city, create that "small town" feeling we all value here in Swartz Creek.



It's also something that tends to catch on. One person decorates, then the neighbor across the street does the same, and before long, an entire block looks festive. That kind of friendly momentum is what community pride looks like in action. It brings people together, and it reminds us that the simple things—like putting up a few decorations—can have a big impact on how our City feels.

So as the holidays approach, I hope you'll join in—no matter how big or small your display might be. Each home adds something special to the look and feel of our City. Together, we can keep Swartz Creek bright, welcoming, and full of that hometown spirit we're all proud to share.

Dort Federal Pergola at Holland Square Crowdfunding Campaign


Our Downtown is looking to get a boost in 2026, but the community needs support! The Downtown Development Authority is leading an effort to construct a multi-purpose pergola structure at Holland Square that will take events to a higher level by providing a new shelter with sound, lighting, street furnishings, and electricity. The goal will be to improve and add events downtown for our community families.

The project has committed funding from the State of Michigan, Dort Financial Credit Union, and the DDA. We are also working with the MEDC to get a dollar for dollar match on all donations received this winter from the community. Winter Reminders
