Enjoy Your City Parks in 2023!

Swartz Creek has a number of great recreational amenities to enjoy. We encourage folks to check out community events at the Pajtas Amphitheater, Veterans' Memorial, and Holland Square Downtown. There is a great lineup of summer concerts, family movie nights, and other events.

In addition, the community offers pavilions for use during the summer months. Pavilions are available on a first come, first served basis during the week. Exclusive, holiday, Friday, & weekend reservations are available for a fee. Swartz Creek city residents benefit from a resident-only sign-up window that extends

through the month of February. Note that the city will be enforcing new use guidelines, including smaller capacities and forfeitable deposits, for the coming year. This is to keep the parks clean.

Check out the city website or call the office for more information. We hope to add electricity to the Abrams Park pavilions to make them more functional for your event!

Please take time to explore the dog park, new disc golf course (Otterburn Park), sledding, ice skating (weather permitting), tennis, basketball, playgrounds, trails, and open space! We hope to see you there. Have fun, and help us out by keeping the parks clean and safe!

Winter Reminders

- ⇒ There is **no parking on any city street from 2am-6am**. Please be mindful to only park on city streets where it is not prohibited. Keeping vehicles off the street permits winter maintenance. Violations will be issued to vehicles parking illegally.
- ⇒ Property owners are responsible for clearing their sidewalks after snow and ice events! Folks leaving town for the winter should make arrangements to have this done. Failure to do so can result in the clearing of the walkway by a contractor at the owners expense, and/or fines! Please keep the walks clear!

Don't Let Utility Bills Drain You...

When components are made available our community will be moving to real time, wireless reading. Water meter transponders are currently wireless, but a mobile reader is required to collect reads. New technology will enable in-place tower antennae to collect and transmit reads every five minutes. This will give users peace of mind by providing high usage alerts, leak detection, and instant reads for transfers.

In related news, the city can email you your utility bill. To sign up, send an email from the preferred account to Jody jkey@cityofswartzcreek.org stating that wish to be added to the list, and she will send a sign up form.

For payment, you will find that the city offers payment via the web portal by credit card and e-check, as well as all conventional means in person. Use the drop box anytime for payment! Please be mindful of the due date to avoid penalties! Payments by card can result in a 3% fee, but that is still below the 4% penalty.

Swartz Creek Historical Society and Welcome New Council Members
